WHEREAS	the Halifax Pride Committee has chosen in 2004 the week of July 11 to 18 to celebrate the rights of lesbians, gays, bisexual and transgendered individuals; and
WHEREAS	the Halifax Pride Committee has chosen for 2004 the theme, 'This Way Out' in recognition of the reality that respecting the rights of diverse members of our community enhances the rights and freedom of all members of our community locally, provincially, nationally, and internationally; and
WHEREAS	the Halifax Pride Committee has organized events, which includes what has become the largest summertime parade in HRM, in celebration of the contribution of Lesbians, Gays, Bisexuals and Transgendered communities; and
WHEREAS	Lesbians, Gays, Bisexuals and the Transgendered everywhere continue their fight to end prejudice and discrimination; and
WHEREAS	every person in our city is entitled to be treated with dignity and worth and without discrimination, prejudice or harassment; and
WHEREAS	the struggle for these positive changes in society is a struggle to make visible these communities to all citizens; and
WHEREAS	this year we are privileged to have special guests from Uganda participating in Pride activities in Halifax.
