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Dartmouth, N. S., Wednesday, January 3, 1940.

Dartmouth Town Council met this date at eight P. M. Present: Mayor Isnor, Councillors Publicover, Cameron, Pettipas, MacIntosh, Hartlen and Austin; also Town Schicitor Moseley.

Minutes of the last regular meeting were read and on motion approved. Report of the Chief of Police on the activities of the Police Department for the month of December was received and filed.

Town Engineer Allan reported to Cr. Austin in reference to the sug-

REPORT OF CHIEF OF POLICE

EXCHANGE LAND LAKE BANOOK gestion that the Town exchange a portion of the Leahy property, Church Street, which had been bought in at Tax Sale by the Town, for a strip of land owned by Mr. Samuel C. Chittick on the north side of Prince Albert Road extending 320 feet out into Lake Banook and along the Lake 270 feet between the Otto embankment now owned by the Town and lands of Hutchinson Ice Company. After some discussion, on motion of Crs. MacIntosh and Hartlen, it was resolved that the report be adopted, provided there are no complications with the Nova Scotia Power Commission.

The Town Engineer also reported with reference to the question of widening Esson Road, that Mr. Hodgson was willing to sell a strip of land required for this purpose for half of his outstanding sewer assessment charges which now smount to \$178.50, making the selling price \$89.25, with a possible additional increase of about \$10.00 to move his garage clear of the land, and recommended approval thereof. On motion of Crs. Hartlen and Publicover it was recommended that the Town acquire the land as set out or the sketch from Mr. Herbert Hodgson for approximately \$100.00 also land from Mr. John Crooks as reported on at the last meeting of Council at a price of \$100.00 in addition to sewer frontage exemption of \$392.50.

Letter was read from the Community Coal Company asking to have Mr. Frank Mosher appointed a sworn weigher. On motion of Crs. Publicover and MacIntosh it was resolved that this request be granted.

The annual borrowing resolutions, moved and seconded by Crs. Austin and Cameron, were unanimously adopted as follows:

DeYoung Margaret Beaton Robert Kane WHEREAS by Section 5 of Chapter 3 of the Acts of 1939, "The Municipal Affairs (Supervision) Act", it is enacted among other things, in effect, that notwithstanding any of the provisions of any general or special Act of the Legislature of Nova Soctia, every incorporated town shall have full power and authority to borrow or raise by way of loan from time to time on the oredit of such town, such sum or sums as the Council thereof deems necessary for the purpose of constructing, altering, extending and improving public sewers or drains in the town, or for constructing, altering, extending or improving water works or water system for such town;

<u>AND WHEREAS</u> by Section 7 of said Chapter 3 it is enacted among other things, in effect, that no money shall be borrowed under the provisions of said Chapter 3 until such proposed borrowing has been approved by the Minister of Municipal Affairs;

AND WHEREAS the Town Council of the Town of Dartmouth deems it necessary to borrow the sum of Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00) for the purpose of constructing, altering, extending and improving public sewers or drains on Crichton Avenue, Summit Street, Newcastle Street and Pleasant Street in said Town and for the purpose of constructing, altering, extending or improving water works or water system on Crichton Avenue, Summit Street, Newcastle Street and Pleasant Street in said Town;

<u>AND WHEREAS</u> by said Chapter 3 the said sum shall in the discretion of the Council be borrowed

or raised in one sum at one time or in instalments at different times and the sum required shall be borrowed and raised by the issue and sale of debentures of the Town to such an amount as the Council deems necessary to raise such sum;

<u>AND WHEREAS</u> the said Council deems that the issue and sale of debentures of the Town to the amount of Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00) as hereinafter mentioned will be necessary to raise that sum;

BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED that

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under and by virtue of said Chapter 3 the said Town do, subject to the approval of the Minister of Municipal Affairs, borrow or raise by way of loan on the credit of the Town the said sum of Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00) for the purpose aforesaid;

