SUBJECT: Case CA0104: Street Naming from November 1 to December 31, 2015

ORIGIN

Street naming requests submitted through corrections projects and new development permits from November 1, 2015 to December 31, 2015.

LEGISLATIVE AUTHORITY

Halifax Regional Municipality Charter, s.323 "The Council may... (c): by policy, name or rename any street or private road;"

By-law C-300, Respecting Civic Addressing

Administrative Order #29, Respecting HRM Civic Addressing Policies

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that Halifax Regional Council adopt the proposed amendments to Administrative Order 29 Respecting HRM Civic Addressing Policies as set out in Attachment A of this report in order to approve the naming of four private lanes, four public streets and the renaming of two public streets as identified in Attachment B and Maps 1-10 inclusive.

BACKGROUND

Halifax Regional Municipality's Charter allows for Regional Council to name and rename any street or private road by policy. As per the staff report of November 24, 2015, Regional Council officially approves all new street names for public roads and private lanes.

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Civic Addressing Policy and By-Law

The Civic Addressing By-Law (C-300) requires that all names must be approved in accordance with the Civic Addressing Policy. Schedule A of the Policy contains the guidelines that must be followed for all new street or lane names (see Attachment C). Names are required for those streets or lanes which are submitted through:

- a) the subdivision process for new public street and new private lane and;
- b) the application process for existing un-named private lanes.

The Civic Addressing By-law defines a private lane as any street, road or travel way which serves three or more structures or facilities and is not owned by Halifax Regional Municipality or the Province of Nova Scotia. Therefore, all private lanes providing access to three or more structures or facilities must be named.

DISCUSSION

All of the street names listed above have been reviewed using HRM's Civic Addressing Policies and Bylaw and it has been determined that all of the proposed names are consistent with the Policies and Bylaw. Attachment B provides a more detailed discussion on each recommendation, including an evaluation of the names in relation to the Policies and By-law. Therefore, it is recommended that all names, as contained in Attachment A, be approved.

FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

The costs associated with the administration of the HRM's Civic Addressing By-law and Administrative Order can be accommodated within the existing 2015-2016 operating budget for C330-Civic Addressing. A total of three new private lane signs and eight public road signs are required at an estimated total cost of \$1,335.

COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

The community engagement process is consistent with the intent of the HRM Community Engagement Strategy. The level of community engagement was notification and/or consultation with affected property owners in accordance with the HRM Civic Addressing By-law [Section 4(2)]. As per the standard consultation process all relevant property owners and tenants were notified and/or consulted by letter.

ENVIRONMENTAL IMPLICATIONS

No environmental implications were identified.

ALTERNATIVE

Regional Council may choose not to approve some or all of the street namings and renamings as contained in Attachment A. This alternative is not recommended as some of these street names are currently in use and they meet the street naming criteria set out in HRM's Civic Addressing Policies (Administrative Order 29).




Map 1 - Billard Lane, Williamswood



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






New Public Street



Attachment B: Project Details of Proposed Street Naming

1. Private Lane Names:

a) Billard Lane, Williamswood

Reason for the naming:

This private lane was identified by HRM Fire Staff and provides access to to three residences; 3345, 3349, and 3355 Old Sambro Road, Williamswood (Map 1).

Civic Addressing By-law/Policy:

As per section 3(h) of the Civic Addressing By-law a private road means any street, road or travel way which serves three or more structures or facilities and is not owned by HRM or the Province of Nova Scotia. As each of the three residences share the driveway it requires a name.

HRM Civic Addressing
Public Safety
Committee:

The Committee does not provide recommendations on private lane namings.

<u>Proposed Name:</u> Billard Lane- The property owners suggested this name after one of the

family's last names. This name meets the street naming criteria laid out in the

Policies.

Recommendation: In accordance with the By-law and Policies, civic addressing staff

recommends that the un-named lane way to these lots, as shown on Map 1, be named Billard Lane, Williamswood. As this private lane naming is a correction to existing addresses, the Municipality will cover the installation cost

of the private lane sign.

b) Frog Lake Lane, East Preston

Reason for the naming:

This private lane was identified through the East Preston Corrections Project and provides access to three residences; 114, 120, and 122 Lower Partridge River Road, East Preston (Map 2).

Civic Addressing
By-law/Policy:

As per section 3(h) of the Civic Addressing By-law a private road means any street, road or travel way which serves three or more structures or facilities and is not owned by HRM or the Province of Nova Scotia. As each of the three residences share the driveway it requires a name.

