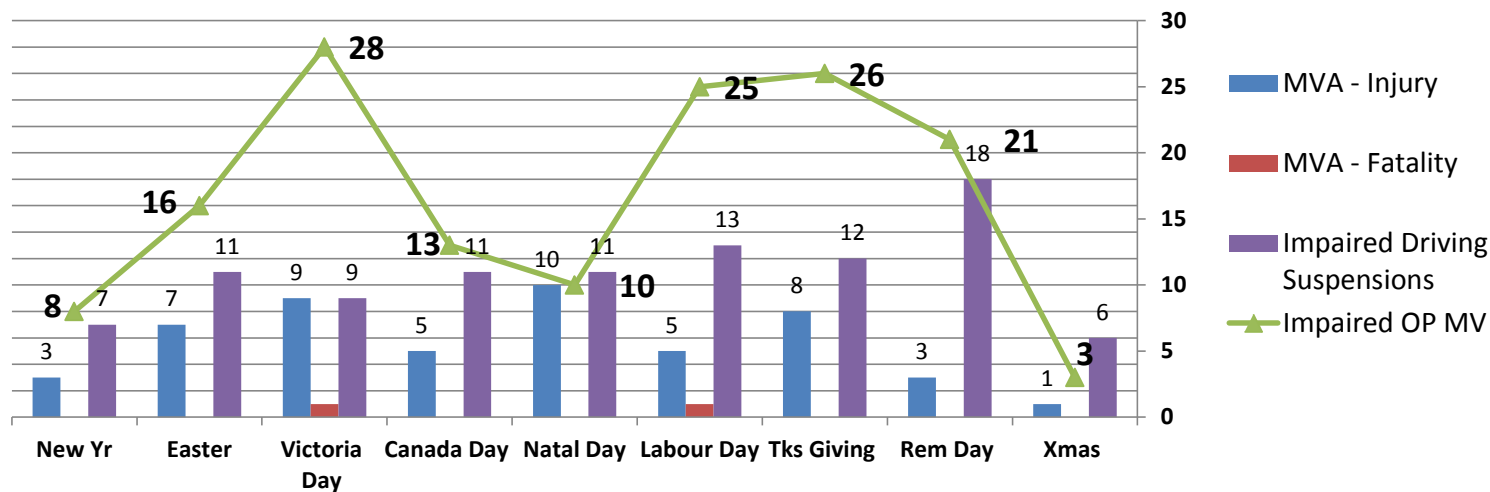
Summary

Road Safety

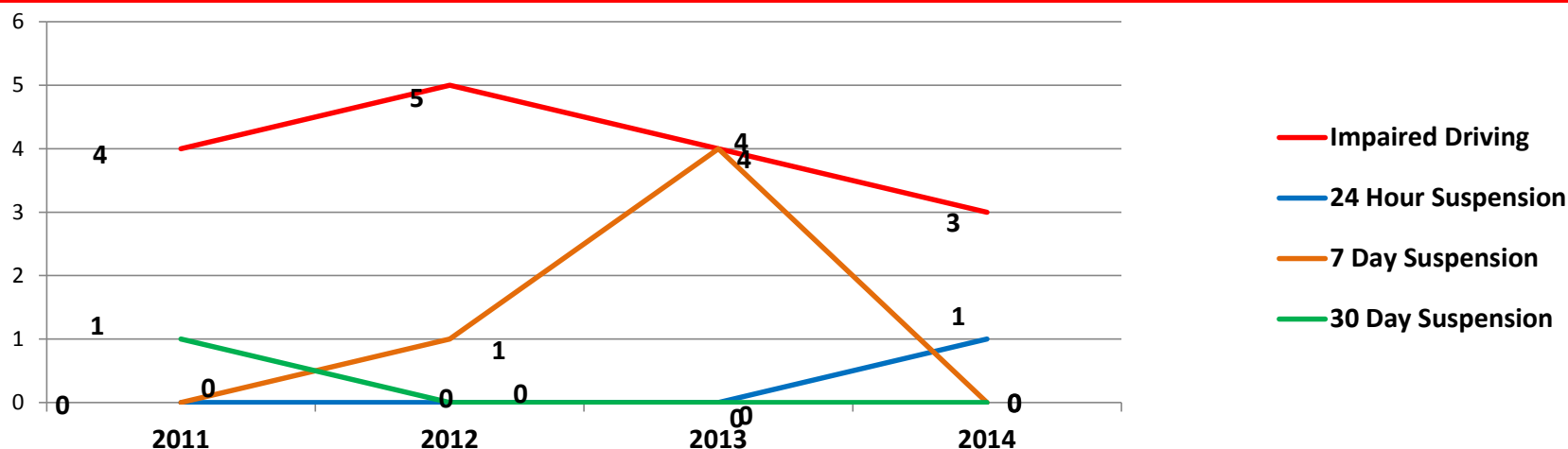
Spring and Summer weather is upon us, which typically means more traffic out on the roads and as such the District continues to use historic data from Long weekend or Holiday data to determine resource deployment and targeted enforcement. The graph shown depicts Holiday periods for the entire years 2011-2014, with Victoria Day, Labour Day and Thanksgiving being the top 3 for Impaired events and or Injury and Fatal MVA's.

