A motion approved by the Transportation Standing Committee at a meeting held on Thursday, May 23, 2013.

LEGISLATIVE AUTHORITY

The Terms of Reference for the Transportation Standing Committee include the following:

- 3.3.2 Review and oversight of specific strategic planning directions related to Transit Services coming from the Regional Plan; including but not exclusive to the Five year strategic plan; Accessibility Plan; Ferry Plan etc.

RECOMMENDATION

- 1. Request an update on amendments to By-Law S-800 and report back to the Transportation Standing Committee on the status of the amendments;
- 2. Request staff to perform a cross-jurisdictional review to examine best practices around ensuring accessibility where permanent encroachments have been permitted and report back to the Transportation Standing Committee;
- 3. Request that any future applications for permanent encroachments on sidewalks be brought for review by the Accessibility Advisory Committee, and that the Committee's feedback be incorporated as a part of the staff report.

At its May 23, 2013 meeting, the Transportation Standing Committee received a committee report detailing a motion approved at the April 15, 2013 meeting of the Accessibility Advisory Committee.

LEGISLATIVE AUTHORITY

Halifax Regional Municipality Charter, s. 21 "The Council may establish standing, special and advisory committees."

HRM By-laws relating to encroachments, sidewalk cafés & sandwich board signs:

- E-200 Encroachments By-law
- S-300 Streets By-law
- S-800 Temporary Signs By-law

RECOMMENDATION

The Accessibility Advisory Committee requests that the Transportation Standing Committee:

- 1. Request an update on amendments to By-Law S-800 and report back to the Committee on the status of the amendments.
- 2. Request staff to perform a cross-jurisdictional review to examine best practices around ensuring accessibility where permanent encroachments have been permitted and report back to the Committee.
- 3. Request that any future applications for permanent encroachments on sidewalks be brought for review by the Accessibility Advisory Committee, and that the Committee's feedback be incorporated as a part of the staff report.

Transportation Standing Committee Report

BACKGROUND / DISCUSSION

On January 15, 2013 an application for a permanent encroachment was brought before Regional Council. A discussion was held by members of Council at that time on the overall issue of sidewalk encroachment regulations and guidelines.

At the January 21, 2013 meeting of the Accessibility Advisory Committee, a motion was approved to request a staff presentation on the status of sidewalk standards and implications for accessibility for HRM residents.

HRM Right-of-Way Services staff presented to the Committee on April 15, 2013 on the topic of encroachments and sidewalk cafés. Staff and the Committee discussed HRM's sidewalk guidelines and rules around sandwich board signs. It should be noted that a Sidewalk Café Bylaw is currently being drafted.

The three requests outlined in the recommendation section of this report were made following the presentation and discussion at the April 15th meeting.

FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

None identified with this report.

COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

Accessibility Advisory Committee membership is currently comprised of nine citizen members and two members of Regional Council, with staff liaison members. Meetings are held monthly and are open to the public. Minutes, agendas, reports and other information on the AAC are posted on the HRM website.
