Letter was read from Nepearl Clarke Esq., Clerk of the Peace in reference to the County School Assessment, also a copy of the Case prepared by the Court of Sessions, intended to be submitted to the Supreme Court, asking the opinion of the Court on the following point:

Is the Town Council of Dartmouth, or its assessors and collectors legally obliged to assess and collect within the Municipality its proportion of the County School rate

Opinion of

imposed by Sec. 52 of Chap. 32. Revised Statutes, and pay the same over to the County Treasurer of Halifax.

The Recorder's opinion thereon was read as follows:

"I incline strongly to the opinion that Revised Statute Chap. 32. sec. 6. in reference to cases prepared by sessions for Supreme Court was never intended to apply to cases where an ex parte judgment of the Court would determine rights which can only be determined by the Court after full argument, without those guards and checks necessary to protect the parties affected from being prejudiced by a hostile vote of the sessions, or by a case unfairly stated. The decision of the sessions was arrived at by a hostile vote, the most unfair means having been used to deceive the Magistrate from the County and prejudice them against the position taken by the Town of Dartmouth. The case as prepared is most unfairly and only partially stated. I advise that His Honor the Warden should forward his protest to the Clerk of the Peace in order that should the Custos insist upon sending the case to the judges, the latter may have an opportunity of seeing the protest and the grounds upon which the Town resist the arbitrary action of a majority of the sessions."

The question has been submitted to me  
whether a person who has not paid his taxes in  
full, i.e. including the ten per cent where taxes  
has not been paid within the year is entitled to  
vote at the Municipal Elections.

Section 9. of the Charter distinctly states  
that "Any person offering to vote at such election  
shall produce to the presiding officer his receipt for  
poor and county rates for the year previous, and  
the production of such shall decide his eligibility to  
vote at such election."

The receipt here referred to means a  
receipt for the whole amount of taxes, and not a  
partial receipt nor a receipt on account.

The tax not having been paid within  
thirty days after notice a warrant may issue to  
levy for the amount of taxes together with ten per  
cent additional.

The production of any receipt which does not on the face of it show that the whole tax has been paid, and does not purport to be a receipt in full, will not entitle an elector to vote.

"Resolved that the Committee of Public Property be authorized to obtain a plan ask for tenders, and proceed with the alterations to the Mechanics Institute as per sketch submitted to this meeting of Council." passed.

Council Campbell laid on the table the following resolution

of 107 "That the Recorder be instructed to stay legal proceedings for the collection of ten per cent for the past year and that in future but two and one half be deducted or added as the case may be, and that he prevent if possible legal proceedings being taken against the Town by the parties deprived of their franchise".

Condition of Duncan Waddell Property. Councillor Inner called the attention of the Council to the dangerous condition of Duncan Waddell's property on Windmill Road owing to the absence of proper fences.

The Clerk was instructed to notify Mr. Waddell to have a fence erected without delay for the protection of the public.

Taxes due. On motion of Coun<sup>ee</sup> Turner the Town Clerk was instructed to see for all taxes due the Town by non residents.

Clerk of Peace. Letter from Nepean Clarke, Clerk of the Peace was read, notifying the Council of the amount due by the Court for County Rates.

The letter was laid on the table.

Prizes for Schools. On motion of Coun<sup>ee</sup> Turner \$50 was voted for prizes for the children attending the public schools.

- Letter from Miss Major. Letter from Miss Major, asking for an increase in her salary as School teacher read, and referred to School Committee.
- Letter B. H. Eaton. Letter read from B. H. Eaton, asking for payment of D. G. R. Leean's ac<sup>c</sup> for medicine supplied to Patk. Behan a pauper, after some discussion it was resolved that the account be not paid, as it was not authorized by the Poor Committee.
- Wilson (H. H.) (application) Letter read from J. Wilson (H. H.) asking for the appointment of Superintendent of Streets. Referred to Street Committee.
- Trapping of Birds. Letter read from David Falconer Esq. calling attention to the trapping and destruction of small birds now carried on. The Council directed that public notice be given by hand bills warning parties that they would be liable to prosecution if the law was not complied with.
- \$600 for Streets On motion of Councillor Turner seconded by Councillor Mott it was resolved "That the sum of six hundred dollars (\$600) be placed to the credit of the Committee on Streets for Street purposes."
- Bye Laws relative to Dog Tax. On motion of Councillor Turner, seconded by Councillor Mott it was resolved, "That the Recorder be instructed to prepare Bye Laws to give effect to the Law relating to Dog tax."
- \$200. - for P. Prop. On motion of Councillor Turner, seconded by Councillor Mott it was resolved, "That the sum of two hundred dollars, (\$200) be placed to the credit of the Committee on Public Property"
- Mechanics Inst. The plan and specification of the alterations to the Mechanics Institute was laid on the table, and approved by the Council.
- On motion of Councillor Mott seconded by Councillor Stair,

