Re: December Traffic Section Report

Monthly Theme:

The monthly traffic theme for December was Operation Christmas/Impaired: GO # 15-170440. There were 45 special checks recorded on the file. There were 31 traffic check points conducted by patrol and traffic with over 5,500 cars having been checked. From these check points members recorded 46 summary offence tickets issued, three impaired drivers, one refusal and seven road side tests administered.

Traffic members check points conducted with assistance from Vehicle Compliance, Motor Carrier, RCMP and one evening staff from Allstate Insurance came out in the rain for two hours to hand out ice scrapers.

Special checks for crosswalks: 15-170762, 15-170914, 15-170370. Traffic members were tasked to continue special checks in areas of crosswalks conducting daily special checks for any infractions in and around crosswalks. Numerous tickets were issued for various offences but of note, 39 crosswalk infractions tickets were issued in December to driver and pedestrians.

- Traffic members assisted with HRM Fire Div/Comm Bednarz funeral. Escort provided from funeral home along with traffic duties.
- December 10,11,17,19 and 23 traffic members conducted impaired driving check points.
- December 15 Sgt. Calder attended HDBC along with S/Sgt. Morris to discuss traffic issues with the two bridges and possible solutions until completed.

The Burnside Watch works to curtail crime in the Burnside Business Park and Dartmouth Crossing.
