WHAT IS THE REGIONAL CENTRE?

The Regional Centre is the urban core of the Halifax Regional Municipality. It includes the Halifax Peninsula and Dartmouth within the Circumferential Highway.



WHY IS A CENTRE PLAN NEEDED?

- » To update existing Secondary Municipal Planning Strategies (SMPS) and Land Use By-Laws (LUB)
- » Protect unique and stable neighbourhoods
- » Align HRM policies with the goals of the community and the Regional Plan
- » Eliminate confusion caused by a lack of policy standardization for residents and developers
- » Help determine where appropriate development should occur

THE CENTRE PLAN WILL:

- » Include an Urban Design Framework that protects the scale and character of existing neighbourhoods
- » Update and consolidate Secondary Municipal Planning Strategies
- » Remove barriers for well-designed and appropriately scaled development
- » Assist HRM staff in improving the Regional Centre through large and small scale planning and investment initiatives





LAND USE & DESIGN

The Centre Plan can help shape policy on:

- » Street and sidewalk design
- » Commercial streets and centres
- » Building sizes and locations
- » Places for mixed-use: homes, businesses and shops
- » Areas for growth
- » Areas to be protected
- » Waterfront planning
