



Budgetary Overview

As of April 22, compensation for Fiscal Year 2013-14 should be at approximately 100 per cent, while revenue and all other expenses should be at approximately 100 per cent.

- Revenue – 102.02 per cent.
- Compensation overall (including overtime) – 96.91 per cent. Overtime – 83.30 per cent.
- All other expenses – 103.25 per cent.
- Net budget over all – 96.98 per cent.
- Overall savings of 3.02 per cent.

Police Week 2014 – May 10

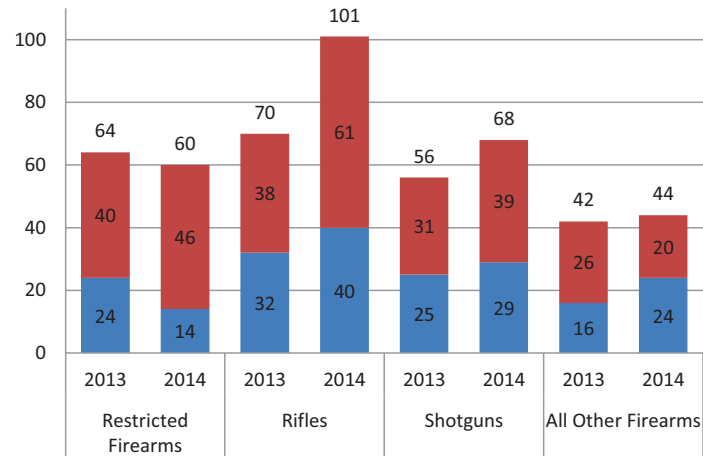

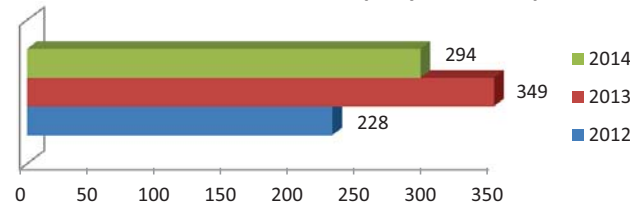

Seized Firearms Jan. 1 to Apr. 20

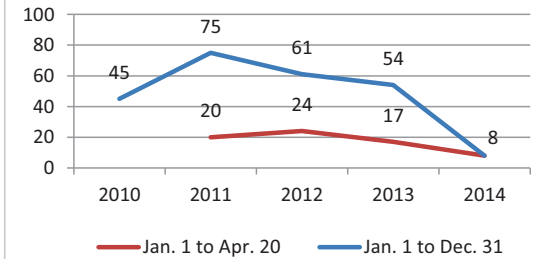


■ Non Evidence - firearms turned over voluntarily or guns that have not been linked to a crime