THAT under and in accordance with said Chapter 3 the said sum be borrowed or raised by the issue and sale of debentures of the Town to the said amount of Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00);

<u>THAT</u> ten debentures of the said Town for Five Hundred Dollars each be accordingly issued and sold;

<u>THAT</u> the said debentures be numbered consecutively EE1 to EE10 both inclusive, be dated the 2nd day of January, A. D. 1940, and be payable as follows:

Debenture Number EE1 in two years from the date thereof; 175,00Debenture Number EE2 in four years from the date thereof; 157,50Debenture Number EE3 in six years from the date thereof; 140,00Debenture Number EE4 in eight years from the date thereof; 105,00Debenture Number EE5 in ten years from the date thereof; 105,00

Present: Mayor Isnor, Councillors Publicover, Cameron, Pettipas, MacIntosh, Hartlen and Austin; also Town Solicitor Moseley.

Minutes of the last regular and special meetings were read and on motion approved.

A delegation, being present in support of a petition signed by Mrs. Louise Mitchell and others, was heard, Mr. C. G. Mitchell RE: DUMP BY CALL the west side of the Canal between Dundas Street and the railway bridge making a very unsightly and unsanitary condition. Mr. J.P. Martin also spoke briefly. Council promised the delegation that the matter would be given consideration without delay and the matter of cleaning up the unsightly condition was referred to the Streets Committee and the matter of keeping it clean referred to

the Police Committee.

The report of the Chief of Police was received and ordered CHIEF OF FOLICE REFORT of miles the police car travels each month in his regular report. LETTERS WERE READ FROM:

The Water and Sewer Committee reported, as annexed, on the estimated receipts and expenditures of the Water Department for the current year, and on motion of Crs. Pettipas and Hartlen it was resolved:

"ATER AND SEWER RATE "That the estimated receipts and expenditures submitted by the Water Committee for the current year, showing a balance of 21,341.00 to be raised by direct taxation, be approved; and that the levying of a domestic rate of 60ϕ per 100.00on an assessment of 33,034,810. also the levying of a pipe rate of 20ϕ per 100.00 on an assessment of 1,597,800. minimum domestic rate valuation, 1000.00; maximum domestic valuation, 2,500.00 be and the same is hereby approved.

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FURTHER RESOLVED: that the rates become due and payable August 15, 1940; that all rates not paid by then be subject to interest charges at 6% per annum, and that the water be turned off all premises where rates remain unpaid to September 15, 1940."

On motion of Crs.Cameron and Publicover it was resolved:

DAYLIGHT SAVING "That commencing at 12.01 A. M. Sunday, the 5th day of May, 1940, and continuing until midnight, Saturday, the 28th day of September, 1940, the hours for all civic activities and for opening and closing of the offices in the Town Hall for public business will be one hour earlier than the present accepted Atlantic Standard Time, that is to say, three hours behind Greenwich Mean Solar Time.

AND FURTHER RESOLVED: that the Chairman of the School Board be asked to direct that the change of time be effected in the public schools."

Resolution, as annexed, was unanimously adopted authorizing the issue of \$110,000.00 twenty year serial debentures to be dated May 1, 1940, interest at $3\frac{1}{2}\%$ per annum, said debentures to be used in retiring Ferry issue \$153,000.00 due May 1, 1940.

The matter of insurance on town buildings, maturing April 8th,and on the caretaker's house at the water supply lake was on motion of Crs. Pettipas and Cameron referred to the Finance Committee with power to act, to call for tenders to close at five o'clock P. M. Friday, April 5th, the Committee to meet at six o'clock P. M. to award the insurance.

Letter was read from the Patriot Printing and Publishing Company tendering a price of \$2.55 per page, plus sales tax, to PRINTING TOWN REPORT print the 1939 annual report. The letter pointed out that the price was ten cents per page or approximately \$8.00 more than last year due to increased costs. On motion of Crs. Austin and MacIntosh the tender was accepted.

