

DARTMOUTH TOWN COUNCIL MINUTES

VOLUME 1935

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Dartmouth, N. S., January 7, 1935.

Town Council met this date at Eight P. M.

Present: Mayor Topple, Councillors Austin, Malouli, Pettipas, Otto, Isnor and Bell; also Town Solicitor Meseley.

Minutes of last meeting were read and approved.

A delegation was present at the meeting from the Super-Service Stations, Mr. Manning acting as chief spokesman, who on motion of Crs. Bell and Austin was granted a hearing. Mr. Manning stating that in connection with their application for a permit to erect a platform fronting on the side walk on Portland Street that he did not wish the ramp closed up as it might be injurious to business of the repair department. After some discussion the following resolution, moved and seconded by Crs. Bell and Otto, was unanimously adopted:

RESOLVED: that a building permit be granted the Super-Service Stations, Portland Street to erect a platform fronting on the sidewalk, providing a sign is placed at the ramp making it one way traffic, namely IN.

Report of Plumbing Inspector Forbes, as annexed, on the number of plumbing fixtures installed and inspected for the months of November and December, was on motion of Crs. Bell and Isnor received and filed.

LETTERS were read from Halifax Tourist Bureau stating that for the purpose of securing a share of the Tourist business for Halifax, they have undertaken to sponsor a Water Carnival and Deep Sea Fishing Rodeo to be staged at Halifax in 1935 and that plans are being carefully prepared for the working out by an efficient and energetic Committee and asking that the Town co-operate with them and give them their support by appointing a representative from the Town Council to act on the Committee. Letter received and on motion of Crs. Austin and Otto it was resolved that Councillor Bell be appointed from the Town Council.

Eastern Canada Savings & Loan Company In reference to the Town of Dartmouth Firemen's Fund stating that the investment of \$2500.00 will have accrued to a total of \$3,046.00 as at December 22, 1934, when the investment expires, and stating that they would be prepared to renew them for a further term at 4 1/2%, dating the new investment from December 22nd. Letter received and on motion of Crs. Otto and Bell it was resolved that the Clerk be instructed to renew them for a further period of five years.

S. H. Solomon stating that his property had been damaged by the last storm by the sewer backing water into his cellar causing damage to his oil burner, etc. Letter received, and on motion of Crs. Austin and Otto the Clerk was instructed to inform Mr. Solomon that the Town does not assume any responsibility in connection with the damage to his property which he claimed was occasioned by the last storm.

Halifax Chronicle stating that the Chronicle and Nova Scotian had been published for 110 years and the Weekly Chronicle which was owned at one time by Joseph Howe, was published as early as 1770 and that these newspapers were published continuously during the Reigns of Their Majesties, George III, George IV, William IV, Victoria, Edward VII and George V, and that they are very anxious to acknowledge this long period of continuous public service had been made possible through the co-operation and good-will of the industries and business enterprises of Nova Scotia. Letter received, and on motion of Crs. Austin and Bell was received and filed.

On motion of Crs. Bell and Isnor the following Resolutions were unanimously adopted: "That for the purpose of defraying the annual current expenditures of the Water Maintenance Account of the Town of Dartmouth which have been duly authorized by the Council, the Council do effect temporary loans from the Bank of Nova Scotia, the maximum amount of which outstanding at any one time to be limited to the sum of \$12,000, and that the Mayor and the Town Clerk be and they are hereby authorized to execute in the name and under the corporate seal of the Town of Dartmouth the agreement with the said Bank in relation to said loan which has been presented to this meeting and is hereby approved.

That for the purpose of defraying the annual current expenditure of the Municipal Corporation of the Town of Dartmouth which has been duly authorized by the Council, the Council do effect a temporary loan from the Royal Bank of Canada for the sum of \$70,000. (Seventy Thousand Dollars) and that the Mayor and the Town Clerk be and they are hereby authorized to execute in the name and under the corporate seal of the Corporation the agreement with the said Bank in relation to said loan which has been presented to this meeting and is hereby approved."

On motion of Crs. Isnor and Pettipas it was RESOLVED that the action of the Charities Committee in accepting the sum of \$100.00 from Mr. Peerless Levy in full settlement of the account of the Town of Dartmouth against Mr. Peerless on account of the treatment of the late Mrs. Mary Levy at the Victoria General Hospital be and the same is hereby confirmed.

Town Engineer Allan presented a set of plans at the meeting all turn-offs in the water system of the Town of Dartmouth. Mr. Topples expressed the Council's appreciation and asked Mr. Allan to so convey to Mr. Nicholls the appreciation of the Council.

Cr. Austin reported that he had an interview with Mrs. Sievert in connection with her letter objecting to payment of \$67.67 for sidewalk fronting on her property on Green St. and told her that the Town were unable to make any reduction in charge and that Mrs. Sievert was now satisfied to pay the amount.

Cr. Austin also stated that the report in reference to the enumeration of all the polls in the Town of Dartmouth would probably be dealt with at the next meeting of the Council.

Cr. Austin also brought up the matter of disposing of the two horses owned by the Town of Dartmouth, and on motion of Crs. Otto and Isnor it was RESOLVED that the Chairman of the Street Committee be empowered to dispose of the horses as he sees fit.



LETTERS WERE READ FROM:

A. T. Croft, Secretary of the Tourist Association in reference to tourist camp sites in the vicinity of the Town and asking that the Town provide land suitable for such purposes having in mind land near the North Star Club in the North end of Dartmouth. Letter received and on motion of Crs. Otto and Austin it was RESOLVED that we co-operate with the Tourist Committee by granting them the use of land owned by the Town of Dartmouth in the North end near the North Star Club for the use of tourists subject to the approval of the Town Engineer.

Mrs. Lillian Power from <sup>K</sup>entville Sanatorium stating that it was necessary to leave the Sanatorium for other treatment at Halifax and asking that the Town pay for same. Letter received and on motion of Crs. Austin and Bell matter was referred to Charities Committee with power to act.

McInnes, Lovett & MacDonald enclosing notice of action of Minnie M. Solomon for damages by water to her property on Pleasant Street. On motion of Crs. Pettipas and Otto it was RESOLVED that notice of action of Minnie Solomon be received and filed and that the Town contest the action and that the Town Solicitor be engaged to act on behalf of the Town together with such other counsel as the Mayor and Town Solicitor may desire to engage.

On motion of Crs. Bell and Otto it was RESOLVED that the Chairman of the Street Committee, together with the Town Solicitor and Town Engineer report on the price of land which will be necessary for the Town to purchase in order to widen Portland Street at the Canal Bridge.

On motion of Crs. Austin and Otto it was RESOLVED that the Fire Committee report at the next meeting on the bill of William Harrison of \$3.50 for repairs to pump on boiler.

