Halifax Explosion 100th Anniversary Commemorative Emblem

Background

- In October 2015, Regional Council passed a motion to have a commemorative emblem developed
- It will be used as a visual identity and recognition of the projects surrounding the 100th Anniversary
- The emblem will
 - Reflect the municipality's commitment to the significance of the commemoration
 - Be featured at special events, projects and official communication leading up to and during 2017



Engagement

- The engagement was designed to solicit citizen feedback to be used in the creation of the emblem
- Two-part engagement:
- On-line portal
 - On-line from March 9th to April 5th
 - Promoted using PSA, on-line, social media, e-mail and paid radio
 - Over 350 submissions were received
- Direct Stakeholder engagement
 - Including historians, relatives of survivors and various community stakeholders.
 - The list was developed with Government Relations and Events and Cultural Initiatives staff.
 - Individuals were invited to use the on-line portal, directly reply to email or to offer feedback by phone