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WHEREAS by Section 5 of

Chapter 5 of the Acts of 1939, The Municipal Affairs (Supervision) Act, it is enacted among other things in effect that notwithstanding any of the provisions of any special or general Act of the Legislature of Nova Scotia every incorporated town shall have full power and authority to borrow or raise by way of loan from time to time on the credit of such town such sum or sums as the Council thereof deems necessary for the purpose of paying and retiring at maturity debentures of the town;

<u>AND WHEREAS</u> by Section 7 of said The Municipal Affairs (Supervision) Act it is enacted among other things in effect that no money shall be borrowed under the provisions of said The Municipal Affairs (Supervision) Act until such proposed borrowing has been approved by the Minister of Municipal Affairs;

<u>AND WHEREAS</u> the Town Council of the Town of Dartmouth deems it necessary to borrow the sum of One Hundred and Ten Thousand Dollars (\$110,000.00) for the purpose of paying and retiring at maturity debentures of the Town amounting in the whole to One Hundred and Fifty-three Thousand Dollars (\$153,000.00) dated the 1st day of May, A. D. 1915, payable on the 1st day of May, A. D. 1940 and issued under the provisions of Chapter 52 of the Acts of 1915, the sinking fund in respect of said debentures being insufficient;

AND WHEREAS by said The Municipal

Affairs (Supervision) Act such sum shall in the discretion of the Town Council be borrowed or raised in one sum at one time or in instalments at different times and the sum required shall be borrowed or raised by the issue and sale of debentures of the Town to such an amount as the Council deems necessary to raise such sum; AND WHEREAS the said Council

deems that the issue and sale of debentures of the Town to the amount of One Hundred and Ten Thousand Dollars (\$110,000.00) as hereinafter mentioned will be necessary to raise such sum; BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED that

Early Closing of Shops

1. All shops, stores or places within the Town of Dartmouth in which are sold or offered for sale, boots and shoes, dry goods, juvelley of clothing or wearing apparel of any kind, hardware, radios or musical instruments or any parts thereof including the shops commonly referred to as "variety shops", shall during the months of June, July and August in every year be closed to customers on Wednesday in every weak, except a week in which there is a public holiday; at 1 o'clock in the afternoon and shall remain closed to customers until 6 o'clock in the following morning.

2. Whenever Daylight Saving Time (so-called) is in force in the Town of Dartmouth, that is to say when, by virtue of a resolution of the Town Council, the hours for all civic activities and for opening and closing of offices for public business at the Town Hall are fixed at one hour earlier than the accepted Atlantic Standard Time, then the hours for opening and closing as provided by Section 1 hereof shall be the same hours according to Daylight Saving Time that is to say shall be one hour earlier in each case according to Atlantic Standard Time than the hours provided by said Section 1.

3. Nothing in this by-law shall render any person liable to comviction for supplying any article required for immediate use by reason or because of any emergency arising from sickness, accident or death.

4. The phrase "public holiday" as used in Section 1 hereof means a holiday as defined by the Interpretation Act Chapter 1, R.S.N.S. and includes any day proclaimed or set spart as a holiday or half-holidag by the Mayor or by the Town Council of the Town.

BY-LAW NUMBER 44

TAXICABS

1. In this by-law unless the context otherwise requires, the expression:-

(a) "Committee" means the Police and License Committee of the Town of Dartmouth for the time being.
(b) "Council" means the Town Council of the Town of

Dartmouth. (c) "Driver" means any person who drives a taxicab other than as the licensed owner thereof.

(d) "Inspector" means any person appointed to that office by the Town Council; the Chief of Police and the Deputy Chief of Police of the Town shall both be inspectors for

the purposes of this by-law. (e) "License" includes both Taxi License and Driver's License. "Taxi License" means a license granted by the Council permitting the owning and the operating of a taxicab. "Driver's License" means a license granted by the Town permitting the holder thereof to operate as a driver a licensed taxicab owned by a person other than himself.