Application of Clarence Misener for permit to erect dwelling on the East side of Summit Street owned by B. A. Johnson, recommended by the Town Engineer, was on motion of Ors. Pettipas and Austin approved.

Town Council met this date at 8 P. M.

Present: Mayor Topple, Councillors Austin, Malcolm, Pettipas, Otto, Isnor and Bell; also Town Solicitor Moseley.

Minutes of last two meetings were read and approved.

Plumbing Inspector's report for plumbing fixtures installed and inspected for the months of January and February, as annexed, was received and filed.

LETTERS WERE READ FROM:

Dartmouth Ferry Commission asking the Town Council to incorporate in their Bill of Legislation to be submitted at the present Session a Section repealing Section 4 of Chapter 77 of the Acts of 1918. Letter received and on motion of Crs. Pettipas and Bell was referred to Committee on Legislation.

A. T. Croft, Secretary Dartmouth and Eastern Halifax County Tourist Assc. soliciting the support of the Town Council financially and otherwise. Letter received and on motion of Crs. Pettipas and Austin it was RESOLVED that the Council seek Legislation naming them to make a grant up to \$300.00.

Dartmouth School Board -asking the Council to assess and collect for the sum of \$67,337 being the amount required by the Board for school purposes for the current year. Letter received and on motion of Crs. Pettipas and Bell was referred to Finance Committee.

Mr. L.E. Teasdale was present at the meeting and was given a hearing. He asked that when the matter of purchasing a truck came up that the General Motors Truck be given earnest consideration.

Petition read, signed by some twenty merchants of the Town, that legislation affecting early closing relative to grocery and meat shops be amended to read as follows:

"The Town Council shall have power to make and from time to time to alter, amend, repeal and re-enact a bye-law or bye-laws providing that any class or all classes of shops doing business in the Town shall on any day or on certain days be closed to customers during certain hours, excepting shops carrying on a retail business in which shop the personal property regardless of ownership is assessed at under Six Hundred Dollars; and such bye-laws upon approval by the Governor-in-council shall have the force of law."

After some discussion, on motion of Crs. Otto and Austin it was resolved that this matter be referred to the Solicitor to include in his draft of Legislation to be submitted to Council.

The Auditor's report for the year 1934 was on motion of Crs. Austin and Isnor tabled.

The Patriot Printing and Publishing Company tendered to supply 400 copies of the Town Annual report for the same price as last year, viz- \$2.35 per page, including the cost of publishing the financial statement in the Dartmouth Patriot.

On motion of Crs. Otto and Isnor it was RESOLVED that their tender be accepted.

Application of John C. Ritchie for Plumber's license, was on motion of Crs. Bell and Austin granted.

The Street Committee reported that they had received a communication from the Super Service Stations, Limited, and Capt. A. H. Young in reference to the land required from their properties for street widening purposes at the Canal Bridge. On motion of Crs. Austin and Bell it was RESOLVED that the Town of Dartmouth for Street widening purposes do purchase from Super Service Stations, Limited approximately 1900 sq. ft. of land at a cost of \$114.55 and do purchase from Capt. A. H. Young a strip of land in front of his property 162 Portland Street for the sum of \$27.07; further that the Street Committee be empowered to pay any further costs involved in transfer.

On motion of Crs. Bell and Otto it was RESOLVED that the Street Committee report to Council with recommendations as regards to appointment of Plumbing Inspector.

Mayor Topple reported that the Tourist Association had asked for the appointment of a Beautification Committee from the Town Council to co-operate with them, and on motion of Crs. Pettipas and Bell it was RESOLVED that Crs. Austin, Malcolm and Otto be appointed as such.

Cr. Austin reported that he thought it necessary in order to repair Jamieson Street that the Town would have to purchase some property along the Brook. After some discussion this matter was referred to the Chairman of the Street Committee and the Town Solicitor to look into.

On motion of Crs. Bell and Otto it was RESOLVED that changes be made in the Town Clerk's office as per plan of the Town Engineer; and the matter of an extra vault was deferred for the present.

Cr. Austin moved, seconded by Cr. Otto that this Council purchase a Reo Speed wagon #28 - 142" Wheelbase for the sum of \$1875. plus the sum of \$890. for the Wood body, total cost \$2765. all taxes included.

Cr. Malcolm moved an amendment, seconded by Cr. Pettipas that the Town of Dartmouth advertise publicly for the purchase of a truck as per specification to be furnished by the Town Engineer. The amendment was put and lost. The motion was then put and carried, Crs. Isnor, Austin, Otto and Bell voting for and Crs. Malcolm and Pettipas against.

Re Legislation It was decided to call a special meeting of the Council for March ~~21~~<sup>22</sup>st at 7.30 P. M. to deal with Town Legislation.

A number of bills signed by two Councillors were passed for payment.

Pettipas and Otto it was RESOLVED that draft of Legislation, as submitted by the Town Solicitor, with amendments be approved and that it be submitted to the Legislature at the present session. Motion carried; Crs. Pettipas, Otto, Malcolm, Isnor and Bell voting for.

Cr. Bell brought up the matter of the Nova Scotia Motor Vehicle Act in regard to licensed taxis, and on motion of Crs. Bell and Isnor it was RESOLVED that a letter be sent to the Honorable Minister of Highways to the effect that that Towns be empowered to pass by-laws limiting the number of licensed taxis.


LETTER was read from Brightwood Golf and Country Club wanting to know when the Town Council would find it convenient to meet their Committee to discuss matters concerning Brightwood Golf and Country Club.

Also letter from the Nova Scotia Trust Company setting forth the offer to the Town of Dartmouth for the purchase of Brightwood Golf and Country Club as per provisions under the Will of the late Colonel Vidito.


It was decided to call a special meeting of the Council to deal with these matters, and the estimates on Thursday, March 21st.

Town Council met this date at 7.30 P. M.

Present: Mayor Topple, Councillors Malcolm, Pettipas, Otto, Isnor and Bell;  
also Town Solicitor Moseley.

A delegation was present at the meeting representing Brightwood Golf and Country Club. Mr. R. H. Read and Mr. John Misener were heard in connection therewith; and Mr. Tufts was also heard representing the Trustees of the Estate of the late Col. I. W. Vidito. After some discussion, on motion of Crs. Bell and Isnor, the following resolution was unanimously adopted:

"RESOLVED that in the event of the Town accepting the terms under the Will of the late I. W. Vidito in reference to Brightwood Golf and Country Club, that this Town Council go on record as accepting the agreement made with the present Directors of the said Club by the Executor of the Estate of I. W. Vidito, provided however that should expenses exceed \$800.00 the Directors be required to pay to the Town of Dartmouth such amount in excess, up to \$780.00."

