RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that Regional Council award:

- 1. Award Tender No. 07-432 for a design/build wooden dome structure for 1 Mann Street, Bedford, NS, to Storage Systems Construction Corp for a Total Tender price of \$109,634.74 (net HST included) with funding from Capital Account Nos. CB300840 HRM Depot Upgrades, Res# 1061.18 and 1061.28.
- 2. Increase Capital Account CB300840 Reservation HRM Depot Upgrades by \$43,419.70 to reflect cost sharing for this project from the HRWC as per the Budget Implications section of this report.

BACKGROUND

The old wooden structure (Salt Dome) at Mann Street was scheduled to be repaired in 2006. Early in 2007, HRM called in a Structural Engineer to assess the extent of repairs needed to bring the dome back to an acceptable level for both safety and functionality. Although HRM received a estimate of \$65,000.00 to make repairs, the Structural Engineer said it was not worth saving and, though it was still standing, it was becoming a safety concern.

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The old dome was demolished in January 2007. In February 2007, HRM requested and received an estimate of \$100,274.42 (net HST included) to replace the dome. In November 2007, a tender was called for the supply and installation of one Maintenance Dome for the Mann Street depot. The tender called for two prices: winter 2007/08 construction and spring 2008 construction.

After review of the tender price and consultation with the end user, it was decided to proceed with construction in the spring of 2008 for a lower price of \$109,634.74 (net HST included); a savings of \$4,000 over the price of winter construction. The 2007/08 HRM Capital Budget included some funding for this project, a notional allocation of \$80,000 within the HRM Depot Upgrades bundled capital account CBR00840. There is currently a balance of \$66,215.04 remaining in this capital account. The inclusion of this project in the Depot Upgrades capital plan for 2007/08 was premised upon the fact this would be a municipal asset being used for municipal purposes. The dome structure was intended to be used by TUGS as a maintenance depot for large pumps and related equipment. Subsequently, the transfer of waste water services delivery to the Halifax Regional Water Commission was approved by Council, effective August 1, 2007. Clause 19 of the Transfer Agreement approved by Council, essentially states that HRWC shall have the benefit of any existing funding commitments.

DISCUSSION

Tenders were publicly advertised on November 17th and 21st and closed on December 4, 2007. A tender bid was received from the following company:

Note: Two (2) additional local construction companies attended the "manadatory" site meeting on November 7, 2007 but did not submit a bid.

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BUDGET IMPLICATIONS

Based on the lowest tendered price of \$109,634.74 (net HST included), funding is available in the Approved Capital budget from Capital Account Nos. CB300840 - HRM Depot Upgrades.