Total Firearms in Property Jan. 1 to Apr. 20

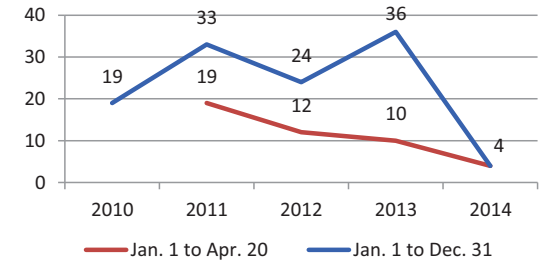


Firearms Discharged

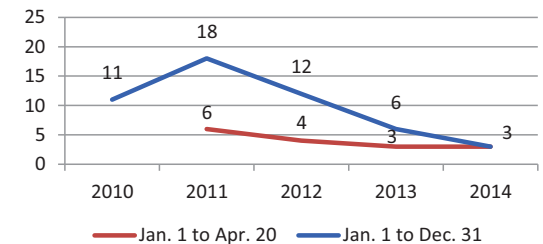

Attempted Homicides



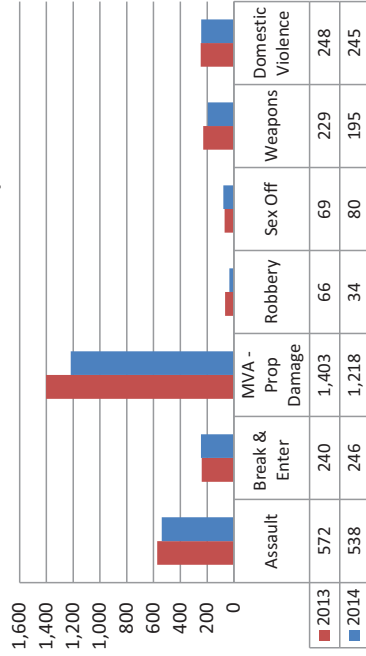

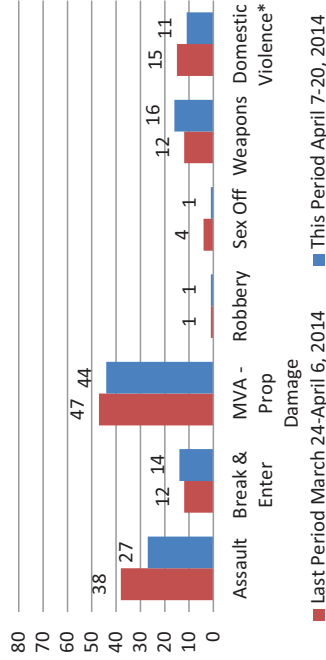

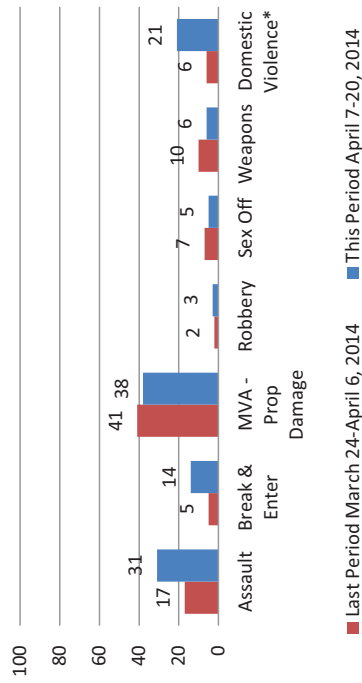
Total Calls for Service Jan. 1 to Apr. 20



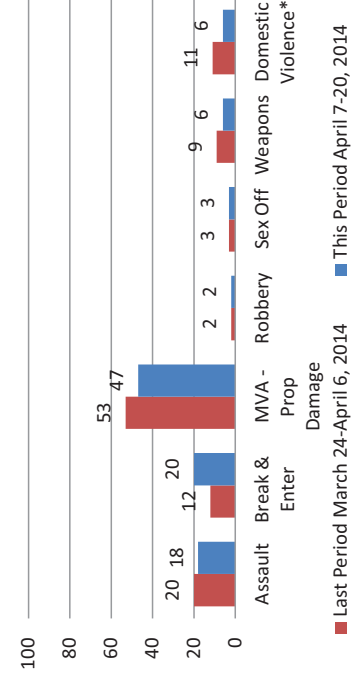

Comstat Overview

Comstat incidents comprise break and enters, mischief, property damage, thefts from vehicles, thefts of vehicles, robbery, weapon-related offences, assault causing bodily harm, assault with a weapon, aggravated assault and drug-related offences.

Central Division

Over the past two weeks, Central Division had 77 Comstat-related incidents. This was an increase of 28 per cent over the previous two week period with the most notable increase in the number of break and enters. Two of these incidents involved the same property and suspects were arrested and charged. There was also an increase in theft from vehicles with the trend noted previously of incidents in the downtown area. There was an increase in robberies with one suspect being charged in connection with incidents in both Central and West. Pro-active focus for the next two weeks will be directed towards the Downtown area in relation to continued theft from vehicles and mischief-related incidents.

East Division

Over the past two weeks, East Division had 88 Comstat-related incidents. In the last two weeks, there have been several incidents of theft from vehicles from parking lots in which wallets have been targeted. The Waverley Road area had several incidents in which the cash register was stolen from the same location. A charge has been laid in these incidents. Pro-active focus continues to be directed in the North-End of Dartmouth area in relation to property crime. Enforcement of court-imposed conditions through breach checks on known offenders continues throughout the Division.

West Division

Over the past two weeks, West Division had 96 Comstat-related incidents. Break and enters have seen an increase during the period with a number of incidents occurring in the same sub-division on the same evening. Theft from vehicle incidents have also seen a slight increase and were spread throughout the Division. The Bedford area will continue to be the focus for this period.
