ORIGIN

BACKGROUND

The North West Transit Advisory Committee was requested to review and provide comment on the concerns raised by Mr. Singh in regard to the lack of Metro Transit service along the Old Sackville Road, Sackville.

DISCUSSION

The North West Transit Advisory Committee considered the request for transit service along the Old Sackville Road or extension of service from existing routes. Although the North West Transit Advisory Committee supports the request, they concur with Metro Transit that due to other priorities, this matter would not be recommended for consideration at this time. The Committee encourages Metro Transit to consider the request during all future budget discussions.

At this time Metro Transit does not have any immediate plans to implement service on Old Sackville Rd. At present there has been very little to no demand for transit service along Old Sackville Rd. However, transit has been reviewing the idea of extending with an existing route to Old Sackville Dr. and to the Sackville Terminal such as route 89 or route 66.

These proposed changes are pending budget approval and council direction. With limited budgets and competing demands for public funds, all service adjustments and increases must be prioritized based on ridership demands and service standards. Metro Transit's priority is to address passenger capacity, frequency issues and service standards all of which are pending budget approval.

Thank you for your suggestion. Metro Transit continuously reviews all service suggestions for future consideration.

Dear Councillor, Harvey,

We do not have any Metro Transit Bus Service on the old Sackville. I live at (off of Hallmark Ave). It takes 18.5 minutes to walk to the nearest bus stop on Sackville Dr / Sackville Cross Rd (in front of the Swiss Chalet). It takes 24 minutes to walk to bus stop by Cobequid Rd / Sackville Dr (across from Petro Canada). It takes 25 minutes to walk to the bus terminal on Walker Ave (by the RCMP office on Old Sackville Rd). It takes me 30 minutes to drive to work in downtown Halifax. I use to take the Metro link from the Walker Ave bus terminal. I've stopped taking the Metro Link because of lack of parking spaces and vandalism when I parked on the street.

With all of the future initiative and talks of increased service levels by Metro Transit, I would like to request bus service on the Old Sackville Rd with at least 30 minutes of service during peaks hours. I've spoken to several people in our subdivision and they agree that there should be bus service on the Old Sackville Rd.
