# Halifax District RCMP

## Environmental Scan of 2015 1st Quarter

### Total District Criminal Code Offences/Drugs

Total Criminal Code offences in the first quarter of 2015 show a **decrease** of -159 or by -15.88% compared to the first quarter in 2014.

Drugs in the first quarter of 2015 **decreased** by -14 or by -15.91% compared to the first quarter of 2014.

In the first quarter Property offences count for 46% of Total Criminal Code offences, while crimes against Persons account for 14% and Criminal Other offences account for 40%.

### First Quarter comparison between 2014 and 2015:

#### Property Crimes

Overall Property Crime **decreased** by -172 or -30.94%.

Stolen Motor Vehicles **decreased** by -6 or -20%.

Break and Enters **decreased** by -12 or -17.39%.

Fraud incidents **increased** by +10 or +16.95%.

#### Violent Crimes

Overall Violent Crime **decreased** by -1 or -.83%.

Robberies **increased** by +2 or +100%.

Homicides **increased** by +2 or +200%..

Attempted Murders remained the same at 2.

Assaults **decreased** by -3 or -2.63%.

Assaults accounted for 92% of reported violent crimes in the first quarter of 2015.

#### Other Criminal Code

Includes prostitution, gaming/betting, offensive weapons, and other criminal code offences (i.e. arson, property damage, indecent acts, counterfeiting currency etc.)

Offensive Weapons **increased** by +1 in the first quarter of 2015 or by +4.17%.

Prostitution offences **increased** by +1 in the first quarter of 2015 or by +50%..

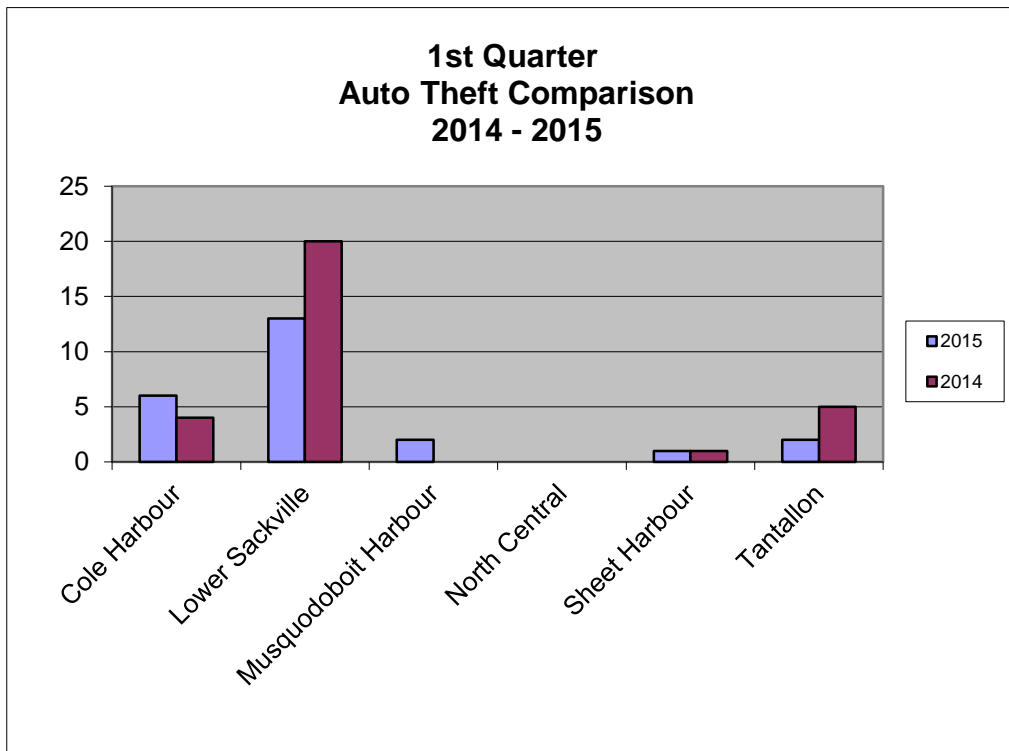
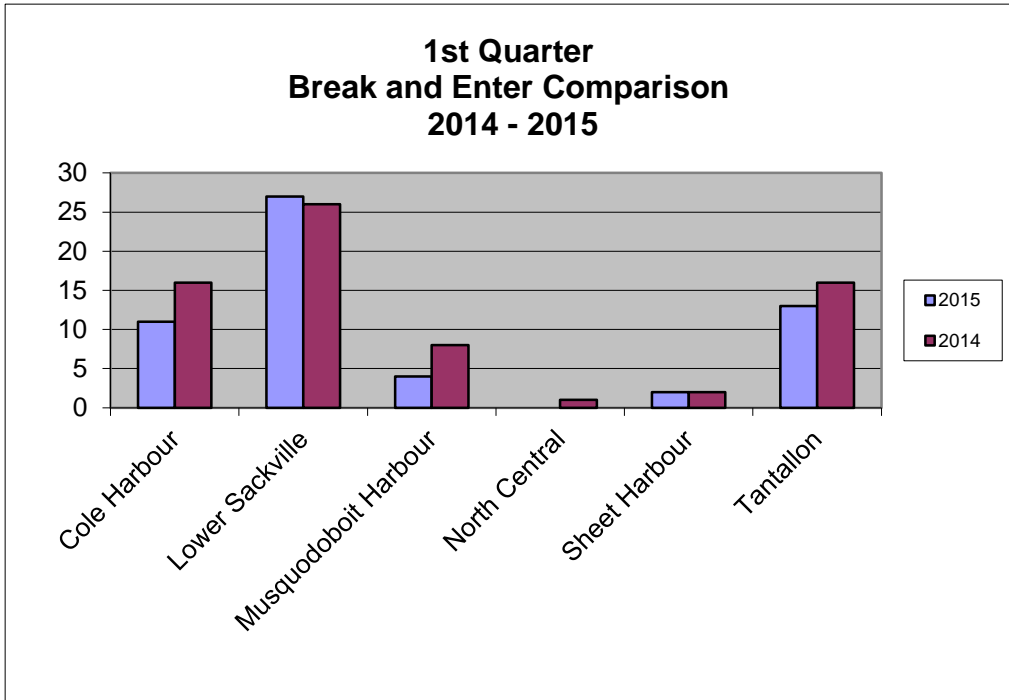

