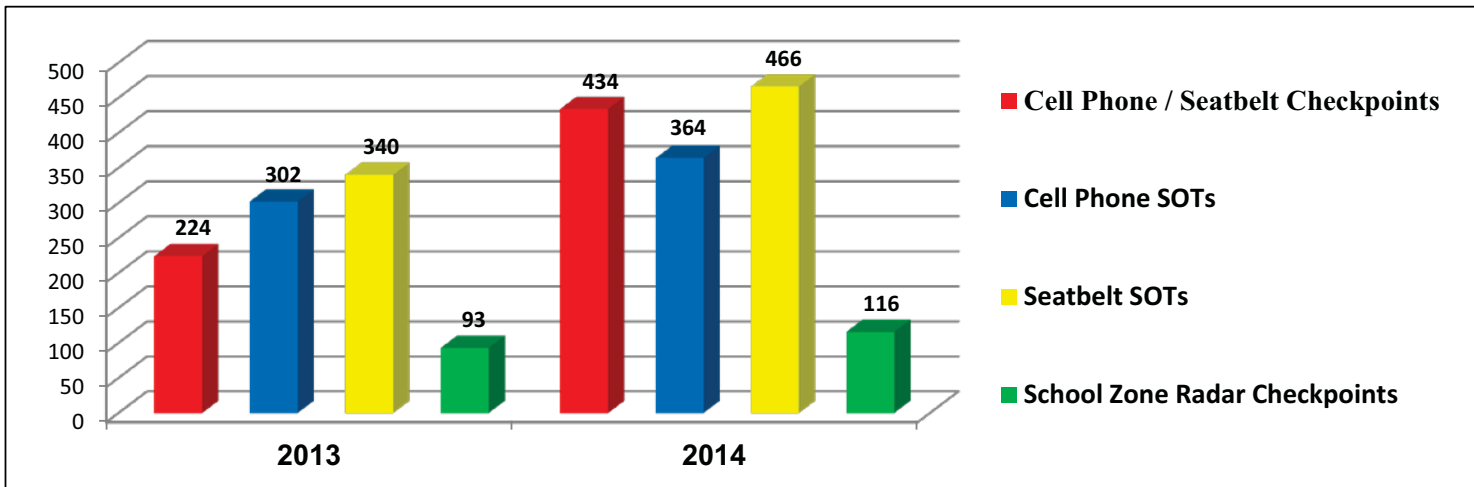

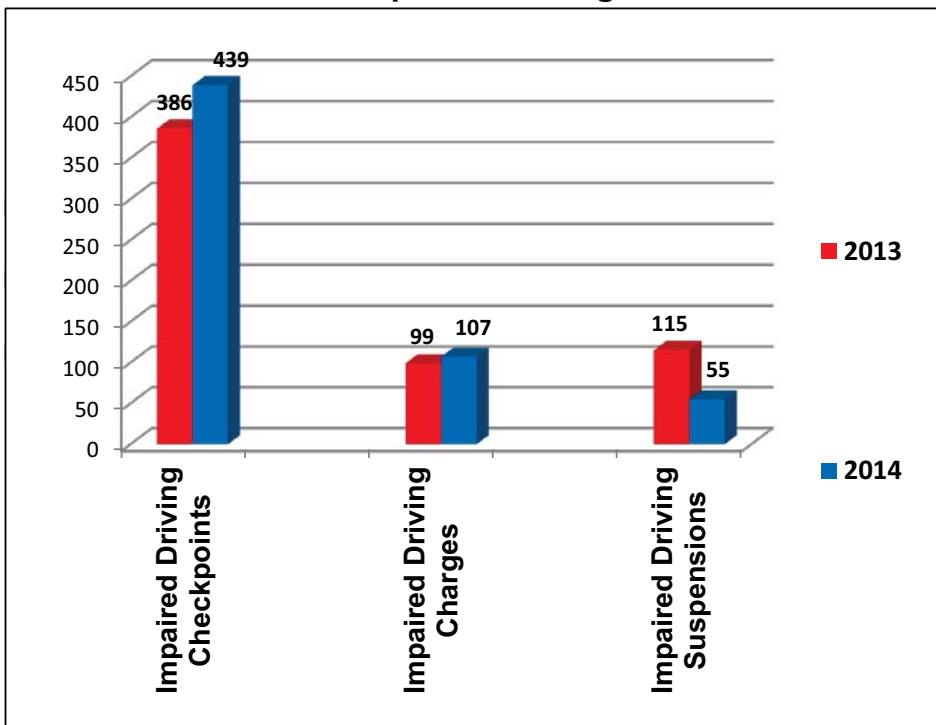


### Summary

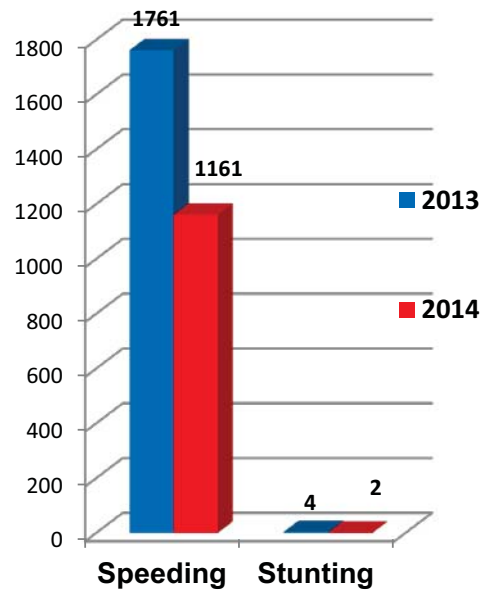
#### Road Safety

From January 1st - May 31st, 2014, Hfx. District experienced 434 Cell Phone checkpoints, a +93% increase over the same period last year resulting in a +20% increase in the number of Cell Phone SOTs and a +37% increase in Seatbelt SOTs issued. From January 1st - May 31st, 2014 Hfx. District experienced 116 radar enforcement checkpoints held within the school zones, a +24% increase over the same period last year.