it was resolved "That the Committee on Public Property be authorized to carry out the Plan and Specification as presented to the Council by them this evening for improvements to the Mechanics Institute. Committee to take tenders, and proceed in same manner as was done in the case of the New School House."

The Recorder read the Byelaw respecting the Keeping of Dogs, same was approved by the Council and passed clause by clause, and authorized to be published by posters for the information of the public.

whenever a person may become owner or keeper  
of any dog within the ~~city~~, he shall report  
the fact in writing, as hereinbefore directed,  
in order to have the name of the owner or  
keeper, and the name of the dog registered; and  
any person who shall neglect to comply with this  
section shall forfeit and pay to the ~~Town~~ the  
sum of ~~one~~ dollars, to be recovered at  
the Police Office before the Stipendiary Magistrate  
or ~~Councilor~~ <sup>or other Officer</sup> presiding; and on non-payment  
of the fine, the party convicted shall be  
imprisoned for ten days.

2 A tax of one dollar shall be annually paid for each  
~~and half~~ <sup>and half</sup> dog within the town by the Owner or keeper  
thereof, at the Police Office, on or before the first  
day of August in each year; and upon the  
owner or keeper neglecting or refusing to pay  
the tax herein imposed, he shall be prosecuted

Councillor presiding; and on non-payment

Com<sup>c</sup> Walker, Stairs, and Turner were appointed  
the Committee.

Three petitions from a large number of Rate payers of the Town, praying that Cows be allowed to graze on the Common, Vacant lands, and the roads on the outskirts of the Town.

The petitions were received and laid on the table. The Recorder read a new Bye law in reference to Cows, going at large, which had been prepared at the suggestion of the Police Committee.

Couner Campbell moved seconded by Couner Walker "That it be expedient to discuss the matter to night." motion was put, and lost. 2 voting for the motion and 14 against.

On motion of Couner Fauell, seconded by Couner Stans, it was resolved.

"That the Police be directed to carry out the Law, as it now stands, with regard to cows, &c going at large, until changed by a vote of the Council"

On motion of Couner Scott, seconded by Couner Fauell.  
Resolved. "That in order to save the necessity of issuing debentures at present to pay for repairs to Mechanics Institute, that the Warden be authorized to draw from the Water Fund the sum of thirteen hundred dollars, to be replaced by the issue of the Debentures already authorized"

Resolved further "that the Warden be authorized to borrow from the Water Fund the additional sum of one thousand dollars to be replaced out of the collected taxes for the present year."

Couner Campbell gave notice that he would move at the next meeting,

"That the amendment to the Bye law relative to Cows, &c going at large as proposed by the Recorder be adopted."

Letter from Jas. Thomson, solic to Mrs Lamont in reference to the purchase of the Lamont property was read and laid on the table.

"That the written opinion of the Recorder be taken upon the title of the Lamont Lake property and the right of Mrs. Lamont to convey title to water from Opsall Lake. - to be submitted at a Special meeting to be called by the Warden".

On motion of Councillor Mott seconded by Councillor Stairs it was resolved "that the Clerk of the Peace be notified not to collect the School Rates in the outlying districts and to refund what has been collected."

The Town Clerk having reported the completion of the Assessment Roll for the current year, the Court of Appeal and Revision was appointed to be held on Monday the 30<sup>th</sup> inst. at 2 o'clock p.m.

The purchase of a new fire alarm bell was referred to the Committee appointed to report on the state of the whole fire apparatus.

On motion of Com'r Farrell Weatherbe & Graham's ac for legal expenses amounting to \$25. was ordered to be paid.