The estimates of the different Committees, after having been dealt with by the Finance Committee, were presented to Council and were examined by members of Council, and after making some minor changes, and including in the revenue thereof the amount of \$7,000. to be transferred from the Dartmouth Ferry Commission <sup>roll</sup> was unanimously adopted, and on motion of Crs. Isnor and Bell, the following resolution was unanimously adopted:

"That the assessment roll as finally passed by the Court of Appeal and completed and now laid before this meeting be and the said is hereby confirmed and that this Council authorize the levying and collection of a rate for the current year of \$3.55 per \$100.00 on the assessed value as per assessment roll which assessment roll and rates are hereby confirmed.

That the 21st day of March, 1935, be and it is hereby fixed as the date the rates for the current year shall be due and payable and that a discount of two percent be allowed thereon up to the Fourth day of June, 1935, and after the second day of July, 1935, interest be charged on all taxes for the current year then unpaid, at the rate of Six Percent per annum,

Further resolved that a Poll Tax of \$3.00 be levied on and collected from persons assessed for personal property only and a Poll Tax of Seven Dollars be levied and collected from persons not assessed on Real and Personal Property as provided by Law."

On motion of Crs. Bell and Pettipas it was RESOLVED that the rate of interest to be charged in future on back taxes be at the rate of 6% per annum.


LETTER was read from Martin Archibald, Municipal Clerk and Treasurer, enclosing resolution as annexed, in reference to a joint Committee conferring with the Government to discuss ways and means whereby the annual contributions to the Court House Commission from the joint expenditure funds may hereafter be lessened. Letter received and on motion of Crs. Bell and Isnor, it was RESOLVED that the Council of the Town of Dartmouth go on record as endorsing this resolution.

E. Pearl Hopgood, Secretary I.O.D.E. asking for permission for the Shannon Chapter to hold their annual sale of roses for St. George's Day on the Streets on Saturday, April 20th. Permission granted.


Mayor Topple on behalf of the Committee in connection with alterations in the Clerk's Office, reported that he had received tenders, the lowest being \$112.00. On motion of Crs. Pettipas and Otto the matter was referred to the Committee with power to act.

The Council then adjourned and met as a Board of Health. Letter was read from Sanitary Inspector and Plumbing Inspector, reporting on the condition of the premises #113 Ochterloney Street, administrated by Mr. J. F. Ryan, on behalf of the Estate of R. J. Whitten, stating that the pipes have burst and the water has been turned off and the place is unfit for human habitation. Report received and on motion of Crs. Bell and Pettipas it was RESOLVED that upon advice of the Sanitary Inspector this Board declare the premises #113 Ochterloney Street to be unfit for human habitation, and that the owner be notified that no occupation thereof will be permitted until the same is put in sanitary condition.

Town Council met this date at 8 P. M.

Present: Mayor Topple, Councillors Austin, Malcolm, Pettipas, Otto, Isner and Bell; also Town Solicitor Moseley.

Minutes of the last three meetings were read and approved.

Cr. Otto's notice of motion from the previous meeting was the first matter dealt with, and after some discussion on motion of Crs. Otto and Austin resolution as annexed in reference to the revision of fees for licenses under by-law #35 was adopted. Cr. Pettipas voting against.

Draft of by-law #34 in regard to restaurants was read and tabled and the Clerk was instructed to have copies made and sent to all the Councillors.

LETTERS WERE READ FROM: Dartmouth and Eastern Halifax County Tourist Association asking that the Council reconsider painting the sign which now stands on the highway near Waverley, suggesting the following:

DARTMOUTH  
10 Miles Paved Highway

Letter received and on motion of Crs. Otto and Pettipas was referred to the Street Committee.

Deputy Provincial Secretary stating that Monday, May 6th, will be proclaimed a public holiday in Nova Scotia in honor of His Majesty the King's Twenty-fifth Anniversary of Accession to the Throne and asking that celebrations be carried out in the Town. Letter received and on motion of Crs. Bell and Isner, Crs. Pettipas, Austin and Otto were appointed a special committee to arrange details of the celebration.

E. Bert Batson, quoting pennants and flags for the forthcoming celebrations, 12 flags on a string, price \$3.00 per string. Referred to Committee on celebration.

H. T. Williams stating that he would like to be considered when the Town are placing insurance on the new truck. Letter received and referred to the Street Committee with instructions to call tenders.

Hon. John A. MacDonald, Minister of Agriculture, enclosing circular letter of the Nova Scotia Department of Agriculture in regard to Relief Gardens. Letter received and referred to Charities Committee.

Cr. Bell reported that Austin Bros. had asked for payment of the tractor and snow plow purchased from them, and on motion of Crs. Otto and Isner it was resolved that the matter of payment to Austin Bros. be referred to the Finance Committee with power to act.

Notices of Appeal to the County Court from the decision of the Dartmouth Assessment Court of Appeal were received from Charles W. Clarke on behalf of C.H. Williston and Bessie D. Clarke, and Vincent M. Farrell, on motion of Crs. Austin and Bell were referred to the Town Solicitor with power to act.

Re Daylight Saving Time, Mayor Topple was appointed a committee of one to continue negotiations with the Dartmouth Board of Trade and report back to Council.

RE: REVISORS OF ELECTORAL LISTS. On motion of Crs. Pettipas and Austin it was RESOLVED that Edgar Levy, Fred Lahey and Charles Manuel be appointed Revisors of Electoral Lists in the Town of Dartmouth at the same salary as last year, namely \$350.00 collectively.

On motion of Crs. Bell and Isnor it was RESOLVED that W. E. Moseley be appointed Deputy Stipendiary Magistrate in and for the Town of Dartmouth for a term of one year.

On motion of Crs. Bell and Isnor it was RESOLVED that this Council do appoint J. M. Henneberry as extra Constable in and for the Town for a term of one year, and that the territorial limits within which he shall have power to act shall be the limits of the Town of Dartmouth.

Re Starr Manufacturing Co. Ltd.

On motion of Crs. Pettipas and Bell, it was RESOLVED:

"That the Council do agree to accept the amendment to section 7 of Bill 52 now under consideration by the Legislature, as suggested by Mr. F. D. Smith, K. C. to permit the Company to sell certain of its personal property in the ordinary course of business and to give security to the Bank upon same."

