#### AIRPORT-CONTRACT FOR GRADING

H is Worship the Mayor,

Sir:

I beg to report that the contractors for grading at the Airport have not been making the necessary progress during the past three weeks to insure the completion of the work within the contract period, viz, October 1st 1930.

At the beginning of the work the sewer on Chebucto Road and the drainage were done in good time, but subsequently the grading fell behind hand. On July 10th I wrote the contractors that the progress being made was not satisfactory and instructed them to immediately employ such additional labour, transportation and machinery as might be required to expedite the work. Two steam shovels, two tractors and graders were added to the equipment, but owing to various causes the work has dropped One cause of the delay can be behind schedule, attributed to the unforeseen difficulty encountered in removing the material in the swamp, which has proved to be much more difficult to excavate with a steam shovel than was anticipated; another cause is the lack of systematic and efficient management on the part of the contractor. There was delay in securing the necessary equipment and when it was obtained it was not used to the best advantage.

Another letter was sent on Saturday, the 2nd instant, notifying them that in view of the fact that there were only fifty working days left and that with the present rate of progress the work could not be completed in time, I proposed to report the delay to the Committee on Works at their next meeting, for such action as it might see fit to take.

I refused to issue the monthly progress certificate but after consultation with His Worship the Mayor a sufficient sum was advanced to take care of the contractor's pay roll then due.

The terms and conditions of the contract will be discussed at the meeting of the Committee.