Letter from John Staw in reference to his taxes read and laid on the table.

Letter from Adam W. Kay, stating that he had Oil for sale suitable for the Street Lamps, read.  
Referred to Committee on Public Property.

The School Teachers Pay list for month ending 30<sup>th</sup> inst. was ordered to be paid.

Letter read from J. McPain referring to his tender for work on Dahlia St. Referred to Street Committee.

On motion of Com'r Farrell, it was resolved  
"That the School Committee be authorized to have such repairs made to the School Buildings as are necessary, during the ensuing vacation."

Com'r Farrell gave notice that he would move at the next meeting of Council the following resolution:-  
"Whereas persons have been arrested for violating the law and placed by the Police in the lockup for trial, and whereas it has been reported to this Council that the Gaoler has been known to have liberated a prisoner, and that an attempt was lately made to liberate others, without a trial or the payment of any fine, and whereas also the Chief of Police has been known to have discharged a prisoner and to have received from the said prisoner the sum of two dollars which was not reported in the police book nor the fine accounted for at the time, and which was highly improper and criminal on his part, and whereas this practice if continued must be injurious to the proper administration of justice as well as the best interests of the municipality. Resolved therefore 'that the policeman residing in the lockup or having charge of prisoners be instructed not to permit their liberation in future unless the

usual and necessary bond be given for their appearance in Court, or otherwise discharged by due process of law."

Council Fauell having stated that he had a resolution which he wished to put to night, and permission having been granted by vote of the Council he moved seconded by Council Mott,

Resolved "That neither Council nor Warden shall have power to liberate impounded cattle until the usual fine which the Law imposes, shall be paid by the Owner to the Town Clerk or the person in charge of the pound, and that the Town Clerk be instructed to see that this resolution of the Council be faithfully carried out." passed.

Moved by Councillor Walker, seconded by Councillor Campbell "that the Warden be authorized to draw a cheque for the sum of two hundred and fifty dollars appropriated for beautifying grounds surrounding new School House and that the School Committee be instructed to proceed with the work." passed.

Letter from W.H. Newman Read, complaining that the smoke from Scarfis Mill, was a nuisance, and asking that steps be taken to have same abated.  
Referred to Health Warden.

Letter from J. Staw, asking the Council to release judgement against him for taxes.

On motion, Council declined to release judgement.

Moved by Councillor Walker, seconded by Councillor Campbell.  
Resolved "that the sum of two hundred and fifty dollars appropriated for beautifying the School House grounds be drawn from the Water Fund to be replaced out of the collected taxes for the current year" passed.

On motion the Clerk was instructed to notify the Town Assessor to hand in immediately the names of all persons liable for poll tax.

Councillor Walker gave notice of motion as follows:-

Whereas, in the case, the Town of Dartmouth vs. Graham judgment has been given against the Town.

And whereas it is inexpedient to prosecute the case further or involve the Town in greater expenses, therefore Resolved, that His Honor the Recorder be instructed not to

appeal from the decision of the County Judge, and to discontinue all suits that have been commenced for the ten per cent additional taxes".

considerable discussion ensued; after which on motion of Councillor Faurell, seconded by Councillor Mott, it was resolved

"That the Resolution moved by Councillor Walker, with regard to the suits now before the County Court be referred to a committee of three, who with the Recorder shall have power to decide whether the said suits shall be discontinued or otherwise".

Councillors Campbell, Stans, and Turner were appointed to the Committee.

Moved by Councillor Walker, seconded by Councillor Campbell  
 Resolved, "That all that part of Byelaw 32. relating to the ten per cent be suspended, and that the Town Clerk be instructed not to enforce payment of same in the future".

Councillor Walker gave notice of motion as follows:-

Resolved, "That in all cases where ten per cent was collected last year in addition to taxes, the amount be deducted, and credited to the parties on their taxes this year".

Council adjourned to Aug. 20/97 at 7.30 o'clock.

"That having considered the matter they are of opinion that it is now time to take some action upon the subject, and would recommend therefore to the Council that a Committee be appointed to consider the most suitable place for a new Public Cemetery, and also obtain professional advice upon the position of the present cemeteries, whether they are injurious to the health of the Town."