Re Brightwood Golf and Country Club. After considerable discussion the following resolution moved and seconded by Crs. Bell and Isnor was adopted:

"Resolved: that the Town Solicitor be instructed to prepare legislation authorizing the Town to accept the offer of the Estate of the late I. W. Vidito relating to the Brightwood Golf and Country Club, Limited; and that the Town accept the said offer subject to said legislation being passed and subject to a favorable vote of the ratepayers of the Town assessed on real estate; and that a meeting of the ratepayers assessed on real estate be called and held on the 10th day of May, A.D. 1935 and that a vote of said ratepayers be held at the Town Hall on the 15th day of May, A.D. 1935 upon the question of whether or not the said offer be accepted by the Town. But that before said legislation be prepared or said meeting and vote be held, the executors be asked whether or not acceptance in this form will be satisfactory."

Police and License Committee reported in reference to salaries paid to members of the Police force that the Chief of Police begin at \$1700.00 per year with a yearly increase of \$100.00 until such salary has reached \$2,000. which shall be the maximum. In the case of the present incumbent, the first such increase to take place January 1st, 1936. Deputy Chief of Police maximum salary to be \$1525. per year. Police Officers to begin at \$1100.00 per year with a yearly increase of \$100.00 until such salary has reached \$1475.00 which shall be the maximum. On motion of Crs. Austin and Malcolm it was resolved that the report be adopted. Motion carried, Cr. Pettipas voting against.

On motion of Crs. Otto and Malcolm it was RESOLVED that the Town purchase from Messrs. Teasdale and Foot, Limited, for use of the Police Department one Chevrolet Standard Coach at the price of \$808.00 to cover all taxes and freight, and that the Town trade in and sell to Teasdale and Foot, Limited its motor-cycle and side-car at a price of \$158.00, to make the net cost of car \$650. Motion carried unanimously.

Letter received from Hon. A. S. McMillan, Minister of Highways stating that there was no authority to limit the number of licensed taxies in the Town. Letter placed on file.

Application of John P. Otto for permit to erect a dwelling on the South side of Rose Street, estimated cost \$3500. as approved by the Town Engineer, was granted.

At this juncture Cr. Austin asked permission to retire. A letter was read from him tendering his resignation as Chairman of Streets and Public Property Committee, also Sewer and Water Committee, expressing his thanks for the support and stating that he would give his best support to the new Chairman of these two Committees. On motion of Crs. Pettipas and Isnor, Crs. Bell and Otto were appointed a Committee to interview Cr. Austin asking him to reconsider. They reported recommending that the matter be left over for another month and in the meantime Cr. Austin would act as Chairman of these Committees.


Cr. Bell moved, seconded by Cr. Otto that Commissioner John Paterson be asked to tender his resignation as School Commissioner appointed by Council. After considerable discussion resolution was tabled and the Clerk was instructed to write Com. Paterson asking him if he would care to appear before the Council at a future meeting.

Number of bills signed by two Councillors were passed for payment.

BY-LAW

Be it resolved by the Town Council of the Town of Dartmouth, that the following amendment be, and the same is hereby adopted to the by-laws of the Town; and that the Town Clerk be, and he is hereby instructed to forward the same to the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council for his approval.

BY-LAW NUMBER 35.

1. By-law No. 23 of the By-laws of the Town, relating to the licensing of motor vehicles operated for hire, adopted by the Town Council July 15, 1929, and approved by the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council November 14, 1930, is amended as follows:

(1) Section 11 is repealed and the following substituted therefor:

(11) The fee payable for motor vehicles operated for hire, shall be \$25.00 a year for any motor vehicle regardless of size, and whether or not the same is in addition to another motor vehicle licensed by the same licensee.

(2) The schedule of fees for licenses provided in the said By-law as Schedule No. 2 is repealed, and the following substituted therefor:

1. Petty traders \$20.00 per annum.
2. Motor-driven trucks \$20.00 per annum.
3. Trucks other than motor-driven trucks \$10.00 per annum.
4. Motor vehicles \$25.00 per annum.
5. Chimney sweeps \$5.00 per annum.
6. Bill posters \$25.00 per annum.
7. Auctioneers \$10.00 per annum.
8. Junk dealers (a) each store, boat, team or vehicle \$20.00  
~~(b) each boat, team, or vehicle \$20.00~~  
(c) when dealer not a resident of the town, each store, boat, team or vehicle \$25.00 per annum.

2. Part six entitled "Junk Dealers" of By-law No. 22 entitled "Licenses" is amended by adding to Section 3 thereof, the following words: " Each licensee shall weekly, not later than Tuesday in each week, furnish to the Chief of Police a report upon forms to be furnished by the Chief of Police, of all goods purchased by him, for and during the previous week. The said report shall contain the name and description of each person from whom such goods were purchased, and such other information as shall be necessary to properly complete the said form."

3. Part Six aforesaid, entitled "Junk Dealers" of said By-law No. 22 entitled "Licenses" is further amended by repealing section 2 thereof and substituting therefor the following:

2. No person shall employ or use any boat, team or vehicle for the purpose of collecting any such "junk" without having first obtained a license therefor for each of such boats, teams or vehicles so used; the fee for such license shall be Twenty Dollars (\$20.00) if the licensee is a resident rate-payer of the Town, and Twenty-five Dollars (\$25.00) if the licensee is not a resident rate-payer of the Town.

4. Part Six aforesaid, entitled "Junk Dealers" of said By-Law No. 22 entitled "Licenses" is further amended by striking out the words "Ten Dollars" where they appear in section 1 thereof, and substituting therefor the words and figures "Twenty Dollars (\$20.00)" and by adding to said Section 1 the words " In the case of a licensee not a resident rate-payer of the Town, the fee for such license shall be Twenty-five dollars (\$25.00)".

5. Part Eight, entitled "Trucks" of said By-law No. 22 entitled "Licenses" is amended by repealing the whole of Section 3 thereof and substituting therefor the following:

3. Each application for a license to operate a truck for hire shall be accompanied by the proper license fee; otherwise it shall be deemed that no application for such license has been made. If the license applied for be not granted, the fee paid shall be refunded. The license fee paid for each motor-driven truck shall be Twenty Dollars (\$20.00) per annum; the license fee paid for each truck other than a motor-driven truck shall be Ten Dollars (\$10.00) per annum.



Your Committee appointed to consider plans for a fitting observance of the King's Jubilee, beg to report.

Three meetings were held, attended by the members of the Committee and The Mayor and a large number of citizens, including many Daughters of the Empire, all of whom have promised to generously co-operate with the civic committee.

A tentative program has been outlined to include attractions as follows:

Parade of school children, starting from Greenvale School to the old Central school site; procession to be headed by a Band. Provision will be made in the procession for Boy Scouts and the Girl Guides. Both groups, through their leaders have promised to participate in the Dartmouth demonstration instead of the one at Halifax.

The Daughters of the Empire have promised to supply one thousand flags to the school Board, providing from \$ 50 to \$75 for the purpose, the balance, if any to be provided by the town.

