

### **Halifax Charter**

Enabling powers of the Municipality to govern

#### May 2014 amendments:

- Enable Plans to regulate development near airports with a Noise Exposure Forecast in excess of 30 (NEF 30)
- Section 229(1)(p) Policy
- Section 235(5)(q) Regulation

# HIA & Aerotech Business Park Policy EC-11

HRM shall consider amendments to the Land Use By-law to regulate future residential developments in the vicinity of the HSIA which would be incompatible by virtue of noise

### **HSIA Master Plan**

- Enhance the potential and current land use and infrastructure to 2030
- Define probable growth of aviation activity in the region
- Identify adequate space for development
- Domestic & international airside operations
- Ground transportation plan
- Passenger terminal and concessions
- Ancillary support services (cargo, fuel, maintenance)
- Airport land use plan



### **Transport Canada & Airport Noise**

- Principal noise reduction strategies:
  - reducing the noise at the source
  - managing operational procedures
  - managing land-use in the vicinity of airports.
- International Civil Aviation Organization (ICAO)



### **Noise Exposure Forecast**

- Transport Canada system
- Measurement of actual and forecasted aircraft noise in the vicinity of airports
- Factors in the subjective reactions of the human ear to specific aircraft noise stimulus:
  - loudness
  - frequency
  - duration
  - time of occurrence
  - tone



### Noise Exposure Forecasting

#### **Noise Contour Calculation Variables:**


- Traffic volume
- Aircraft type
- Mixed-use
- Based on 5-10 years in future
- Current runway geometry
- Future runways if within forecast period



### **Noise Exposure Forecast**

•	Response Area	Response Prediction
1	(over 40 NEF)	Repeated and vigorous individual complaints are likely. Concerted group and legal action might be expected.
2	(35-40 NEF)	Individual complaints may be vigorous. Possible group action and appeals to authorities.
3	(30-35 NEF)	Sporadic to repeated complaints. Group action is possible.
4	(below 30 NEF)	Sporadic complaints may occur. Noise may interfere occasionally with certain activities of the resident.

### Regional Plan Designations

#### **Open Space & Natural Resource**

prohibits large scale residential development

#### **Rural Commuter**

small scale residential development on existing roads



### **Proposed Amendments**

#### **Purpose**

To prohibit future noise-sensitive development within the NEF 30 Contour including:

- Large-scale residential subdivisions
- Nursing Homes
- Residential Care Facilities
- Mobile Dwellings



### **Proposed Amendments**

#### Municipal Planning Strategy: Planning Districts 14 & 17

- Establish Noise Exposure Forecast policy
- NEF 30 Contour Map (Transportation Map Update)

#### Land Use By-law: Planning Districts 14 & 17

- Prohibit noise sensitive developments in residential zones (nursing homes, residential care facilities & mobile dwellings)
- 300 ft. frontage minimum for new residential lots
- Zoning map (Rezone provincial lands to Park)

#### **Regional Subdivision By-law**

No new public roads



### **Existing Land Use By-law**

- Seven Residential Zones
- Nursing homes and residential care facilities permitted uses in five zones
- Mobile dwellings permitted uses in two zones
- Min. frontages of 100 ft. & 200 ft.

### Summary

- Formalizing Noise Exposure Forecast in Community Plan
- Existing residential not affected
- Limited future subdivision enabled
- Future large scale residential development prohibited
