SUBJECT: Parks and Recreation Strategic Policy Framework

ORIGIN

A motion of the Community Planning and Economic Development Committee from its meeting on January 8, 2015.

LEGISLATIVE AUTHORITY

Motion for the Committee to Consider:

Reason:		
<p>Halifax's Recreation's strategic direction is currently provided by the Recreation Blueprint approved by Council in 2003. After a decade the Blueprint no longer adequately aligns with Council priorities and the corporate vision for HRM.</p> <p>There are many synergies created by reconstituting the Parks and Recreation department, and a strategic plan would allow for the integration of the vision, mission and goals for both Parks and Recreation. Questions involving mandate, affordability, programming and goals would be addressed.</p>		
Outcome Sought:		
<p>A staff report outlining a process that if approved by Council would result in a clear vision, mission and set of measurable, achievable goals for Park and Recreation.</p>