(f) "Mayor" or "Town Clerk" means the Mayor or Town Clerk of Dartmouth for the time being.

(g) "Taricab" includes every motor vehicle used to transport passengers for hire regardless of size, capacity

or type. (h) "Taxi-owner" means any person who drives a taximab as the licensed owner thereof, or who owns any taxicab driven by a driver, or both; a person shall be deemed to own a motor vehicle who has same in his possession or under his control either as legal owner or under any lease, rental agreement, hire purchase agreement or agreement of sale. (1) "Town" means the Town of Dartmouth.

2. No person shall

(a) Transport passengers for hire in or through any street, road, lane, alley or other public place of the Town in any motor vehicle; or

(b)Be on any street, road, lane, alley, taxi-stand or other public place of the Town driving or in control of any motor vehicle, seeking employment as a taxicab; or

(c) Permit any motor vehicle owned or otherwise controlled by him to be used as a taxicab or to be on any street, road, lane, alley, taxi-stand or other public place under the control of any person who is seeking employment with such motor vehicle as a taxibab;

unless he is in possession of a taxi license issued in respect of such vehicle, and, if he is not the owner of such vehicle, is in possession of a driver's license issued to himself.

3. No license shall be granted unless

(a) an application is made in writing to the Town upon a form prescribed by the Committee giving a description of the motor vehicle, if any, proposed to be licensed; and.

and, (b) such application is accompanied by payment to the Town Olerk of the fee for such license which fee shall be refunded to the applicant if the license be not granted; and.

ed; and, (c) such application is also accompanied by a bond with two sufficient sursties, to the Town, in the penal sum of Two Hundred Dollars, conditioned for the faithful performance of his duties by the applicant and for his compliance with this by-law; and, (d) the granting of such application is approved by the

(d) the granting of such application is approved by the Inspector who shall first have inspected the vehicle (if any) proposed to be licensed.

4. A License may be granted by the Council and by no other person or body. The Council may refuse to grant a license to any person who it feels is not a fit or proper person to be a taxi owner or driver or who has been conv.icted of any offence under or this by-law, or under any law of the Province/of the Dominion. It shall, if granted, be signed by the Mayor and Town Clerk.
5. All licenses shall be in force until the first meeting of the Council in the month of May next following the issue thereof, unless sooner cancelled, suspended or revoked.

6. A Taxi Lieense shall be issued in respect of one particular specified vehicle and one particular specified owner, only. An additional license at an additional fee shall be required for each additional vehicle to be operated by the same owner as a taxicab. may A Taxi License with the approval in writing of the Inspector, or with the approval of the Council, be assigned to enother vehicle owned by the same owner or to another owner of the same vehicle, (in which case it will cease to be valid for the former vehicle or the former owner as the case may be) but failing such approval it shall be deemed to be not in force and not valid for any other owner or any other vehicle than that specified therein. For purposes of convenience such vehicle shall be specified and described by the registration permit number issued in respect thereof by the Motor Vehicle Branch of the Department of Highways. A Driver's License shall be issued to one particular specified person and may no t be transferred to another under any circumstances. A taxi license issued in respect of a bus need not specify any vehicle but the holder thereof shall not operate more vehicles at any one time than the number of licenses he has issued to him.

7.(1) No more than twenty-four taxi licenses shall be in force at any one time. If by any means more licenses than twenty-four shall be in force at any one time then the one or ones last granted shall be automatically revoked by such number thereof as will reduce the total to twenty-four; for the purposes hereof if two or more licenses have been granted by one resolution, they shall be taken to have been granted in the order of their appearance therein.

(3) In addition to the licenses referred to in subsection (1) of this section the Council may grant such number of taxi licenses as it sees fit to busses operating in the Town on a route or routes submitted to and approved by the Council. No bus shall operate within the Town other than on a route so approved, and a bus shall be deemed to be a taxicab for the purposes of this by-law except as in this section provided.

