Approved Green Municipal Fund Project 2013/14, Supplemental Report page A26.

LEGISLATIVE AUTHORITY

Halifax Regional Municipality Council approved, December 11, 2012, that all budget increases are to be presented to the Audit and Finance Standing Committee, prior to submission to Council.

Halifax Charter, section 93(1) - The Council shall make estimates of the sums that are required by the Municipality for the fiscal year; Halifax Charter, section 79(1) - Specifies areas that the Council may expend money required by the Municipality; Halifax Charter, section 35(2)(d)(i) - The CAO can only authorize budgeted expenditures within the amount determined by Council by policy; Halifax Charter, section 120(6) - The Municipality may maintain other reserve funds for such purposes as the Council may determine; Halifax Regional Municipality policy on Changes to Cost Sharing for Capital Projects - Changes requiring Council approval; and the Halifax Regional Municipality Reserve Policy - No reserve funds will be expended without the CAO's recommendation and Council approval.

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that Audit & Finance Standing Committee:

- Recommend that Regional Council approve an increase to Project No. CB000002 Major Facilities Upgrades, by \$87,500.00 (HST fully rebated), with funding from the Sustainable Communities Reserve, Q127; and
- Recommend that Regional Council approve Award of Quotation No. 13M145, Canada Games Centre Solar Heating System, for a total tender price of \$87,500.00 (HST fully rebated), with funding from Project No. CB000002 - Major Facilities Upgrades, as outlined in the Financial Implications section of this report.

BACKGROUND

The Canada Games Centre solar system won the CanSIA Solar Thermal Project of the Year in 2011. The 200-collector Solar Water Heating System currently preheats the domestic hot water load of the building through a 23,176L domestic hot water tank. The existing solar system is performing better than expected and generating more heat than can be used only for domestic hot water. The purpose of the modification project is to make more use of solar heat to the benefit of the pool heating loop.

This purchase was approved by the Green Municipal Fund in October 2012 and included in the Operating Budget D948, Sustainable Community Projects, for 2013/14. Upon close of the solicitation, it was judged by Finance that the procurement should be classified as a capital purchase and not an operating purchase. This requires net zero impact increase to the Project and Regional Council's approval.

DISCUSSION

By installing new controls and a new heat exchanger, the excess solar energy can be diverted to maintain the heating loop temperatures, displacing heat from the natural gas boilers once the load is met within the domestic hot water tank. This modification will make better use of the heat from the solar array and will extend the life of the system by cutting down on problems that can arise from overheating. There will also be further savings through connecting to the pool heating loop from the offset of Natural Gas. An incremental savings of \$7,000-\$10,000 per year could be expected from the modifications, which will yield a simple payback of 8-10 years.
