I beg to report that the condition of the plaster at the Infectious Disease Hospital is such that the original estimate of \$\pi_3,300 \text{ will not be sufficient.} The estimate, as far as can now be determined, will be exceeded by \$\pi_2,000.

Practically the entire Hospital has to be re-plastered. Unless the work is carried to completion it will be impossible to use any part of the Hospital not replastered, otherwise the risk of patients being injured, due to falling plaster, especially from the ceilings, would be too reat.

The City Health Board, therefore, recommends that the work now well underway be continued so that the entire hospital may be made available for the accommodation of patients.

AND WHEREAS the cost of the said apparatus and part of the cost of the concrete floor cannot legally be paid out of the unexpended balance of 1930-31 appropriation,

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that a sum not exceeding Four Thousand and Four Hundred Dollars \$4,400.)) be authorized to be spent subject to tender in the usual way for the purpose of purchasing motor equipment for the Fire Department, and meeting in part the cost of the concrete Floor in the Bedford Row Fire Station:

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the money required for the purpose of aforesaid be taken from the 1931-32 appropriation and legislation be sought at the next session of the legislature to permit the City to repay to the said appropriation from the unexpended balance for 1930-31 the whole of the sum so advanced.
