Halifax Regional Police Environmental Scan of Preliminary Crime Statistics 3rd Quarter 2015

Total City Wide Criminal Code Offences/Drugs

Total Criminal Code offences reported in the third quarter of 2015 show a decrease of -366 reported offences or a change of -8% compared to the third quarter of 2014. Drugs for third quarter 2015 show a decrease of -24 offences or a change of -12% compared to third quarter 2014.

Property offences account for 52% of reported Criminal Code offences, while crimes against persons account for 14% and other criminal code offences account for 34%.

Property Crimes

Property crime decrease by -227 offences or -9.50%.

Stolen motor vehicles increased by +1 offences or +1.39%.

Break and Enters increased by +21 offences or +8.90%.

Fraud decreased by -82 offences or -27.42%.

Violent Crimes

Violent crimes has experienced an increase in the third quarter of 2015 compared to 2014 by 50 offences or +9.12%.

Robberies increased by +6 offence or +15%.

Homicides increased by 1 offence, reporting 3 incident in the 3^{rd} quarter of 2015 compared to 2 incident in the 3^{rd} quarter of 2014.

Attempt murders decreased by -8 offences, down from 11 in third quarter of 2014 to 3 in third quarter of 2015.

Assaults increased in the third quarter of 2015 by +48 incidents with 538 reported. Assaults account for 90% of violent crimes in the third quarter of 2015.

Other Criminal Code

OCC includes prostitution, gaming/betting, offensive weapons, and other criminal code offences (arson, property damage, indecent acts, counterfeiting, etc). Counterfeiting offences have decreased by -26 in the third quarter of 2015 over 2014, and wilful damage under \$5000 has decreased by -58 offences in 2015.

Prostitution offences decreased by -7 offences in the third quarter of 2015 over 2014. Please note offences such as drug and prostitution are sensitive to directed enforcement and detection. Fail to Appear and bail violations have decreased by -47 offences in the third quarter of 2015.




3rd Quarter 2015 Reported Crime Distribution by Division


















HALIFAX REGIONAL POLICE ZONES Assaults – Break & Enters – Theft Under July - September 2014/2015 Comparison

Assaults

Assaults Level 1 account for 59% of the total Assaults in the 3rd quarter of 2015 compared to 63% in 2014 and experienced a 4% increase in 2015 over the same period last year.

Assaults with a Weapon Causing Bodily Harm accounted for 14% of the total Assaults in 2015 compared to 17% in 2014 and experienced a -7% decrease over the same period last year.

All forms of Sexual Assaults combined accounted for 17% of the total Assaults in 2015 compared to 12% in 2014 and experienced a 48% increase over the same period last year.

Break & Enter

Break & Enter (Residence) accounted for 43% of the total Break & Enters in the 3rd quarter of 2015 compared to 44% in 2014 and experienced a 6% increase in 2015 over the same period last year.

Break & Enter (Other) accounted for 20% of the total Break & Enters in the 3rd quarter of 2015 compared to 19% in 2014 and experienced a 16% increase in 2015 over the same period last year.

Break & Enter (Business) accounted for 33% of the total Break & Enters in the 3rd quarter of 2015 compared to 29% in 2014 and experienced a 23% increase in 2015 over the same period last year.

Theft/Possession Under \$5000

Theft – other under \$5000 accounted for 56% of the total Theft Under \$5000 in the 3rd quarter of 2015 compared to 57% in 2014 and experienced a 5% decrease in 2015 over the same period last year.

Theft From Motor Vehicle accounted for 39% of the total Theft Under \$5000 in the 3rd quarter of 2015 compared to 39% in 2014 and experienced a 4% decrease over the same period last year.

Possession of Stolen Goods experienced a 44% decrease in the 3rd quarter of 2015

Total City Wide Criminal Code Offences/Drugs

Total Criminal Code offences reported in the third quarter of 2015 shows a decrease of -570 reported offences or a change of -9.35% compared to the third quarter of 2014. Drugs for third quarter 2015 show a decrease of -48 offences or a change of -14.86% compared to third quarter 2014.

Property offences accounted for **49%** of the reported Total Criminal Code offences, while crimes against persons account for **14%** and other criminal code offences account for **37%**.

Violent Crimes

Homicides increased by 1 incident in 2015 with 3 in total compared to 2 in the third quarter of 2014.

Attempt murders decreased by -9 offences in 2015 compared to the third quarter of 2014 or -75%.

Robberies increased by +16 offences or +34.78%.

Assaults increased by +52 offences or +8.09%. Assaults account for 90% of violent crimes in the third quarter of 2015.

Violent crime experienced an increase in the third quarter of 2015 over 2014 by +64 offences or +9.04%.

Property Crimes

Break and Enters increased by +19 offences or 5.76%.

Stolen motor vehicles increased by +6 offences or 5.77%.

Theft over \$5,000 decreased by -4 offences or -13.79%

Theft under \$5,000 decreased by -241 offences or -11.63%

Have Stolen Goods decreased by -97 offences or -41.63%

Frauds decreased by -107 offences or -27.65%.

Property crime shows a decrease of -424 reported offences or -13.43%.

Criminal Other

Includes prostitution, gaming/betting, offensive weapons, and other criminal code offences (arson, property damage, indecent acts, counterfeiting, etc) has decreased by -210 or by -9.40%.

Prostitution offences decreased by -7 offences in the third quarter of 2015 over 2014 or -46.67%. Please note offences such as drug and prostitution are sensitive to directed enforcement and detection.
