Burnside Watch

The Burnside Watch works to curtail crime in the Burnside Business Park and Dartmouth Crossing.

Citizens on Patrol - Central, East and West Divisions

These volunteers patrol their communities, looking for suspicious activity and alerting police to potential situations.

HRP Youth Program

The program includes youth aged 14 - 19 years and adult leaders 19+. Youth take part in a variety of educational, fun and community service related activities.

Victim Services

This group primarily provides support to victims of crimes or traumatic situations. Victims of domestic violence are the main focus of the unit. These volunteers work with clients over the phone or on-scene during the evening, seven days a week.

Summary Offence Ticket (SOT) Clerk

These volunteers assist the Traffic Unit with preparing and sorting of summary offence tickets for use by officers in the unit.

Cops N Kids Youth Leaders

These high-school age youth act as mentors for younger children and assist with Cops N Kids camp, as well as subsequent events throughout the school year.

Neighbourhood Watch

These volunteers are the eyes and ears for the community. They communicate with their neighbours and police on crime and safety related issues.

On November 25, all members of HRP Integrated Traffic unit attended the Truro Holiday Inn for the annual kick-off of "Operation Christmas". Numerous other municipal agencies were in attendance as we conducted road check points in their jurisdiction to remind the motoring public of the dangers of drinking and driving, not just over the holidays, but all year round. HRP Traffic Unit will begin our local road checks on December 8.

On November 10, one of my traffic constables was asked to give a presentation to a group of co-op students at Dartmouth High school relating to the tasks that traffic officers perform on a daily basis. This is a program where young high school aged persons are exposed to the various aspects of policing, and it is run by Cst. Jeannie Rankin.

On November 19, the HRP Traffic Unit in conjunction with the Child Safety Link program at the IWK conducted a road check point. The two-pronged goal was to assist the volunteers from the IWK with inspecting vehicles that were equipped with child restraint systems to ensure they were properly installed and secure. They inspected a total of 67 vehicles.

We also accomplished our traffic goal for the month by promoting our message related to "Winter Wise" driving by handing out information pamphlets to prepare motorists for the perils of the up coming driving season .