We also gave notice of motion as follows:-

Resolved. That the Assessment Roll for the current year for the respective Wards of the Town be completed under section 30 of the Assessment Bylaw, and now

presented to this Council, be approved by this Council as required by Law.

On motion of Com<sup>ee</sup> Turner, seconded by Com<sup>ee</sup> Mott:

Resolved "That those persons who paid ten percent additional to their last year's taxes (1876) should be refunded the money, as soon as the Town Clerk is in possession of funds for that purpose"

Resolved "That the poll tax as provided by section 4. Chap. 40 of Provincial Acts for 1877 entitled "An Act to amend the Act entitled 'An Act to Incorporate the Town of Dartmouth" be ordered to be levied and collected and the said Poll Tax Book is hereby confirmed"

A long discussion ensued as to construction and enforcement of Bye law relative to Animals, &c, going at large.

The following new Bye Law was read clause

by clause and adopted, and ordered to be sent to the Governor in Council for approval.

Be it ordained, by the Warden and Councillors of the Town of Dartmouth in Council assembled as follows:—

1. That the terms "within the Town of Dartmouth" and "within the Town mentioned in the Bye laws and Ordinances of the Town entitled "Relative to Horses, Cows, Swine, Colts, Oxen, Calves, and Geese" shall not be construed to apply to Cows going on the Dartmouth Common, or on private land (unfenced) where no objection is made by the Owner or proprietor."
2. "No Horses or Cows shall hereafter be allowed to herd on any of the Streets or lanes of the Town even when attended by herde-men."

Letter read from Donald Fraser, relative to herding cattle on Common. Laid on the table.

Letter from W. G. Stekern, Secy. of McGregor Reform Club, asking for the use of the Mechanics Institute for the purpose of holding meetings. Read.

The Clerk was instructed to inform him, that the Building was in the hands of the Contractor, and could not be used for the purpose.

On motion of Comr. Turner, seconded by Comr. Mott Resolved, "That the Recorder be instructed to prepare Bye-laws for Approval of Governor in Council, regulating the imposition of a license fee upon pedlars, hawkers, and retailers of goods on the Streets of Dartmouth, said persons not being ratepayers of the Town."

The Recorder read his opinion relative to the title to the Lamont property, and water course from Topsail Lake.

Considerable discussion on the subject ensued,

On motion of Councillor Mott, seconded by Councillor Walker,

Resolved, "That Councillors Farnell and Turner be a committee with the Recorder to negotiate, and if possible finally settle with Mrs. Lamont for the lake property owned by her"

On motion of Councillor Turner, seconded by Councillor Stan,

Resolved, "That the time for the payment of Dog Tax be extended for one week and no longer"

A number of accounts were passed and the Council adjourned

The Committee appointed to arrange terms of purchase of the Lamont property reported

that Mr. Thompson on behalf of Mrs. Lamont agreed to deduct \$300 from the purchase money to remain in the hands of the Town Council, at an indemnity until all questions touching the supply from "Sopsail" lake were fully settled and determined.

The Report was adopted.

The Recorder reported relative to the deed of the Lamont property, that it was signed by Mrs. Lamont only, and his opinion was that under the will of the late Chas. Lamont, it was the intention of the testator to give an absolute estate in his property to all his children subject to the life estate of his widow. Altho. the widow is authorized in her discretion to execute the necessary deed of conveyance he could not advise the Council to pay over the purchase money unless the heirs concurred in the deed, or an order obtained from the equity Court authorizing and confirming the sale of the property.

On motion of Councillor Walker, seconded by Councillor Stairs  
 Resolved. "That the Committee appointed at last meeting to arrange terms of purchase of Lamont property be authorized to put the necessary bonds in the market and conclude the purchase of said property whenever the Recorder shall report that the title is fully completed."

On motion of Councillor Turner, seconded by Councillor Farrell

Resolved, "That advertisements be inserted in the newspapers, giving notice, that tenders would be received for the loan of Fifteen hundred dollars, being amount required to pay for Town Hall"

The Wardens, Councillor Turner, Farrell and Campbell, with the Recorder were appointed a Committee to prepare an Act to regulate the licensing of Pedlars, Hawkers, &c in the Town to be presented to the Legislature at its next session.

