Environmental Scan of 2014 1st Quarter

Total District Criminal Code Offences/Drugs

<u>Total Criminal Code</u> offences in the first quarter of 2013 show a **decrease** of -52 or by -4.90% compared to the first quarter in 2013.

<u>Drugs</u> in the first quarter of 2014 **decreased** by 32 or by -26.67% compared to the first quarter of 2013.

In the first quarter <u>Property offences</u> count for 55% of Total Criminal Code offences, while crimes against <u>Persons</u> account for 12% and <u>Criminal Other</u> offences account for 32%.

First Quarter comparison between 2013 and 2014:

Property Crimes

Overall Property Crime decreased by -25 or -4.28%.

Stolen Motor Vehicles decreased by -6 or -16.22%.

Break and Enters decreased by -16 or -18.82%.

Fraud incidents **decreased** by -9 or -13.04%.

Violent Crimes

Overall Violent Crime **decreased** by -24 or -16.11%.

Robberies decreased by -8 or -80%.

Homicides remained the same at one.

Attempted Murders increased by +2 or +100%.

Assaults **decreased** by -21 or -15.22%.

Assaults accounted for 94% of reported violent crimes in the first quarter of 2014.

Other Criminal Code

Includes prostitution, gaming/betting, offensive weapons, and other criminal code offences (i.e. arson, property damage, indecent acts, counterfeiting currency etc.)

Offensive Weapons *increased* by +12 in the first quarter of 2014 or by +92.31%.

Prostitution offences *increased* by +2 in the first quarter of 2014 or by +100%...




Crimes Against Persons 1st Quarter Comparison








Crimes Against Property 1st Quarter Comparison












Assaults - Break & Enter - Theft Under January - March 2013/14

Assaults

Assaults Level 1 accounted for 69% of the total <u>Assaults</u> in the 1st quarter of 2014, the 1st quarter of 2013 had a result of 57% and experienced a +8% *increase* in 2014 over the same period last year.

Assault with a Weapon Causing Bodily Harm accounted for 10% of the total <u>Assaults</u> in 2014 compared to 17% in 2013 and experienced a -50% **decrease** over the same period last year.

All forms of Sexual Assaults combined accounted for 14% of the total <u>Assaults</u> in 2014 compared to 19% in 2013.

Robberies

Robberies accounted for 2% of the total <u>Persons Crime</u> in the 1st quarter of 2014 compared to 7% in 2013 and experienced a -80% **decrease** in 2014 over the same period last year.

Break & Enter

Break & Enter (Residence) accounted for 54% of the total <u>Break & Enters</u> in the 1st quarter of 2014 compared to 42% in 2013 and experienced a +3% *increase* in 2014 over the same period last year.

Break & Enter (Other) accounted for 28% of the total <u>Break & Enters</u> in 2014 1st quarter compared to 29% in 2013 and experienced a -24% **decrease** over the same period last year.

Break & Enter (Business) accounted for 14% of the total <u>Break & Enters</u> in the 1st quarter 2014 compared to 25% in 2013 and experienced a -52% **decrease** in 2014 over the same period last year.

Theft Under \$5,000

Theft Other Under \$5,000 accounted for 45% of the total <u>Theft Under \$5,000</u> in the 1st quarter 2014 compared to 58% in 2013 and experienced a -15% **decrease** in 2014 over the same period last year.

Theft from Motor Vehicle under \$5,000 accounted for 49% of the total Theft Under \$5,000 in the 1st quarter 2014 compared to 37% in 2013 and experienced a +43% *increase* over the same period last year.

Possession of Stolen Goods experienced a -74% **decrease** in the 1st quarter 2014 over the same period last year.

Shoplifting Under \$5,000 experienced a -41% **decrease** in the 1st quarter 2014 over the same period last year.

HRM Policing Services Environmental Scan 1st Quarter 2014

Total HRM Criminal Code Offences/Drugs

Total Criminal Code offences reported in the first quarter of 2014 show a **decrease** of **-111** reported offences or a **decrease** of **-15.33%** compared to the first quarter of 2013. Drugs in the first quarter of 2014 show a **increase** of **+7** offences or a **increase** of **+2.27%** compared to the first quarter of 2013.

Property offences account for 52% of the reported Total Criminal Code offences, while crimes against Persons account for 13% and Other Criminal Code offences account for 35%.

Property Crimes

Property crime shows a **decrease** of -51 reported offences or -2.13%.

Stolen motor vehicles decreased by -34 or -28.10%.

Break and Enters decreased by -27 offences or -10.89%.

Frauds increased by +24 offences or +8.16%.

Violent Crimes

Violent crime has experienced a **decrease** in the first quarter of 2014 compared to 2013 by **-111** offences or by **-15.33%**.

Robberies decreased by -31 offences or a change of -53.45%.

Homicides remained the same at 3.

Attempted murders decreased by -3 offences in the first quarter of 2014 or a change of -42.86%.

Assaults **decreased** by **-82** offences or a change of **-12.69%**. Assaults accounted for **92%** of violent crimes in the first quarter of 2014.

Criminal Other

Includes prostitution, gaming/betting, offensive weapons, and other criminal code offences (arson, property damage, indecent acts, counterfeiting, etc) has **increased** by +2 or +.13%.

Prostitution offences decreased by -3 offences in the first quarter of 2014 over 2013 or -27.27%.

Please note offences such as drug and prostitution are sensitive to directed enforcement and detection.