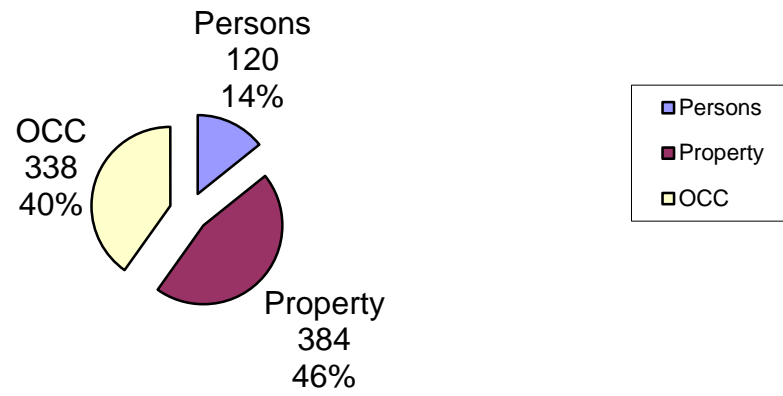
## Crimes Against Persons 1st Quarter Comparison



### Crimes Against Property 1st Quarter Comparison



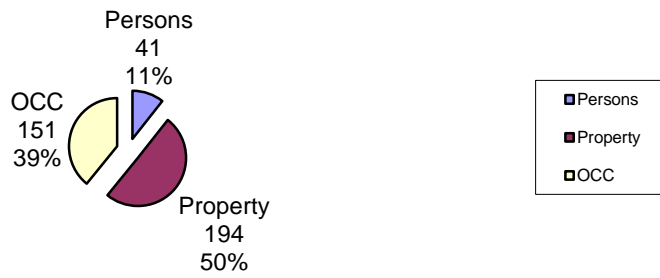

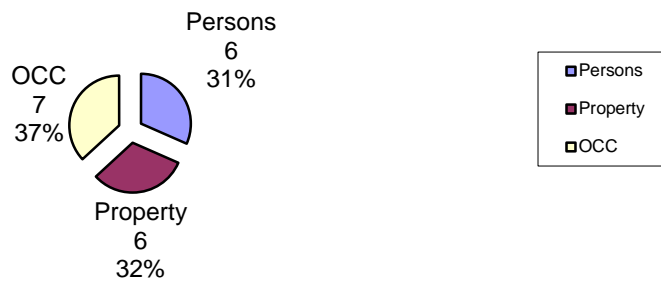




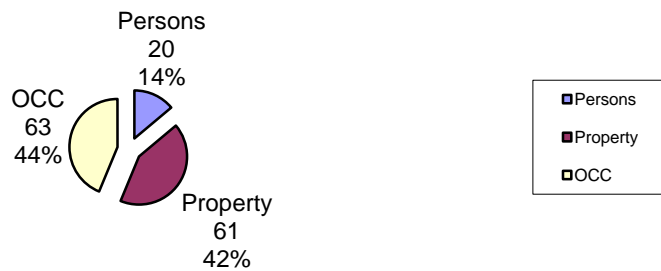

## Assaults - Break & Enter - Theft Under January – March 2014/15

### Assaults

Assaults Level 1 accounted for 54% of the total Assaults in the 1<sup>st</sup> quarter of 2015, the 1<sup>st</sup> quarter of 2014 had a result of 68% and experienced a -26% **decrease** in 2015 over the same period last year.

Assault with a Weapon Causing Bodily Harm accounted for 16% of the total Assaults in 2015 compared to 11% in 2014 and experienced a +58% **increase** over the same period last year.

All forms of Sexual Assaults combined accounted for 22% of the total Assaults in 2015 compared to 13% in 2014.

Robberies accounted for 3% of the total Persons Crime in the 1<sup>st</sup> quarter of 2015 compared to 1% in 2014 and experienced a +100% **increase** in 2015 over the same period last year.

## Break & Enter

Break & Enter (Residence) accounted for 65% of the total Break & Enters in the 1<sup>st</sup> quarter of 2015 compared to 53% in 2014 and remained the same with 37 incidents in 2015 compared to the same period last year.

Break & Enter (Other) accounted for 23% of the total Break & Enters in 2015 1<sup>st</sup> quarter compared to 28% in 2014 and experienced a -32% **decrease** over the same period last year.

Break & Enter (Business) accounted for 12% of the total Break & Enters in the 1<sup>st</sup> quarter 2015 compared to 14% in 2014 and experienced a -30% **decrease** in 2015 over the same period last year.

## Theft Under \$5,000

Theft Other Under \$5,000 accounted for 72% of the total Theft Under \$5,000 in the 1<sup>st</sup> quarter 2015 compared to 49% in 2014 and experienced a -20% **decrease** in 2015 over the same period last year.