Committee:

The Committee does not provide recommendations on private lane namings.

Proposed Name:

Frog Lake Lane- This name was suggested as the water body named Frog Lake is directly to the east. This name meets the street naming criteria laid out in the Policies.

Recommendation: In accordance with the By-law and Policies, civic addressing staff

recommends that the un-named lane way to these structures, as shown on Map 2, be named Frog Lake Lane. As this private lane naming is a correction to existing addresses, the Municipality will cover the installation cost of the

private lane sign.

c) Jeremiah Lane, East Preston

Reason for the naming:

This private lane was identified through the East Preston Corrections Project and provides access to three residences; 131, 141, and 145 Brian Street, East

Preston (Map 3).

Civic Addressing By-law/Policy:

As per section 3(h) of the Civic Addressing By-law a private road means any street, road or travel way which serves three or more structures or facilities and is not owned by HRM or the Province of Nova Scotia. As each of the three residences share the driveway it requires a name.

The Committee does not provide recommendations on private lane namings.

Proposed Name:

Committee:

Jeremiah Lane- The property owners submitted the name Jeremiah for the lane name. This name meets the street naming criteria laid out in the Policies.

Recommendation:

In accordance with the By-law and Policies, civic addressing staff recommends that the un-named lane way to these residences, as shown on Map 4, be named Jeremiah Lane. As this private lane naming is a correction to existing addresses, the Municipality will cover the installation cost of the private lane sign.

d) Western Parkway, Bedford

Reason for the naming:

This private lane was originally a driveway, providing access to 50 Innovation Drive, Bedford (Map 4). The recent approval of building permits for new office buildings has created three structures sharing this driveway.

Civic Addressing By-law/Policy:

As per section 3(h) of the Civic Addressing By-law a private road means any street, road or travel way which serves three or more structures or facilities and is not owned by HRM or the Province of Nova Scotia. As each of the three structures will share the driveway it requires a name.

The Committee does not provide recommendations on private lane namings.

Proposed Name:

Western Parkway- The property owner submitted the name Western for the lane name. This name meets the street naming criteria laid out in the Policies.

Recommendation:

In accordance with the By-law and Policies, civic addressing staff recommends that the un-named lane way to these structures, as shown on Map 5, be named Western Parkway. As this is a private lane the developer is responsible for the cost of installation the private street sign.

2. Public Street Names:

a) Edgett Drive, Lucasville

Reason for the naming:

This public street was created through subdivision #18201 (Map 5).

Proposed Name: Edgett Drive, Lucasville- The property owner submitted the name Edgett for

the street name. This name meets the street naming criteria laid out in the

recommends that the new public street, as shown on Map 6, be named Edgett

Drive, Lucasville.

b) Great Beech Hill, Lower Sackville

Reason for the naming:

This public street was identified as an unnamed loop off the Cobequid Road,

Lower Sackville (Map 6).

Halifax Regional Municipality's Charter allows for Regional Council to name and rename any street or private road in accordance with the Civic Addressing

<u>Proposed Name:</u> Great Beech Hill – This name was approved as a commemorative name by

Regional Council at their July 23, 2013 meeting. This name meets the street

Recommendation: In accordance with the By-law and Policies, civic addressing staff

recommends that the public street, as shown on Map 7, be named Great

Beech Hill, Lower Sackville.

c) Old Preston Road, East Preston

Reason for the naming:

This public street was identified through the East Preston Corrections Project as an unnamed loop off Highway 7, East Preston (Map 7).

Halifax Regional Municipality's Charter allows for Regional Council to name and rename any street or private road in accordance with the Civic Addressing Policies as submitted through:

a) the subdivision process for new public streets and new private roads

Proposed Name: Old Preston Road, East Preston- This name was approved as a

commemorative name by Regional Council at their December 8, 2015 meeting. This name meets the street naming criteria laid out in the Policies.

Recommendation: In accordance with the By-law and Policies, civic addressing staff

recommends that the public street, as shown on Map 8, be named Old

Preston Road, East Preston.

d) Singer Drive, Lucasville

Reason for the naming:

This public street was created through subdivision #18201 (Map 8).

Civic Addressing By-law/Policy:

Halifax Regional Municipality's Charter allows for Regional Council to name and rename any street or private road in accordance with the Civic Addressing Policies as submitted through:

a) the subdivision process for new public streets and new private roads

Singer Drive, Lucasville- The property owner submitted the name Singer for the street name. This name meets the street naming criteria laid out in the Policies.

