The number of books issued for home use during the year was 52,321. The number of books used in the reading room for reference and other purposes was 11,671.

Total number issued during the year, 63,992.

The magazines and daily papers in the reading room were engaged by a great many strangers as well as our own readers. The new rule of having the new magazines on the table a month before issue is gratefully appreciated by everybody. The new chairs also added greatly to their comfort.

The largest issue of books in one day, Saturday March 27th, was 614. The smallest issue in one day, October 13th, was 37. (Being one of our stormiest days.)

The number of books repaired at the Library by Mr. Carson during the months June, July and October was 1167.

April 5th, Mr. Shiers, the new book-binder, was engaged to do work at the library, and has been doing the binding and repairing in a very satisfactory manner, and has repaired 385 books up to date.

The number of catalogues sold at 5 cents each was 163—\$8.15. The number of Catalogues sold at 10 cents each was 204—\$20.40. Total amount for Catalogues \$28.55.

# LICENSE INSPECTOR'S OFFICE.

CITY HALL HALIFAX, N. S. March 31st, 1897.

*To His Worship the Mayor.*

I beg to submit the annual Report for the License year of 1896-7, ending the 15th March, 1897:—

There are one hundred and twenty-eight applications for licenses filed in my office during the year. Of this number, the Council granted seventy-two (72) shops, thirty-four hotels, one wholesale; and refused twelve shops, five hotels four wholesales. Total number of licenses granted one hundred and seven (107). Except one hotel, all the others were issued.

During the year sixty-three persons were before the Court for violation of the Act. Of this number forty-seven were convicted, sixteen dismissed. Twenty-nine were licensed thirty-four unlicensed. Two convictions appealed to a higher Court, one left the country before judgment was given, one went to prison.

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## REPORT OF Superintendent of the Common and Public Gardens.

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*To Chairman and Commissioners Common and Gardens:*

GENTLEMEN,—I beg to submit for your information a short report of the work on the Common and Gardens, for the past year.

We are now engaged in filling in the low ground and shrubbery on the south side of the Gardens adjoining Spring Garden Road, with street scrapings and earth, raising informal mounds and ornamenting them with shrubs, trailing vines and ferns, which will relieve the flatness of the lawn, add a bold background and also hide our heavy unsightly fence.

We had the ponds partially cleaned out and wall repaired and as we have been of late years greatly troubled with pond weed which spoils the effect of the water in mid-summer, we tried as an experiment a few barrels of salt which acted fairly for the season, but the weed started again the next year.

The season was very rainy and therefore our floral display was not up to the standard of other years. On the 19th of Oct., we suffered great damage through the flood which overflowed the Common, Gardens and pond, tore up our walks and washed gravel into the lower pond which gave us considerable labor to restore to their proper state.

Besides the one hundred cast iron and hardwood Settees purchased the previous year—we had contracted for fifty 8 feet ones, which is an improvement on the old dilapidated seats of all makes. These will make the Gardens look comfortable and accomodating.

The first greenhouse erected in 1875 was completely used up after doing good service, and had to be partially rebuilt. New

side walls, posts, sills, doors, staging, glazing and finished by two coats of paint, all of which has been done by contract to our general satisfaction.

The propogating house 40 x 12 had to be taken down, as frame, sills and sashes were decayed, and the whole was rebuilt.

#### MULGRAVE PARK.

The fences have been repaired and white-washed and twenty new iron and hardwood seats provided.

The other parks got the usual attention, cleaning, mowing and repairing.

#### THE COMMON.

We had all the large stones picked up and raked, also all kinds of rubbish such as tins, old boots, stove pipes, etc., carted away.

The usual work all around is the same year after year, re-turfing, digging, planting, hoeing, weeding, mowing, pruning, repairing buildings and fences, etc.

I have to thank the Chairman and Commissioners for the kind interest and help given me at all times.