Impaired Driving - Victoria Day Holiday Weekend



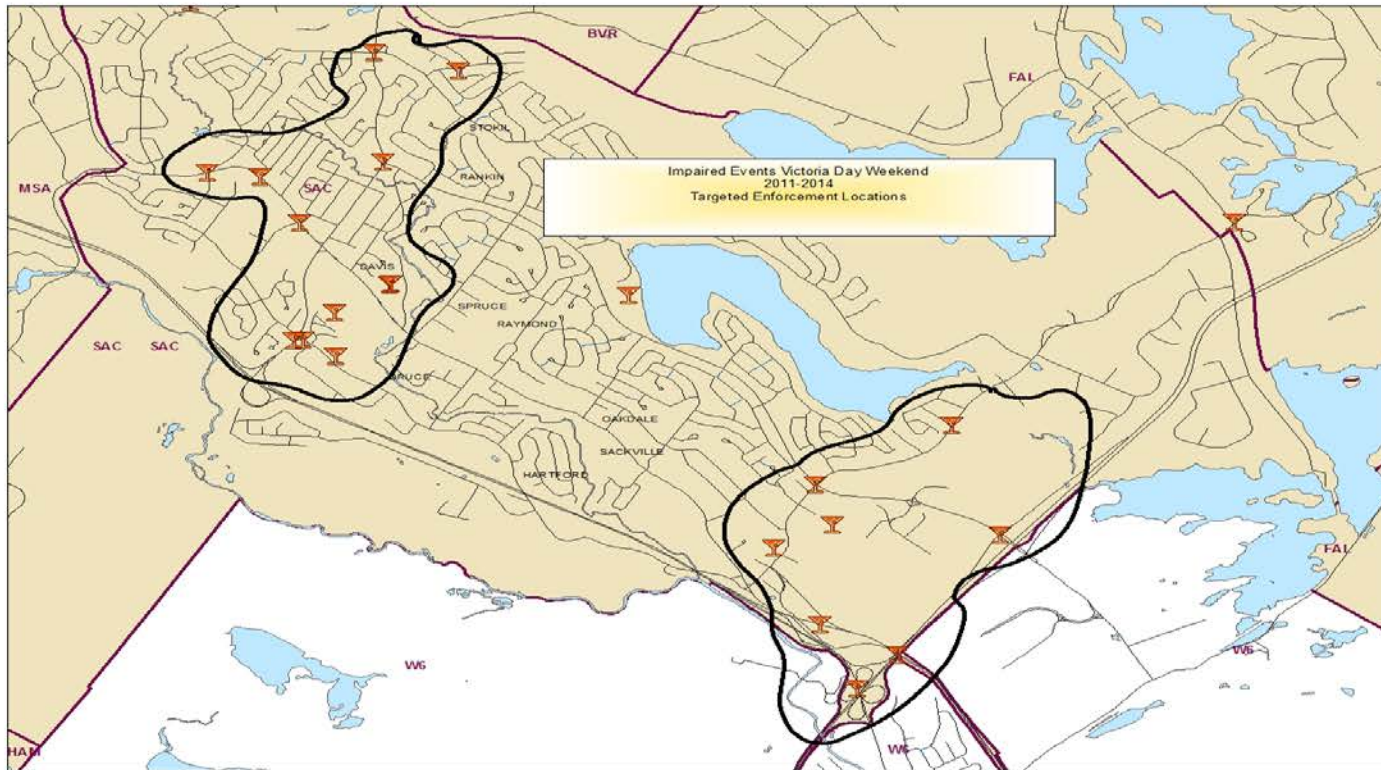
District Priorities

Summary

- Halifax District continues to make Road Safety a priority by analysing all Impaired Data and Fatal or injury collisions over holiday periods. The data for the every Statutory Holiday period was analysed and in some cases mapped for the last 4 years to identify hotspot locations similar to this one. The Victoria Day Weekend is historically considered the opening of seasonal residences as well as the beginning of the summer for many and also coincides with being the #1 Holiday weekend for Impaired Driving events for the whole year. Knowing this information in advance will enable the District to communicate to Officers, key areas to apply targeted enforcement for the upcoming long weekend. The information and maps will focus on doing the right type of enforcement at the right place at the right time based on previous Victoria Day weekends. Other initiatives for the month of May include Canada Road Safety Week and May 16th is the first National Impaired Driving Initiative for 2015.
