

## Pedestrian Accidents



## Summary

### Pedestrian Accidents

From January 1st - October 31st, 2014 Hfx. District had a total of fourteen pedestrian accidents, the same when compared to the same period in 2013. Five were in a crosswalk, the remaining nine were roadside or crossing outside of a crosswalk. Eight of these incidents resulted in one fatality and seven with minor injuries. Ten occurred during the daylight hours. A total of four SOTs were issued to the drivers.

April 1st - September 30th Updates

On April 1st, 2014 Hfx. District's OIC announced the Priorities for the 2014/15 fiscal year's Annual Performance Plan. The three Priorities are identified as Crime Reduction / Youth Intervention, Cybercrime and Traffic.

### Crime Reduction / Youth Intervention

All Hfx. District Community Policing CPO and SLO's have received the Hybrid Hub training. As well, approximately 75% of Hfx. District Regular Members have received the Hybrid Hub initiative information session. Instruction to school partners for the Risk Screening Tool training will continue. Currently the District has 10 clients in the Hub and 5 in the initial assessment stage.

### Cybercrime


Arrangements were made for the Provincial Cyberscan Unit to attend four Watch meetings and thirty members were trained to date. The remaining Watch members and Eastern Shore members will be trained next quarter. Any significant scam or crime receives attention and direction in terms of advising the Public. There were 27 Cyber Crime investigations so far this year and a review was conducted finding no major issues.

### Traffic

News releases were co-created and in-line with the pillars of the crime prevention continuum, education, prevention, invention and enforcement. Busy long weekends, back-to-school safety, reminders of recent MVA legislation (move over law) and distracted driving were promoted through news releases. Statistical information has also been shared through social media with the Public in terms of Impaired drivers, seat belt enforcement.

**Crime Reduction:** In the last Comstat 3 week period Hfx. District again saw a significant reduction in Property crimes, particularly Theft from Motor Vehicles (TFMV). There were only 10 TFMVs across the entire District for 21 days subsequently impacting our overall YTD reductions and for the second Comstat in a row there was no defined Hotspot in Tantallon. There were 113 Comstat events in the last 3 weeks compared to 174 the previous 3 weeks and compared to 218 for the same 3 week period last year. Some of these reductions are believed to be a result of key offenders being incarcerated for the month of October.