On motion of Councillor Turner seconded by Councillor Mott  
 Resolved. "That the Committee on Public Property be authorized to erect a lamp in front of Town Hall"

Council Inner gave notice of motion as follows:-  
 Resolved, "That the Committee on Public Property be authorized to take tenders for an alteration in the old Town Hall, whereby the building may be made available for the colored School, and an apartment for convenience of the Fire Department."

Read petition from G. J. & Grichon & Others, asking for a Street Lamp to be placed on Grichon Road  
 Referred to Committee on Public Property.

Read petition from J. R. Ormon & Others, asking that Fairbanks St. be repaired.

Referred to Street Committee.

Letter from J. B. Lawlor & Co. in reference to a disputed account read. Referred to Finance Com.

Letter from John Moye relative to his tax, read and referred to Finance Committee.

Letter from W. Waplington, Manager Nail Factory, read praying exemption from taxes for the current year, on the ground that a new enterprise had been started and a large expenditure incurred.

The Council declined to grant the remission of taxes, as it was, <sup>considered</sup> not advisable to establish a precedent.

A Letter from Revd. Butt of Halifax, read, in reference to a charge made by Chief Police for the care of J. O'Connell, a lunatic. On motion of Comr. Farrell the amount charged, £14. was ordered to be returned.

The Public Property Committee were authorized to obtain seats and lamps for the Town Hall.

On motion it was resolved "that the Public Property Committee be authorized to obtain accommodation in one of the City Banks, for the deposit of valuable Town papers, &c."

Council Mott handed in a letter which he had received from Heatherbe Grunen soly of J. & Leadley claiming damages for refusing his vote at the last municipal election.

On motion the Recorder was instructed to defend Council Mott, Presiding Officer for Ward 1 in any suit which may be brought against him for rejection of votes.

The Council directed that John Stan of Halifax be allowed to make his defence in Stipendiary Magistrate Shields Court in the suit for taxes, owing to an error in the date of commons he did not defend the suit, and therefore judgement was given against him.

Council adjourned to Monday 10 Sept. at 7.30 o'clock.

"That a Byelaw be passed by this Council, and sent to the Governor in Council for their approval, authorizing this Council in case of the absence of the Warden to appoint one of their number to perform all the duties pertaining to the office of Warden."

Councillor Farnell laid before the Council a proposition from the Halifax Dispensary, by adopting which, the advantages of that institution would be extended to Dartmouth. After some discussion, it was Resolved on motion of Councillor Turner, seconded by Councillor Farnell, "That the Poor Committee be authorized to make arrangements with the Directors of the Halifax Dispensary to extend the advantages of the institution to Dartmouth, and report to this Council."

On motion of Councillor Farnell, seconded by Councillor Stairs Resolved "That the sum of sixty dollars be appropriated out of the poor funds to pay the Managers of the Halifax Dispensary in case an arrangement can be entered into with them by which the benefits of said Dispensary may be fully extended to Dartmouth."

On motion of Councillor Stans seconded by Councillor Mott.

Resolved. "That the Street Committee be authorized to place the names of the streets upon the street lamps, not to cost more than twenty dollars."

The time for payment of taxes was extended to 10th Nov. after which date, the General Warrant of Distraint would issue.

A number of accounts were passed.

Councillor Campbell gave notice of motion as follows:

Resolved "That such portions of the Common as may not be required as a public park, be laid out as building lots, and put in the market at fixed low rates, payment to extend over ten years proceeds to be used in payment of interest on bonds issued for Water Works, and for improvement of public park"

This ordinance shall not apply to any person resident in the Province bringing produce, provisions, and fuel, nor to any person whomsoever bringing fuel or agricultural produce to the Town.
2. Any person violating this ordinance shall be subject to, and liable to pay a fine of not less than ten dollars nor more than fifty dollars in addition to the license fee, for each offence, to be prosecuted by any party who may inform in the name of the Town of Dartmouth, and on conviction, and on non-payment of the fine imposed, imprisonment for not more than days in the County jail, and the trial of any such offender, and recovery of the fine shall take place at the Police Office in Dartmouth, before the Stipendiary or Councillor presiding, and such fine shall be paid to the Town Clerk.
