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Further to the inquiry regarding the possibility of installing a small playground at the park on Legacy Court in Sackville, Facility Development – Parks provides the following proposal.

The attached site plan and perspective views show a possible piece of equipment that could be installed in the park.

There are currently no funds identified to proceed with this proposal but the estimated value is approximately \$20,000 to cover equipment costs installation and related landscape reinstatement.

If funding becomes available the project would need to be tendered and would take approximately six to eight weeks for delivery.

**General Notes:**

Age Group

18 m-5 yrs  5-12 years  18 m-12 yrs

1. No-encroachment zone- that additional area adjacent to the protective surfacing zone intended to allow pedestrian traffic near the play equipment in use while minimizing the risk of injury to pedestrians. CSA-2614
2. Although a particular playground design may not meet the proposed Access Board Regulations in regards to the appropriate number of ground level events, the actual playground may be in compliance when considering existing play components.
3. All deck heights are measured from top of ground cover.
4. Fall absorbing ground cover is required under and around all play equipment.
5. The minimum recommended set zone around the entire playstructure is shown. This zone is to be free of all tripping or collision hazards (i.e. roots, rocks, border material, etc.).
6. All post lengths are identified by text showing the post lengths, i.e. 96 represents a 96 inch post.
7. Not all equipment may be appropriate for all children. Supervision is required.