Theft from Motor Vehicle under \$5,000 accounted for 26% of the total Theft Under \$5,000 in the 1<sup>st</sup> quarter 2015 compared to 50% in 2014 and experienced a -71% **decrease** over the same period last year.

Possession of Stolen Goods remained the same at a total of 21 incidents in the 1<sup>st</sup> quarter of 2015 when compared to the same period last year.

Shoplifting Under \$5,000 experienced a -33% **decrease** in the 1<sup>st</sup> quarter 2015 over the same period last year.

### Total HRM Criminal Code Offences/Drugs

Total Criminal Code offences in the first quarter of 2015 show a **decrease** of -358 or by -7.93% compared to the first quarter of 2014.

Drugs in the first quarter of 2015 **decreased** by -54 or by -17.31% compared to the first quarter of 2014.

In the first quarter Property offences count for 45% of the Total Criminal Code offences, while crimes against Persons account for 16% and Criminal Other offences account for 39%.

### First Quarter comparison between 2014 and 2015:

#### Property Crimes

Overall Property Crime **decrease** by -495 or -21.14%.

Stolen Motor Vehicles **decreased** by -10 or -11.49%.

Break and Enters **decreased** by -25 or -11.16%.

Frauds **decreased** by -6 or -1.87%.

Overall Violent crime **increased** by +69 or +11.35%.

Robberies **increased** by +11 or +40.74%.

Homicide Victims **increased** by +1 or +33.33%.

Attempted Murders **decreased** by -2 or -50%.

Assaults **increased** by +67 or +11.94%.

Assaults accounted for 93% of reported violent crimes in the first quarter of 2015.

#### Criminal Other Code

Includes prostitution, gaming/betting, offensive weapons, and other criminal code offences (arson, property damage, indecent acts, counterfeiting, etc)

Offensive Weapons **decreased** by -24 in the first quarter of 2015 or by -28.57%

Prostitution offences **increased** by +11 offences in the first quarter of 2015 or +137.5%

Please note offences such as drug and prostitution are sensitive to directed enforcement and detection.
