

Impaired Driving - December




Summary

Impaired Driving - December

In December 2015, HRM police charged 42 individuals with impaired driving, a -21% decrease in impaired driving charges and a -54% decrease in impaired driving suspensions compared to December 2014. HRM police identified 7 impaired drivers as a result of attending motor vehicle collisions. 26 impaired drivers were detected at traffic stops and members of the public alerted police to 22 drivers who were issued a suspension or charged criminally.

Impaired Driving January - December

From January 1st - December 31st 2015, HRM police charged 647 individuals with impaired driving, a -2% decrease in impaired driving charges and a -33% decrease in impaired driving suspensions when compared to the 2014 calendar year. 17 of those were charged with impaired driving by drugs. 193 people charged were more than two times the legal limit, 34 people were more than three times the legal limit and 3 people were more than 4 times the legal limit of 80 milligrams of alcohol per 100 millilitres of blood. The majority of impaired drivers were male.







Summary Impaired Driving - December

In December 2015, HRP charged 30 individuals with impaired driving, a 25% increase in impaired driving charges and a -53% decrease in impaired driving suspensions compared to December 2014. HRP identified 5 impaired drivers as a result of attending motor vehicle collisions. 20 impaired drivers were detected at traffic stops and members of the public alerted police to 18 drivers who were issued a suspension or charged criminally.

Impaired Driving January - December

From January 1st - December 31st 2015, HRP charged 364 individuals with impaired driving, a +2% increase in impaired driving charges and a 20% decrease in impaired driving suspensions when compared to the 2014 calendar year. 8 of those were charged with impaired drving by drugs. 119 people charged were more than two times the legal limit, 19 people were more than three times the legal limit and one person was more than 4 times the legal limit of 80 milligrams of alcohol per 100 millilitres of blood. The majority of impaired drivers were male.
