

Your Worship and Council Members:

Further to my letter of 13 September 2005, concerning the Remembrance Day ceremonies ceremonial fly-past, there is a subsequent requirement. All elements of the ceremony remain the same with the exception of the altitude of the fly-past aircraft. Canadian Forces Air Division Headquarters have requested an altitude of 500 feet above the highest obstacle within the flight path of the Sea King helicopter.

In this respect, it is requested that the Mayor and Council grant the Canadian Forces permission to do a symbolic fly-past over Grand Parade (flying from North to South) so as to honour our veterans in attendance. This fly-past would occur at 1102 hours at an altitude of 500 feet above the highest obstacle within the flight path following the two minutes of silence.