8. The word "Taxi" shall be painted or affixed in a conspicuous manner and in letters not less than one and one-half inches high upon or immediately adjacent to the windshield of all taxicabs other than busses.

9. No taxicab shall be operated as such unless it is in a clean, tidy and proper condition, nor unless it is in good, safe mechanical condition, nor in any manner likely to endanger the safety of the lives or property of passengers, pedestrians or others.

10. The operator of every taxical/while operated as such whether actually transporting passengers or awaiting or seeking employment, shall not be under the influence of intoxicating liquor to even the slightest degree; he shall be dressed in a clean, tidy and respectable manner. While at the stand provided for or occupied by taxicabs he shall remain beside his vehicle and not join with others so as to form groups or incommode, annoy or embarrase pedestrians. He shall not sound the horn on his own taxicab or on that of another, while at the stand under any conditions. He shall always maintain a dignified, courteous bearing and shall not make use of abusive or insulting language.

11. Every licensed taxi driver and every licensed taxi owner, unless engaged, shall, whether at his stand or his residence or his place of business upon being applied to in person or by telephone, at any time between the hours of seven o'clock in the morning and twelve o'clock at night and upon being tendered his proper fare, place himself and his taxicab at the disposal of the person so applying and proceed to any place in the Town as directed; he shall not however be obliged to transport passengers to any place outside the limits of the Town, nor to transport property either within or outside of the Town; no bus shall be obliged to depart from its schedule or from its route.

12. Every licensed taxi driver and every licensed taxi owner who engages to be at any particular place within the Town at a specified time, whether by day or by night, shall be punctual to the time of his engagement.

16. The Council may appoint a place to be a stand at which licensed taxicabs may remain and solicit passengers; upon such appointment being made, no person shall permit the taxi cab: of which he is in charge, to park or remain at any other place while soliciting passengers, except when awaiting a passenger by previous engagement. 14. This by-law shall not apply to the owner of a motor vehicle who keeps same in his own garage and does not take up a stand at the taxi way stand provided, nor advertise nor hold himself out in any/as a taxicab owner or operator, nor solicit passengers in any street, lane, thoroughfare or public place of the Town.

15. No license shall be issued to any person apparently of actually under the age of eighteen years.

16. Notwithstanding any by-law of the Town relating to the licensing of motor vehicles for the transporting of goods, any person licensed under this by-law may transport parcels or goods, not exceeding one hundred pounds in weight at any one time, with or without passengers, for compensation.

17. Any person who violates or fails to comply with any provision of this by-law shall upon conviction be liable to a fine not exceeding Ten Dollars and in default of payment to imprisonment for a term not exceeding ten days; unless it is a second or subsequent offence in which case he shall be liable to a fine not exceeding Twenty Dollars and in default of payment to imprisonment for a term not exceeding twenty days. In addition to such here the council or the Gennittee may upon such conviction cancel or suspend his license hereunder; provided that if the cancellation or suspension is by the Council at its first regular meeting thereafter and approved by the Council within two months after such consideration.

18. The form of license shall be as set out in the schedule hereto. 19. The fees for licenses shall be as set out in the schedule hereto; there shall be no reduction in any such fee because a license is granted for a shorter period than one year or for any other reason. 30. By-law Number 23 of the Town entitled "Motor Vehicles" passed by the Town Council July 15th 1929 and approved by the Lieutenant Governor in Council November 14, 1940, is repealed. The by-law relating to hack or motor licenses passed by the Town Council November 18, 1929 and approved by the Lieutenant Governor in Council December 13, 1929 is repealed. Subsection 1 of Section 1 of By-Law Number 35 passed by the Town Council April 1, 1935 and July 2, 1935 and appreved: by the Lieutenant Governor in Council July 17, 1935, is repealed. Nothing herein contained shall be taken to repeal the schedule of license fees contained in subsection 2 of Section 1 of said By-Law No. 35.
