this was done in the case under consideration, the city thus becoming the holder of its own bonds for \$7,500. The term "unexpended balances" frequently used of late is one also that requires explanation. The idea generally entertained no doubt is, that the unexpended balances are portions of the Annual assessment for the maintenance of the several departments in the civil service which have not been required; but this is a misapprehension. There is, as is well known, seldom any balance remaining unexpended from any of the departments and never anything of any consequence. The unexpended balance account refers to the amount realized from the five per cent. allowed by law for loss in collecting the General Annual Assessment, a loss, which, owing to the beneficial operation of the lien law, has not since the passing of that law been experienced. The five per cent. on the Annual Assessment amounts to something like \$12,000 per annum, a sum which thus becomes available for any pressing emergency.

The question will naturally arise why a tax should be retained which recent experience has shown to be unnecessary. There are, however, good reasons for its retention. The city, as every one conversant with civic affairs knows, is always in want of money, and often for most unexpected demands. The existence of this surplus, beside other advantages, occasionally obviates the necessity of an application to the Legislature for authority to borrow money, a necessity which is always attended with delay, and sometimes with inconvenience. In the case of the County of Halifax, previously quoted, part of an old claim to the amount of \$10,000 was paid out of this five per cent., or unexpended balance fund. Another instance occurs in making the annual estimate for 1887-8, when the assessment was reduced by \$8.600, taken from the fund alluded Again, in the present civic year of 1889-90, the total to. assessment of \$289,246.63 was lessened by funds taken from unexpended balances to the extent of \$21,246.83, and the rate per centum, which otherwise would have been \$1,33, was thereby reduced to \$1.24. There cannot, it appears to me, be any reasonable objection to such a mode of appropriation.

The rates and taxes, as already intimated, continue to be collected satisfactorily. There is but a trifle of old city rates now uncollected, excepting, of course, the balance remaining for the year ending 30th April, 1889. The total assessment for that year, exclusive of water rates, was \$286,438.75, of which, including the amount for loss in collection, there remained on the books on 1st May, 1889, \$53,785.67. The greater part, if not the whole of this balance, will, I have no doubt, be eventually collected.

The amount for water rates and agreements collected in the year ending 30th April, 1889, which is practically the revenue for the year, was \$69,129.12, about the same as in the year just previous. The interest paid by the Water Department for the same period was \$45,311.14. This leaves for working expenses and contingencies \$23,817.98. The amount actually paid for maintenance last year was \$16,387.91.

The revenue of the city derived from liquor and other licenses, fines at the Police Court, fees at the Police Office, rents of City property, City Marshal's fees, and the like, will again fall short of the estimate, but, as before, the deficiency will probably be met by excess in some other items.

Allusion was made in the last Annual Report to a balance due the Merchants' Bank on a loan of \$60,000 contracted in 1882, and it was expected that the proceeds arising from the sale of some lots at Freshwater would have been sufficient to pay this balance. The lots, however, did not realize as much as was anticipated, and there is consequently a balance still due the Bank upon this transaction of \$259.62.

By an Act of the Legislature passed on the 10th April, 1888, a superannuation fund was instituted for the benefit of the Police Department. The superannuation part of the arrangement cannot come into operation for some time, that is to say, until a considerable fund shall have accrued as provided for in the Act. In the meantime a certain specified proportion is deducted from the pay of the men every month, and by the Marshal paid to the City Treasurer, who deposits the amounts so paid on a separate account in the Merchants' Bank. The amount on deposit on 30th June, 1889, interest included, had already reached \$1,237.32. The following are the valuations for assessment for 1889-90, taken from the books in the Assessor's office :---
