BACKGROUND

National Public Works Week (NPWW) is a celebration of the tens of thousands of men and women in North America who provide and maintain the infrastructure and services collectively known as public works.

Instituted as a public education campaign by the American Public Works Association (APWA) in 1960, NPWW calls attention to the importance of public works in community life. The Week seeks to enhance the prestige of the often unsung heroes of our society - the professionals who serve the public good every day with quiet dedication.

DISCUSSION

This year, the North American theme of National Public Works Week is, “Public Works - The Heart of Every Community” and is designed to raise the public’s awareness of public works issues and to increase confidence in public works employees who are dedicated to improving the quality of life for present and future generations.

The kick-off event will take place on the Waterfront at Sackville Landing on Thursday, May 25, 2006 (Rain Date: Friday, May 26, 2006). Millions of dollars worth of municipal service equipment will be on display, as part of HRM's celebration of National Public Works Week. Transportation & Public Works Services representatives will be on hand to demonstrate the equipment (i.e. street sweepers, sewer pumpers, backhoes, dump and plow trucks, etc.) and to explain how the many municipal services are delivered to the public.

Crews will begin moving the heavy equipment and displays into place early Thursday morning and the public is invited to drop by and visit from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. Children, accompanied by parents, and school groups are welcome.

A number of internal staff events will take place during the week of May 21 -27th. These include barbeques, prize draws, and other activities.

BUDGET IMPLICATIONS

Programs and activities around National Public Works Week cost approximately \$2,500.00. However, this cost is covered each year within the Transportation & Public Works Services operating budget.


