ACQUISITION OF PROPERTY ON WATER SHED OF LONG LAKE

Sir:-

At a meeting of the City Council held on the 14th of February last, the recommendation of the committee authorizing the City Engineer to purchase the lands on the watershed of Long Lake from the owners, William McFatridge and the Booth Estate, having a combined acreage of approximately 160 acres, at a price not to exceed \$20.00 per acre, when funds are available, was referred back to the committee for further consideration.

These lands are situated on the west side of Long Lake and form part of its watershed.

The McFatridge property is separated from Long Lake by a narrow strip of land owned by the City. It is uncultivated with some lumber on it. Its area is about 58 acres.

The Booth property is situated further away near the Sambro Road and comprises 100 acres, of which about 15 have been cultivated. This property was used a few years ago for raising pigs, but for the past four or five years has been unoccupied.

I have discussed the matter of price with the owners, both asking \$20.00 per acre. This price seems high for land in this vicinity but in looking over the records it is found that in 1917 more than double this rate was paid per acre for uncultivated land at the foot of Long Lake at the north side. This price being fixed by arbitration.

In 1920 \$15.00 per acre was paid for land further out on the old Margaret Bay Road, which was expropriated by the City.

It is recommended that the owners of the two properties under consideration be offered \$16.50 per acre for their lands, this price being arrived at by placing a value of \$15.00 on the land plus 10% for what would be allowed for force taking if they had been expropriated and if the offer is accepted that this amount be paid.

In accordance with the provisions of the City Charter the necessary notices in the matter of the expropriation of lands on watersheds of Long and Chain Lakes, which were expropriated by resolution of the City Council passed on the 14th of February 1935, have been given and the owners have refused to accept the amount of compensation paid into court for their respective properties deeming it insufficient.

Section 633 of the City Charter provides that in the case of several parcels of land belonging to individual owners being expropriated by the City at one time and for one purpose the City may apply to a Judge of the Supreme Court in Chambers to appoint one person to be Referee to determine the compensation to be paid to each of the said several owners who have not accepted the compensation fixed by the resolution for expropriation for their respective lands so expropriated.

This section also provides that no less than one weeks notice in writing shall be given to each owner of the intention of the City to make such application and of the time and place at which the same will be made.

It is recommended that the Solicitor be instructed to make application to a Judge of the Supreme Court for the appointment of a Referee and that the necessary notices be given to each owner of the intention of the City to make such application.

For the information of the Committee it may be pointed out that Section 632 of the Charter provides for the appointment of a Referee in the case of individual owners but in my opinion the City should proceed under Section 633 rather than have a separate arbitration for each of the fourteen properties.

Sir:~

I beg to report on the paving of Cogswell Street from Gottingen Street to Robie Street that there is a double track railway on this street and that the remainder of the street from Gottingen Street to Brunswick Street is now paved with granite blosks.

The roadway from Gottingen Street to Robie Street is in very bad condition, especially the part between North Park Street and Robie Street. There is quite a large volume of traffic on this street which would be considerably increased if the roadway were paved. The City owns more than 50% of the frontage.

Last July the City Council ordered this street to be paved provided the Dominion and Provincial Governments would contribute a share of the cost of the work. No agreement sould be made with them and no progress has since been made.

As stated in the report of July 18th, there can be no doubt as to the improvement that would be made by the construction of the pavement. It would also obviate the necessity of maintenance work for some years and also tend to help the unemployment situation.

The estimated cost is \$26,000.00.

It is recommended that a Standardite asphalt pavement on a 6-inch concrete base be laid on Cogswell Street from Gottingen Street to Robie Street.

I beg to report on the question of paving North Park Street that the City owns all the frontage on the west side of the street.

For some years the surface of this street has been annually trated with oil, but owing to the amount of traffic on this, will not last and each year a certain amount has to be spent on maintenance.

Two types of surfacing have been considered, one a 2-inch black base on the present macadam to be covered with a 24 inch standardite paving, the other a 4-inch black base and standardite top. The estimated cost of the former is \$11,000.00 and of the latter about \$2,500. more. The difficulty of the first method is that the present macadam on the street is used without disturbing it, which would give a first-class foundation for the new work.

North Park Street carries a large amount of traffic and should be paved. Eventually it is proposed to boulevard this street, one roadway being in the same location as at present and the other being made a continuation of Agricola Street with a grass plot between the two roads.

It is recommended that the existing roadway be paved to a width of about thirty feet with Standardite 2tinch top on a 2-inch black base and that a curb and gutter be laid on the west side of the roadway;