Recommendation:

In accordance with the By-law and Policies, civic addressing staff recommends that the new public street, as shown on Map 9, be named Singer Drive, Lucasville.

3. Public Street Renamings:

a) Cathedral Lane, Halifax

Reason for the renaming:

Civic Addressing received a request from the property owners on Martello Street, Halifax requesting a street name change.

Civic Addressing
By-law/Policy:

Halifax Regional Municipality's Charter allows for Regional Council to name and rename any street or private road in accordance with the Civic Addressing Policies:

Policy 4: Where there is no public safety issue involved, an owner may request a public street or private road name change but shall be

charged a fee in accordance with Administrative Order #15.

Policy 5: When considering renaming a public street or private road in accordance with Administrative Order #15, a poll of property owners shall be conducted by the Civic Addressing Coordinator and the Coordinator shall only proceed with the application if

there is unanimous support for the proposed change.

The Committee does not provide recommendations on street renaming requests that are not public safety issues.

<u>Proposed Name:</u> Cathedral Lane, Halifax- The property owner submitted the name Cathedral

for the street name. This name meets the street naming criteria laid out in the Policies. The Civic Addressing Coordinator received unanimous support for

the proposed change.

Recommendation: In accordance with the By-law and Policies, civic addressing staff

recommends that Martello Street, as shown on Map 9 be renamed Cathedral

Lane, Halifax.

b) Crane Lane, East Preston

Reason for the renaming:

Current street name Crane Hill Road, East Preston is a duplicate with an unconnected road called Cranehill Road, Westphal and East Preston (Map 10).

Civic Addressing By-law/Policy:

Halifax Regional Municipality's Charter allows for Regional Council to name and rename any street or private road in accordance with the Civic Addressing Policies as submitted through:

Policy A1: No name shall be duplicated including similar names that are differentiated by street type.

HRM Civic Addressing

Public Safety Committee:

The Committee confirmed that Cranehill Road and Crane Hill Road were duplicate street names that required a corrections exercise.

<u>Proposed Name:</u> Crane Lane- The property owners submitted the name Crane for the street

name. This name meets the street naming criteria laid out in the Policies.

Recommendation: In accordance with the By-law and Policies, civic addressing staff

recommends that Crane Hill Road, East Preston, as shown on Map 11, be

renamed Crane Lane.

Schedule A Street Naming Guidelines

General Principles

<u>Uniqueness</u> - there should be no duplication of names.

<u>Distinctiveness</u> - names that sound very similar should be avoided in order to avoid diction problems when people are making emergency calls under stress <u>Continuity</u> - a road running in one direction should have one name only and should have

the same name throughout its entire length.

Guidelines

Street Name Characteristics

- A1. No name shall be duplicated including similar names that are differentiated by street type.
- A2. No name shall sound like an existing name.
- A3. No name shall contain numbers, special characters, decimals, hyphens, apostrophes, periods, or punctuation of any kind.
- A4. No double barreled names shall be permitted except for HRM place names listed in the Nova Scotia Gazetteer or approved heritage names.
- A5. No streets names shall incorporate product, trademark or copyright names.
- A6. No name of more than 10 characters in length shall be permitted where the street type is more than 2 characters in length and no name of more than 11 characters in length shall be permitted where the street type is 2 characters in length except for HRM place names listed in the Nova Scotia Gazetteer or approved heritage names.

Street Network Considerations

- A8. Continuous streets shall have one name throughout their entire length.
- A9. No street name shall be continued through a right angle turn.
- A10. A continuous street intersecting the same collector road more than twice shall be given a different name.

- A11. The same name shall not be used at both ends of a loop road if the middle portion of the road has not been taken over by the Municipality.
- A12. A cul-de-sac shall have a different street name from its cross road.

Water Access

A13. Where access to a property is by water only, the street name shall be deemed to be the name of the island or waterbody as listed in the Nova Scotia Gazetteer.

Heritage Names

- A14. The use of heritage names shall be encouraged.
- A15. All street names for the community of Bedford (Municipal District 21) shall conform with the former Town of Bedford Street Naming Policy (1987)¹.

Theme Names

A16. Where street names in a neighbourhood are based on a specific theme, the name of all new street within the neighbourhood shall be consistent with the theme.