A platform will be erected on the Central school site for the accomodation of speakers and others who may be entitled to have honors bestowed upon them. Around this platform will be gathered representatives of the Daughters of the Empire, Churches and other public bodies.

The Principal of the public schools has kindly promised to take charge of the parade.

It is recommended that the Town Council purchase a Nova Scotian flag and present it to the School Board to be flown at the Greenval High School.

It is recommended that a general appeal be made to the public to decorate their homes and premises and that the town do as much decoration of their streets as funds will permit and that the Ferry Commission be requested to do likewise.

A choir of adults, under the leadership of Mrs. R.H. Murray will lead in the singing.

It is recommended that the Committee be authorized to spend \$150.00 to carry out the program.

Letter read from MR. V. E. McSWEENEY, President of Dartmouth Soft Ball Association asking that the Association be allowed to take over and operate the D.A.A.A. Grounds for the year 1935.

Letter received and on motion of Councillors Otto and Austen it was resolved that permission be granted them, under the jurisdiction of a Civic Committee, and on motion of Councillors Austen and Bell it was resolved that the Committee appointed on D.A.A.A. to work in conjunction with the Soft Ball Association be Councillors Pettipas, Otto and Malcolm.

The report of Councillors Pettipas and Otto on behalf of the Committee appointed in connection with the Jubilee Celebration, as annexed, was, on motion of Crs. Bell and Otto, adopted.

The report of the Plumbing Inspector showing the plumbing fixtures installed and inspected for the month of April, as annexed, was received and filed.

The Streets and Public Property Committee reported, recommending the acceptance of the tender of L. E. Hyde for "Liability and property damage" on the Reo Truck, at an annual premium of \$28.80. On motion of Crs. Pettipas and Austen the report was adopted.

The Police and License Committee reported recommending the acceptance of the tender of Harvey T. Williams for "Public liability and property damage" on the Chevrolet Coach at a premium of \$30.00 per annum, <sup>for each class of insurance.</sup> On motion of Crs. Bell and Pettipas the report was adopted.

The Water and Sewer Committee reported, as annexed, on the estimated receipts and expenditures for the current year of that department, showing a net amount of \$28,918.00; to be raised by the levying of domestic and pipe rates.

Town Council met this date at 8 P. M.

Present: Mayor Topple, Councillors Malcolm, Pettipas, Otto, Isnor and Bell. Also Town Solicitor Moseley.

Minutes of the last regular meeting were read and approved.

Plumbing Inspector's report of fixtures installed and inspected for the month of May, as annexed, was received and filed.

The Fire Committee reported recommending the acceptance of the following tenders for supplies:

Town Engineer reported in reference to Mrs. Tynes' application for the purchase of a piece of land from the Town on Crichton Avenue that the piece Mrs. Tynes wanted was immediately in front of the crusher and which he could not recommend. He stated that Mrs. Tynes was now making arrangements to purchase some land from the Crichton property further out. Report received and adopted.

Town Engineer also reported that Mrs. Harriet V. Cleveland has not yet filed a sub-division plan of the Beechmount property and that she has proceeded with the construction of two dwellings on the property for which no permits have been granted. Report received and on motion of Crs. Pettipas and Bell it was resolved that the Clerk notify Mrs. H. V. Cleveland that she must have plans of the sub-division filed with the Town Engineer within ten days, failing which, action will be taken.

Town Engineer reported in reference to Mr. Orman's offer to sell the Town a piece of land on Queen Street for \$850.00 in the event of the Town wishing to extend Edward St. through to Portland joining up with Prince St, that such an extension would involve the purchase of B. O. Bishop's property on Portland St. as well as Mr. Orman's land. The cost of the property would probably amount to \$7150.00. Also that there is a ledge rock near the surface over the entire area which would make the construction of a street expensive, and that under the circumstances he would not recommend the purchase of the land. Bell and Isnor it was resolved that the Clerk be instructed to write the Deputy Attorney General asking him to prepare a resolution and form of notice calling for a meeting of the ratepayers and that the Nova Scotia Trust Company be notified of the action taken by the Town.

Nova Scotia Trust Company stating that they would be willing to invest the \$55,000. which the Town now has on deposit in the Royal Bank, their commission would be 5% on the income and that the money would be invested in short term Government maturities at a yield of approximately 3%. Letter received and on motion of Crs. Pettipas and Malcolm it was referred to the Finance Committee to report back to Council.

John Patterson, School Commissioner stating that on principle and out of respect for the School Board he could not see his way clear to comply with the request to attend the Council meeting in regard to certain charges laid by Cr. Bell against him. Letter received and filed.

W. M. Samuels, Clerk of the Victoria Road Baptist Church asking for permission to hold a Tag Day on the 27th of July in aid of the funds of the Church. On motion of Crs. Bell and Isnor it was resolved that their request be granted.

J. J. MacIntosh, President of the Somme Branch #31 stating that Mr. Bauld, coloured man, had applied to the Legion for assistance, but the finances of

the Branch are in such a condition that they can do no more for the present. 

also Town Solicitor Moseley.

Minutes of the last two meetings were read and approved.

Plumbing Inspector's report, as annexed, showing fixtures installed and inspected for the month of June was received and filed.

LETTERS WERE READ FROM:

V. R. Cox, Woodside, stating that bicycle, owned by him and driven by his son, had collided with the street cleaning cart on Portland Street and as a result considerable damage was done to the bicycle. He enclosed an account of \$20.00 which he asked the Council to pay. Letter received and on motion of Crs. Isnor and Bell was referred to the Town Solicitor to report on.

Dartmouth Park Commission asking to be given authority to look after the trees on all the Town streets. Letter received, and on motion of Crs. Bell and Otto, it was resolved that the Dartmouth Park Commission be granted this authority.

Dartmouth Ferry Commission incorporating a letter they received from Reginald G. Smith, protesting against the sign placed at the intersection of Cohterloney Street and Prince Albert Road directing traffic to the Ferry by way of Portland Street and stating that the Ferry had decided to take down the present sign and respectfully recommends to the Town Council that action be taken to correct the difficulty. Letter received and referred to the Chairman of the Streets, Chairman of the Police and the Town Engineer with power to act.

Dartmouth Natal Day Committee asking for payment of the annual grant for the Natal Day celebration. Letter received and on motion of Crs. Bell and Otto, it was resolved that the amount, as included in the estimates be paid over.

