#### **ORIGIN**

Approved Capital Budget Program for 2003/2004, Transit Services Fleet - Conventional Transit Bus Expansion and Conventional Transit Bus Replacement

# **RECOMMENDATION**

It is recommended that RFP 03-012, a three year purchase agreement for the supply of Forty Foot Transit Buses be awarded to the highest ranking proposal, New Flyer Industries for a cost of \$21,763,112.00 plus Net HST and an allowance of 5% for a total cost of \$24,279,921.93 with funding authorized as per the Budget Implications section of this report. The award for budget year 2004/2005 and 2005/2006 is contingent on Council approving funds through the Capital budget process for these years.

# **BACKGROUND**

The Halifax Regional Municipality will be using these buses to transport passengers throughout the service area of Metro Transit. The regular replacement of these vehicles helps reduce operating costs and enables Metro Transit to offer clients new bus configurations that answer the changing needs of our passengers.

The Low Floor Transit Buses now under consideration are an example of this as they are designed to allow easier access to the bus and to ease the burden on passengers with mobility limitations or that travel in wheelchairs.

The buses being replaced are either over 20 years old or the repairs necessary to continue service are far too great to be economical to HRM.

# **DISCUSSION**

A Request for Proposal was issued for the supply of up to fifty-eight (58) Forty Foot Transit Buses over three (3) years to operate over routes in the HRM, Transit Division service and surrounding area. Of the 58 units 33 will be assigned as replacements and 25 will be additions to the fleet. These expansion buses will be assigned to accommodate the expansion of Transit Services Routes outlined in the Transit Service Plan. The Request for Proposal was advertised on March 29, 2003 and closed on June 13, 2003.

The following firms submitted proposals:

- New Flyer Industries
- Nova Bus
- Orion Bus Industries

An evaluation team consisting of staff of Fleet Services, Transit Services and Procurement evaluated the proposal on the following basis:

- Financial
- Technical
- Vendor Support

The final scoring for each firm is as follows:

Company	Scoring (max. 100)
New Flyer Industries	97.75
Nova Bus	83.5
Orion Bus Industries	80.15

Attachment "A" provides the detailed breakdown of the total scoring and fees.

The review of the proposals identified that New Flyer Industries provides the best overall proposal including the lowest costs and shortest delivery time to the Halifax Regional Municipality and it is therefore recommended that they be awarded the contract.

This company provided HRM with the most recent purchases of 40 foot Transit Buses. HRM is satisfied with the performance of these buses.

Delivery for these new buses is expected to take 41 weeks.

# **BUDGET IMPLICATIONS**

This award covers budget years 2003/2004, \*2004/2005 and \*2005/2006.

Funds in the amount of \$4,400,820.00 plus an allowance of 5 % and Net H.S.T. for a total of \$4,917,936.15 are available for the first 12 vehicles. An allowance is required for any changes that must take place during final assembly of the vehicles either to comply with the most recent requirements of URB regulations or to comply with changes in Transit Operation requirements.

The award for budget year 2004/2005 and 2005/2006 is contingent on Council approving funds through the Capital budget process for these years.
