ORIGIN

Approved 2006/2007 Capital Budget.

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that Council award Tender No. 07-150 to Seagate Construction Inc,. for a total tender price of \$103,015 (net HST included), with funding from Capital Account No. CBU00876 200 Ilsley Upgrades, as outlined in the Budget Implications section of this report.

BACKGROUND

Metro Transit requires upgrades to its major facility, located at 200 Ilsley Avenue, Burnside Industrial Park. Metro Transit carries over 17 million transit passengers each year on more than 200 conventional buses, twenty paratransit vehicles, three community transit buses and three harbour ferries. The majority of the Metro Transit bus fleet operates and is maintained and managed from the facility at 200 Ilsley Avenue. The majority of bus operators are dispatched from 200 Ilsley which includes an operators lobby and washroom facilities to support this function. The operational centre and administration support for Metro Transit is also located at the facility.

The existing building is 25 years old and is in need of an upgrade in specific areas within the administration/control section of the building. The first phase of the intended renovations will incorporate approx. 1400 square feet of the building. The renovated space will include the Control Room and the surrounding offices.

Aa part of the HRM initiative to introduce a new CAD/AVL system based on GPS technology, Metro Transit is replacing it's current Automated Vehicle Tracking and Service Management system with the new technology. The existing system is at the end of it's life cycle and the new CAD/AVL will allow for the application of current technology and new features that will enhance Metro Transit's ability to provide effective and efficient transit service. It is a vital component of the transit operation and management of the on-street service.

The new system will also provide an opportunity for the introduction of an enhanced Interactive Voice Response system for callers making inquires in regards to bus departures and new options that include "pre-packaged" information on fare structure, "park and ride" locations etc.

A new World Wide Web interface will be introduced to allow the public to access information for their home or office computer systems. A "trip planning" feature will also be available that will allow patrons to receive information on how to complete a trip on our public transit system.

In addition to the conventional transit fleet movements, it will be possible to track the movements of our Access-A-Bus vehicles, supervisory vehicles and service vehicles. This is very significant from both the operations and customer service enhancement perspective

In preparation for the arrival of the new CAD/AVL system, Metro Transit must renovate it's existing Control Centre to accept the new technology and required hardware. This tender deals with this renovation.