Union of Nova Scotia Municipalities stating that at the 1934 Convention a resolution was passed in reference to the advantages that may result from having the Town elections in December, and asking that this Council consider the question and reply stating if in favour, and give the reasons set forth; also asking the Council to appoint the delegates for the next convention which will be held at Amherst on August 21, 22 and 23. Letter received and on motion of Crs. Isnor and Bell the following resolution was unanimously adopted:

"Resolved that this Council do favor holding the annual Town elections in December."<sup>11</sup>

The reasons being as follows:

1. Better weather conditions which would bring out a larger vote.

2. The Councillors would then be in the full calendar year, which corresponds with the financial year.

3. It would give the newly elected councillors an opportunity to acquaint themselves with the duties of the office before taking over the reins of office.

On motion of Councillors Isnor and Otto, -Mayor Topple, Councillors Pettipas and Bell were appointed delegates from the Town of Dartmouth to attend the annual convention at Amherst.

W. H. Nicholls stating that there is something wrong with the sewer connection to his house at Cleveland Crescent and asked the Council to give this matter attention. After some deliberation, on motion of Crs. Bell and Otto, the Clerk was instructed to notify Mr. Nichols that the Town does not assume any responsibility in the matter.

Deputy Provincial Secretary in reference to by-law #35 in reference to fees for licenses, petty traders, etc., stating that under the Town's Incorporation Act the Town had no authority to discriminate between resident ratepayers and non residents, otherwise the by-law was in order. On motion of Crs. Bell and Isnor it was resolved that by-law #35, adopted by this Council on April 1, 1936, be amended by deleting the word "Resident" wherever it appeared and the Clerk forward copy again for approval by the Deputy Attorney General.

Invitation was received from the Mayor and Councillors of the Town of Pictou inviting the Mayors and Councillors of the Town of Dartmouth to be present at the Lobster Fisheries Carnival to be held in Pictou on July 10th. The Clerk was instructed to accept with thanks the kind invitation.

Councillor Otto gave notice of motion that at the next regular meeting of the Council he would move the adoption of by-laws Nos. 36 and 37 as submitted herewith.

The Finance Committee reported in reference to the \$53,000. owned by the Dartmouth Ferry Commission that after giving the matter careful consideration they were of the opinion that the same be set aside for the Sinking Fund, and on motion of Crs. Bell and Isnor it was resolved that the sum of \$53,000., now on deposit in the Royal Bank of Canada, be placed in a Sinking Fund, and that the Finance Committee with the Town Solicitor and Town Clerk be empowered to invest.

Re Natal Day On motion of Crs. Pettipas and Isnor it was resolved that this Council, having set aside Wednesday, August 7th, 1935, as Dartmouth Natal Day, do for the purposes of Bills of Exchange Act declare said date to be a public civic holiday in the Town of Dartmouth.

On motion of Crs. Otto and Malcolm, it was resolved:

\* RESOLVED: That pursuant to Section 13 (1) of Chapter 57 of the Acts of 1955, the Dartmouth Natal Day Committee, subject to this resolution being hereafter rescinded or amended in any way by the Council, do consist of the following to be appointed annually for a term of twelve months:

- 4 representatives to be appointed by the executive of the Banook Canoe Club.
- 3 representatives to be appointed by the executive of the Micmas Amateur Aquatic Club.
- 3 representatives to be appointed by the executive of the North Star Amateur Aquatic Club.
- 3 representatives to be appointed by the executive of the Austenville Owl's Club.
- 3 representatives to be appointed by the Dartmouth Town Council.
- 3 representatives to be appointed by the Dartmouth Ferry Commission.
- 3 representatives to be appointed by the Dartmouth Fire Department.

FURTHER RESOLVED: That the bodies and organizations above named be asked to appoint representatives to the number hereinbefore provided, and that the first named representative of the executive of the Banook Canoe Club be the person to convene the first meeting of the Dartmouth Natal Day Committee and be the person to convene any future meetings when there is no other person with authority to do so or who does so."

Councillors Pettipas, Otto and Austin were appointed representatives from the Town Council.

Cr. Austin reported approving of the recommendation by the Town Engineer in reference to the widening of Jamieson Street and the purchasing of approximately 25 sq. ft. from Mr. Frank Mosely at a cost of \$875.00 for the land. On motion of Crs. Bell and Isnor the matter was referred to the Town Solicitor to ascertain if Mr. Moseley could give a clear deed to the Town of Dartmouth.


Joint meeting of Dartmouth Town Council and Ferry Commission held this day at 1 P. M.



Chisholm's name and is subject to a mortgage to the Mortgage Corporation of Nova Scotia, also that there is a deed from Mrs. Chisholm to Frank Moseley but same has not been recorded; also that there would be no difficulty in obtaining a release from the Mortgage Corporation as to the lands the Town requires. Report received and on motion of Crs. Pettipas and Austin it was RESOLVED:

"That the Town do purchase from Frank Moseley, a lot of land adjoining Jamieson Street in the Town of Dartmouth for the purpose of widening said Jamieson Street, at a cost of \$875.00 details as to said purchase to be subject to the approval of the Town Engineer and the Town Solicitor, and that the matter of financing be left to the Committee on Finance."

Town Solicitor Moseley reported in reference to the claim of V. R. Cox for \$20.00 damage claim by him to his bicycle while being operated by his employee who ran into the Town's street cleaning cart on Portland Street on the night of June 1st, and that if there is any negligence it is on the part of the operator of the bicycle, and not on the part of the Town, and that he respectfully recommends that the claim be not paid. Report adopted.

Chief of Police Clarke stating that the three months probation for Walter Douglas Page as Police Officer had expired, and that he was in favour of the appointment as Mr. Page had proved a capable and efficient police officer during the period of probation. Letter received and on motion of Crs. Otto and Malcolm, it was RESOLVED:

"That Walter Douglas Page be appointed Police Officer in and for the Town of Dartmouth to hold office as such until the annual appointments in February 1938."

Town Engineer reported in reference to the request to the Wadsworth, Howland Company, Boston, to have the chimney removed on their property, North Dartmouth, as it is in a dangerous condition, that the Wadsworth, Howland Company do not feel disposed to do anything about it. Report received and on motion of Crs. Austin and Bell, it was RESOLVED:

"That in the opinion of this Council based on the report of the Streets and Public Property Committee, a chimney on property of Wadsworth, Howland & Company, Limited, on Windmill Road in the Town of Dartmouth is in a partly demolished and a dangerous condition, and that the Town Clerk be and he is hereby instructed to serve notice upon the owner thereof requiring the removal of such chimney and that in the event of the failure of such owner to remove such chimney the Town Engineer with Town employees be and he is hereby instructed to enter upon the said property and remove said chimney to the extent he shall deem necessary to prevent any further danger therefrom."

