SUBJECT: Proposed By-Law A-301, An Amendment to By-Law A-300,

Respecting Animals and Responsible Pet Ownership

SUPPLEMENTARY REPORT

ORIGIN

As a result of a motion of Regional Council on December 11, 2007, Council requested staff amend clause 6(3)(a) of By-Law A-300, Respecting Animals and Responsible Pet Ownership.

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that Regional Council:

1. Give first reading to By-Law A-301 (attached as Appendix A), and set a public hearing date to adopt the By-Law.

BACKGROUND

Regional Council approved By-Law A-300, Respecting Animals and Responsible Pet Ownership on October 23, 2007 to come into effect April 1, 2008.

At the December 11, 2007 Regional Council meeting, Council requested clause 6(3)(a) of Bylaw A-300, Respecting Animals and Responsible Pet Ownership be amended:

1. Clause 6 (3) (a) of By-Law A-301, Respecting Animals and Responsible Pet Ownership currently reads as follows:

No owner of a cat shall:

(a) cause or permit a cat at any time to run at large,

DISCUSSION

It is proposed that s.6(3)(a) would read:

- 6(3) No owner of a cat shall
 - (a) cause or permit a cat to run at large, except
 - (i) A spayed or neutered cat may run at large on public property; and
 - (ii) The burden of proof that a cat has been spayed or neutered lies upon the owner of the cat;