#### Impaired Driving

From Jan. 1st - May 31st, 2014, Hfx. District received sixty-six 911 calls from the public, a -2% decrease over the same period last year contributing to 45 impaired driving charges and 10 driving suspensions. Hfx. District experienced a +13% increase in impaired driving checkpoints over the same period in 2013 and had a total of 107 charges laid, an +8% increase in Impaired driving charges. Suspensions decreased by -52% over the same period.

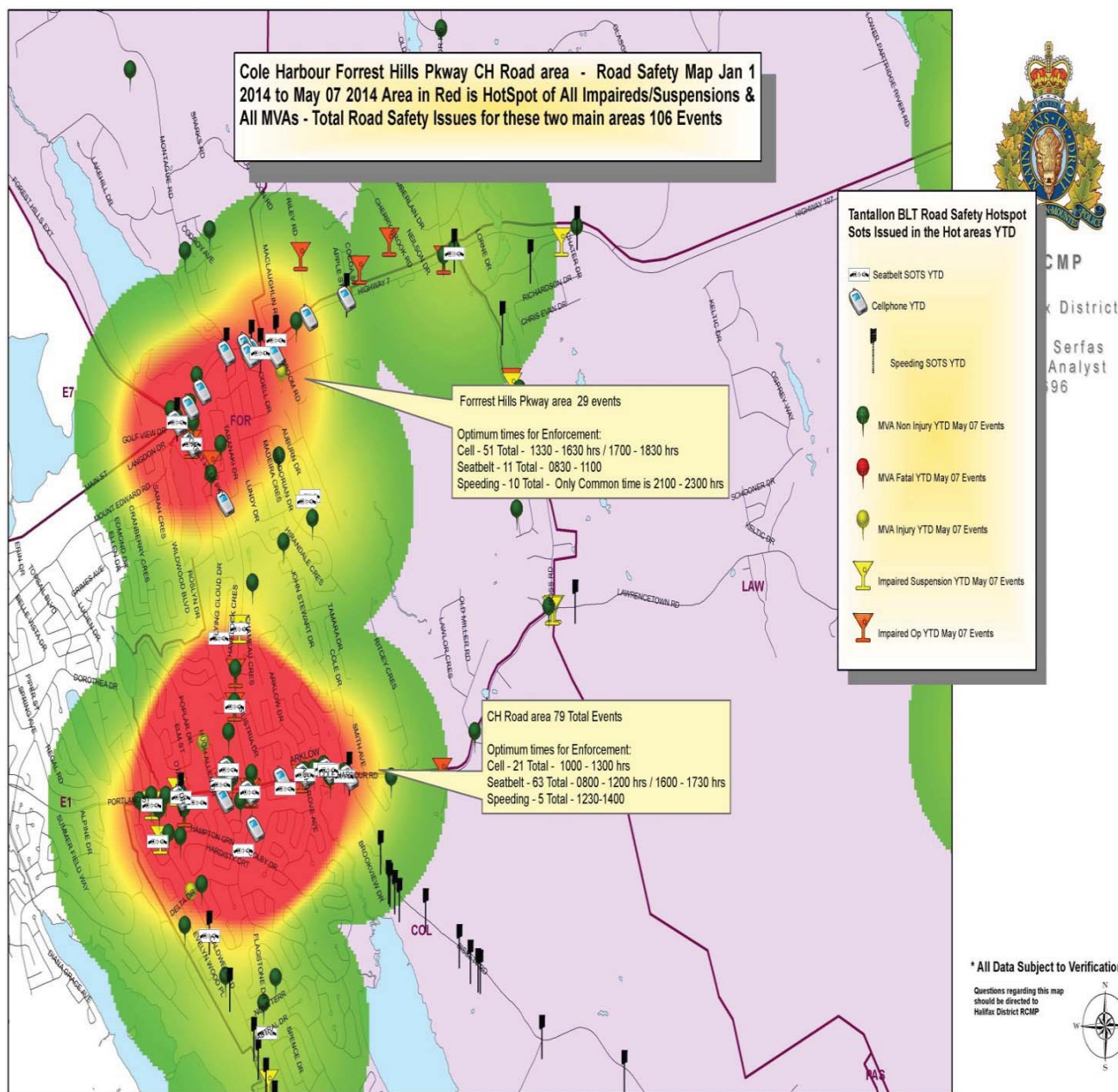
#### Aggressive Driving

A 29% increase in overall checkpoints, i.e. radar, seat belt etc. was experienced from January 1st - May 31st, 2014 over the same period in 2013 and a decrease of -34% in speeding SOTs was seen.

## Summary

### Road Safety

Halifax District continues to be evidence lead in their approach to Crime and Road Safety. During Canada's 2014 Road Safety Week (May 13th - 19th) year to date data was mapped for Cellphone, Speeding and Seatbelt SOTS over top of identified hotspot areas of road safety events such as Motor Vehicle Accidents and Impaired Driving. Optimum times of when SOTS were issued in those hotspots were communicated so that Members could direct their enforcement activities in the pre-determined areas at the right time.

### Community Policing

During the month of May 2014, Halifax District participated in a number of community events. In addition to Police Week activities, these included the graduation ceremonies of the Seniors Academy program, an eight week Adult Learning program geared towards Crime Prevention. RCMP High School Coop Program that includes high school students from all over HRM. This takes place during the regular school year every two weeks and is a credited course for the students.