Town Engineer reported that a survey had been made of Mott's Lane which shows that a sewer can be brought in from Pleasant Street which will be deep enough to sewer the main floor of buildings on both sides of the Lane, but may not drain the basement floors, depending upon the depth of the excavations. Estimated cost \$2200.00 covered by frontage charges; extension of water will cost about \$750.00 extra. On motion of Crs. Austin and Bell it was RESOLVED:

"That the Town do accept from the Eastern Trust Company, executor and trustee of the Estate of the late J. Walter Allison a deed of Mott Lane, so called said Lane to be of a width of 50 feet where said Trustee is owner of sufficient land to convey the same, and to be of a width of 40 feet more or less at each end, provided however that the Town does not bind itself to expropriate, purchase or otherwise acquire sufficient land to create a 50 foot street throughout; the acceptance to be subject to the approval of the Town Solicitor and the Town Engineer."

Town Engineer also reported in reference to the application of L. V. Mason to erect two wings on his foundry on Thistle Street, that the present building is built against the stone retaining wall on the South side of the street which extends about four feet north over the building line and that he would recommend that the present building be allowed to remain, but that the wings be built to conform with the proper street line, and that Mr. Mason sign an acknowledgement of encroachment and agree to remove when required. On motion of Crs. Otto and Bell, it was resolved:

"That the Application of L. V. Mason for a building permit on Thistle Street be granted, Mr. Mason to have power to erect new wings of his building partly on Town property in line with the present building, provided that Mr. Mason sign an acknowledgement that he is encroaching on Town property and an agreement to remove same at the request of the Council, and that the report of the Town Engineer be adopted except as herein amended."

Re: Early Closing By-law On motion of Crs. Otto and Austin, Resolution, as annexed, was unanimously adopted in reference to by-law #36. The Clerk was instructed to forward copies for approval by the Governor-in-Council.

By-law #37 re licenses for peddlers, was up for discussion, and on motion of Crs. Pettipas and Otto was deferred to the next regular meeting of the Council.

Letter was received from Blom Bros. in reference to the sign near Waverley, stating that they would be prepared to paint the sign according to instruct-



ions and assured the Council of a high-class job; submitted sketches. On motion of Crs. Isnor and Bell the matter of painting the sign was referred to the Committee who formerly had the matter in hand, vis. Crs. Austin and Pettipas.

Applications for permits, approved by the Engineer, were passed as follows:

- Raymond P. Hollett, Garage North side of Portland St.
- S. R. Livingstone, " East side of Fairbanks St.
- Agnes E. Miscner, Dwelling, South side of Cameron St.

On motion of Crs. Pettipas and Otto the matter of granting the U.P. Company the use of the Town lot on Prince Albert Road for Natal Day was referred to Mayor Topple with power to act.

The question of the Assessors' salaries was up for discussion and was deferred until the next meeting.

Cr. Pettipas brought up the matter of the Starr Manufacturing Company having the rights of the waters of the Dartmouth Lakes and on motion this matter was referred to the Town Solicitor.

On motion of Crs. Otto and Isnor it was resolved that the Chairman of the Street Committee be authorized to over expend the Street estimates by the sum of Two Thousand Dollars for street work.

Town Clerk reported that he was appointing Miss C. M. Bisp, Deputy Town Clerk for the remainder of the current year. On motion of Crs. Isnor and Bell it was resolved that this Council concur in the appointment of Miss C. M. Bisp as Deputy Town Clerk to December 31st, 1935.

Number of bills signed by two Councillors were passed for payment.

RESOLVED: That the Town Council of the Town of Dartmouth, pursuant to Section 15 of Chapter 67 of the Acts of 1932 as amended by Chapter 87 of the Acts of 1935 do enact, make and adopt the following by-law; and that the Town Clerk be and he is hereby instructed to forward same to the Governor-in-Council with a request for his approval thereof.

BY-LAW NUMBER 36

(1) All shops doing business within the Town of Dartmouth, selling meat or groceries or meat and groceries, whether with or without any other goods or services, shall be closed to customers at the hour of 6.30 o'clock in the afternoon on every Monday, Tuesday and Thursday and at the hour of 1 o'clock in the afternoon on every Wednesday, and shall remain closed until the day following; every owner, operator, lessor and employee of or in any shop doing the class of business aforesaid, shall be guilty of an offence against this by-law if he remains in or upon the premises of said shop while the same is not closed to customers aforesaid.

(2) Section 1 hereof shall not apply to the month of December in any year, or to any one of the days mentioned in said section, in any week in which is a public holiday or half-holiday, and the closing of the office of the Town Clerk of the Town of Dartmouth for the whole or half of the business day (other than Saturday) shall determine the sufficiency of such holiday for the purpose of this section.

(3) The time mentioned in Section 1 hereof shall be either Atlantic Standard Time, or Atlantic Daylight Saving Time, whichever is in force at the time at the office of the Town Clerk by virtue of a resolution of the Council of the Town of Dartmouth.

(4) This by-law shall not apply to any shop in any of the above mentioned classes, carrying on a retail business, in which shop the personal property, regardless of ownership, is assessed at under Six Hundred Dollars (\$600.00)

(5) The by-law of the Town dealing with closing of shops, passed by the Town Council May 2, 1932 and approved by the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council on May 19, 1932 is repealed.

I hereby certify that the foregoing by-law was unanimously adopted at a meeting of the Dartmouth Town Council, regularly called and held on August 5th, 1935, at which meeting all members were present and voting.

Present: Mayor Topple, Councillors Austin, Malcolm, Pettipas, Otto, Isnor and Bell; also Town Solicitor Moseley.

Minutes of the last regular meeting were read and approved.

Report of the plumbing inspector, as annexed, of fixtures installed and inspected for the month of August was received and filed.

The Street and Public Property Committee reported in reference to the widening of Portland Street that the Town had accepted deeds from H. A. Young and Super-Service Stations Eastern Limited, total cost \$167.13. Report adopted.

The Town Solicitor reported in reference to Mott's Lane that after a search of the title he is of the opinion that this street is not vested in the executors of the Allison estate and were never owned by the late Mr. Allison. He recommended that the project be abandoned by the Town. On motion of Crs. Pettipas and Austin report was received and the Clerk was instructed to notify the Eastern Trust Company of the action taken by the Town

The Town Solicitor also reported in reference to the application of the Starr Manufacturing Co. Ltd. under the Nova Scotia Water Act as to Dartmouth Lakes, that the Company had advertised in the Dartmouth Patriot on July 20th and 27th, and the application had been considered by the Minister and favourably reported on subject to certain terms and conditions, and that the application will be considered by the Governor-in-Council on September 6th, so that whatever action the Town proposes should be taken before that date. He also attached a copy of the application made by the Starr Manufacturing Company and also terms and conditions prepared by Mr. Harold S. Johnston, Engineer of the N. S. Power Commission. The Town Solicitor also recommended a committee be named by the Council to consider the matter. On motion of Crs. Austin and Malcolm report was adopted and on motion of Bell and Austin, Mayor Topple, Councillor Pettipas, Town Engineer and the Town Solicitor were appointed a committee with power to act.

