MOVED by Councillor Kent, seconded by Councillor McCluskey, that Council direct staff to create a strategy to facilitate the one-time clean-up of debris and garbage from McNabs Island through possible partnerships with other levels of government.

Councillor Kent stated the amount of debris on the island can no longer be ignored. She advised she was asking Council to request that staff co-ordinate its removal from the island by taking the next step and create a partnership with other stakeholders and levels of government.

Councillor Hendsbee suggested staff also contact private organizations/groups to assist with

the clean up.

Councillor McInroy speaking against the motion noted there are many areas within the municipality that needs to be cleaned up.

Councillor Streatch noted that the island has been a provincial park for twenty four years and question of what has been done in that twenty four years needs to be addressed in the report.

Councillor Kent noted there has not been an opportunity to dispose of this debris noting the debris is being cleaned up and stockpiled by the property owners and now needs a means of disposal. She further noted the island is visited annually and expressed concern with the fact that this debris may pose a safety hazard.
