**SUBJECT:** Community Grants Program: Delinquent Reporting Update

### INFORMATION REPORT

#### ORIGIN

November 4, 2013 – Grants Committee approval of default prevention and management protocols.

November 20, 2013 - Audit and Finance Committee approval of default prevention and management practice for programs administered under the Grants Committee. Applicants to programs administered under the auspices of the Grants Committee shall be screened for debt to HRM, extensions shall be limited to one (1) year, and sanctions may be applied to organizations in default of their obligations pursuant to a municipal grant, tax relief, a property sale or lease.

#### LEGISLATIVE AUTHORITY

*HRM Charter (2008), Section 79 (1) (av) respecting grants and contributions.*

#### BACKGROUND

Non-compliance reporting includes the following:

- The addition of grant recipients with overdue progress or final reports and grant recipients liable for the repayment of an ineligible expenditure or any unspent balance of a municipal grant;
- The removal of organizations from the delinquent list who have submitted a complete final report or repayment;
- Identification of accounts issued final notice by registered mail.

Reports, repayment, or reimbursements received after the September 12<sup>th</sup>, 2016 Grants Committee meeting will be updated in next year's status report (2017).

## **DISCUSSION**

It is mandatory that grant recipients submit a final report on or before March 31st of the fiscal year the award was issued. Reporting enables an evaluation of the activities funded by HRM and an accounting of public expenditures in accordance with the terms and conditions of a grant or contribution. Failure to report, or funds not used for the specified purpose, can lead to sanctions including the suspension of eligibility or a refund of any financial assistance in whole or in part.

Since 2011, an annual Information Report is submitted to the Grants Committee on the status of overdue reporting or repayment due under the auspices of the *Community Grants Program*.

## **FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS**

Unspent or misappropriated funds may be recovered from an applicant and deposited in Account M311-5508. Organizations have the option to make payment through a payment plan whereby the amount due to HRM is paid in smaller monthly installments. Once reporting and/or repayment is complete, eligibility is automatically reinstated.

There are no financial implications associated with this report.

## **COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT**

The Grants Committee is comprised of a voting membership of one elected member of Regional Council from each Community Council, the Chair appointed from the membership of the Audit & Finance Standing Committee (also an elected member of Regional Council), and six (6) citizens-at-large. Grant Committee meetings are open to the public unless otherwise indicated. Agendas, minutes and reports are available on the HRM website.