The Town Engineer reported to the Chairman of the Streets and Public Property Committee that the new steps and platform at #4 Commercial Street extends over the street line exactly the same distance as the old flight, namely  $1\frac{1}{2}$  ft., and stated that there should be some agreement with the owners of the property whereby they could be asked to remove the encroachment at any time and possibly covering a nominal yearly rental. On motion of Crs. Austin and Malcolm it was resolved that the matter be referred to the Town Engineer to notify Mr. Cormier, the owner of the property, to apply for a permit.

By-law #37 deferred from the last meeting of the Council was on motion of Crs. Pettipas and Otto referred back again to the License Committee.

Application of Ethel B. Carter for permit to erect bathing house and hen house #298 Prince Albert Road was received and on motion of Crs. Pettipas and Malcolm the Clerk was instructed to notify Mrs. Carter that the Council will not grant permit for hen house along the shores of the Lake.

The Council then upon motion adjourned and met as the Dartmouth Board of Health.

J. T. Clarke, Chief Sanitary Inspector, reported in reference to a shack situated near the McElmon property at the foot of Mott's Lane, occupied by Henry Collins and a woman, that he had visited the place in company with the Town Engineer and found it very unsanitary, having no water or sewer connections, and recommended that the place be condemned and torn down. Report received and on motion of Crs. Austin and Malcolm, it was resolved:

"That the report of J. T. Clarke, Sanitary Inspector, it appears to this Board of Health that a building or shack situated near the McElmon property at the foot of Mott Street in the Town of Dartmouth used as a dwelling house, is so unfit for that purpose that the public health is endangered thereby, and does hereby order that said building be vacated within the space of ten days after the service upon the occupants of a copy of this resolution; and in the event that said building be not vacated that the Chairman and Secretary of this Board do execute a warrant to enforce compliance herewith."

Town Council met this day at 8 P. M.

Present: Mayor Topple, Councillors Austin, Malcolm, Otto, Isnor and Bell; also Town Solicitor Moseley.

Minutes of the last meeting were read and approved.

Mr. Joseph Williams, who was present at the meeting, was, on motion, granted a hearing. He asked, on behalf of the Somme Branch, that the Council grant permission to hold a Tag Day on the Friday or Saturday before Armistice Day, and also that the Town do purchase the customary wreath through the Somme Branch. On motion of Crs. Austin and Isnor, it was resolved that the request of the Tag Day be granted and that the Town purchase the customary wreath through the Somme Branch at the same price as last year, namely \$10.00.

Plumbing Inspector's report, as annexed, for the month of September was received and filed.

Town Engineer reported in reference to the steps built by Mrs. Bellfontaine on Commercial Street protruding on the sidewalk, for which no permit had been issued, that to make any change by acquiring land from Mr. Cormier would entail considerable expense. After some discussion, on motion of Crs. Austin and Malcolm, it was resolved that the Clerk be instructed to notify Mrs. Annie Bellfontaine that she must remove these steps at No. 4 Commercial Street which are encroaching on Town property.

The Town Engineer and the Chief of Police reported jointly on house 214-216 Portland Street, owned by the Estate of Wm. McV. Smith and John Ritchie that it is a fire hazard and that the condition of the chimneys have been brought to the attention of the representatives of the owners, but that no action had been taken. Report received, and on motion of Crs. Austin and Malcolm, it was resolved:

"That upon the report of the Town Engineer and the Chief of Police this Council is of opinion that property of the estate of Wm. McV. Smith and John Ritchie, at 214 and 216 Portland Street within the Town of Dartmouth has become partly demolished so as to be in a dangerous and unsightly condition; and that the Town Clerk be and he is hereby instructed to serve notice upon the owners requiring them to repair said property by inspecting and rebuilding the chimneys thereof and by removing all fire hazards to the satisfaction of the Town Engineer; and that in event of the failure of said owners to comply with the requirements of said notice within ten days after service thereof, the Town by its Town Engineer with necessary employees enter upon said property and remedy the conditions in the manner aforesaid; and the actual cost of so doing be charged against said property."

Town Solicitor Moseley reported with reference to the assessment appeal of Clark and Williston that Judge Roberts had handed down his decision reducing the assessment from \$12,500 to \$5,000.00, and awarding the appellant costs which had been taxed at \$54.48, and the Solicitor recommended a Committee be appointed with

power to act in regard to an appeal being taken from Judge Robert's decision. On motion of Crs. Austin and Isnor, Mayor Topple and Solicitor Moseley were appointed a Committee with power to act.

Town Solicitor's report stating that Vincent Farrell's appeal was not perfected in the proper time, was received and filed.

LETTERS WERE READ FROM:

The Union Protection Company respectfully asking the town to grant them the sum of \$250.00 annually, as they have had heavy expenses with the building on Queen Street which <sup>will</sup> cost approximately \$1,000 when finished, and asking that a delegation be appointed to discuss the matter. On motion of Crs. Otto and Malcolm, it was resolved that Crs. Pettipas, Austin and Isnor be appointed a Committee from the Town Council to meet with representatives from the Union Protection Company.

Mathews Coal Company asking that Leslie Morris, 2 Oak Street, be appointed as Sworn Coal Weigher in the Town of Dartmouth representing them. Letter received and on motion of Crs. Bell and Isnor, it was resolved that Mr. Morris be appointed Sworn Coal Weigher in the Town of Dartmouth.

B. O. Bishop asking the Council to remove the hydrant from in front of his store #35 Portland Street as in its present condition it interferes with business at the store. Letter received and on motion of Bell and Otto it was referred to the Street Committee with the Town Engineer to report back to Council.

Rudland, Fire Marshal re fire prevention week, 1936, stating that the week commencing October 6th had been set apart by Royal Proclamation as "Fire Prevention Week" and asking the Council's efforts in that direction. Pettipas and Austin it was resolved that the building inspector be instructed to notify the Mortgage Corporation that in future they must apply for building permit before attempting to make any repairs or building.

On motion of Crs. Austin and Bell it was resolved that the matter of admission of patients into the Infectious Hospital, Halifax, be left with the Charities Committee and Health Officer to decide.

Cr. Bell brought up the matter of an inadequate bus stand, and after some discussion, on motion of Crs, Pettipas and Malcolm the matter was referred to the Chairman of the Finance, Chairman of the Police and the Chairman of Streets Committee to report back to council.

Application from the Maritime Telegraph and Telephone Company for permission to erect a garage, estimated cost \$1465, Wentworth Street, Dartmouth, was on motion of Crs. Bell and Otto granted.
