MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT made the thirtieth day of November 1899, between, The Commanding Royal Engineer in Canada on behalf of Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the War Department, (hereinafter called "the said Secretary of State," which expression wherever hereinafter used shall include his successors in office, where the context so requires or admits) of the one part, and the Mayor and Corporation of the City of Halifax, Nova Scotia, (hereinafter called "the Tenant," which expression wherever hereinafter used shall include his executors, administrators, and assigns, where the context so requires or admits) of the other part. Witnesseth, that the Tenant having applied to the said Secretary of State for permission to moor a floating bath partly on the water lot of the War Department property at North Ordnance Wharf, Halifax, Nova Scotia, the encroachment being more particularly described in the Schedule hereto, the said Secretary of State has consented to grant such permission on the special conditions on second page and on the terms and in manner following, to which both parcies hereto agree, namely :-

1. The position and direction of the said encroachment shall be fixed, and the works in connection therewith carried out and executed under the supervision and to the entire satisfaction of the Commanding Royal Engineer of the District for the time being, at the entire cost of the Tenant.

2. The Tenant shall pay to the said Secretary of State by way of acknowledgment that such permission exists by leave only of the said Secretary of State, and not by any other right or title whatsoever, the sum of one shilling per annum, on the first day of January in every year during the continuance of this Agreement, without any deduction whatsoever, the first payment of one year's rent or acknowledgement, to become due and be payable in advance on the thirtieth day of November, 1899.

3. The said Secretary of State, or any person acting under him or on his behalf or by his direction, shall not be liable for any accident of whatever nature which shall or may occur to the said encroachment or the works in connection therewith, nor shall the Tenant be allowed or permitted to enter upon the property of the War Department to execute any repairs thereof that may be necessary without having first obtained the written consent of the said Commanding Royal Engineer, nor at any time other than that specified in such written consent, and all such repairs shall be executed, and on each occasion of execution of repairs the War Department property shall be restored and made good to the satisfaction of the said Commanding Royal Engineer, at the entire cost of the Tenant.

4. This Agreement may be terminated at any time by the said Secretary of State by a notice in writing signed by him, or some agent duly authorized by him in that behalf, and given to the Tenant, or sent by post to him at his last known place of abode or business. And immediately upon such notice being so given or sent, the permission hereinbefore granted shall be deemed to be withdrawn without payment of any compensation to the Tenant, who shall thereupon forthwith proceed, at his own cost, and to the satisfaction of the said Commanding Royal Engineer, to remove the said encroachment and the works in connection therewith, and to restore the War Department property in connection with the said encroachment to the condition in which it was before the commencement of the said works. And in case the Tenant shall neglect or fail within one calendar month from the giving or sending of such notice to remove the said encroachment and the works in connection there with and to restore the War Department property as aforesaid, the said Secretary of State may, at the expense in all respects of the Tenant, remove the said encroachment and works and restore the said property to its former condition, and all costs and expenses incurred in such removal and restoration shall on demand be paid by the said Tenants to the said Secretary of State.

Special Conditions.—The City Authorities will take steps to prevent bathers from landing on the₈War Department enclosure. The Imperial Troops shall at all times enjoy the same facilities for bathing as the citizens of Halifax, N. S.

CITY HEALTH BOARD.

Amendments to the Rules and Regulations for the guidance of Architects, Plumbers, Householders and others using the water supply.

HALIFAX, N. S., January 30th, 1899.

At a meeting of the City Health Board in and for the City of Halifax, held this day, the following Rules and Regulations were made and passed in pursuance of Section 507 of the City Charter, and Chapter 47 of the Acts of 1895, in addition to an amendment of the Rules already made :

Hereafter no person or member of any company or any employee or apprentice of such person or company shall do or perform any work authorized by these rules, nor shall any such person or member of any corporation direct or instruct any employee or apprentice to do or perform any such work until the owner or his agent shall have first obtained the permit and filed the plan and specification mentioned in Rules 27 to 31, both inclusive of the Rules hereby amended.

Section 38 of the Rules hereby amended is repealed, and Section 52 of said Rules shall apply to all Rules heretofore passed or hereafter to be passed by this Board.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR STREET CLEANING, SECTION MEN, 1898.

One man to be detailed to collect paper, tins, iron hoops and everything of a similar character in that portion of the City bounded by Inglis Street, Tower Road, Park Street, Agricola Street and North Street.

The outside portion of district to be covered at least once a week, the business portions of the City and more important residential streets to be covered as often as possible, the central streets—Barrington Street, Granville Street, Hollis Street, Spring Garden Road and Gottingen Street, to be covered daily.

The man detailed to have fixed points at which he is to leave his bag for collection, so that the driver of the team will not have to search for him. Four (4) Section men to be detailed who are to sweep and keep as clean as possible, the crossings and gutters in their district. The middle of the street will be swept by the horse sweeper once a week, if possible.

- No. 1 Section man will cover—Lockman Street, from Bell's Lane to North Street, and Water Street from Fawson Street to Gray's Lane.
- No. 2 Section man should be the best man of the four, and will have as his district Hollis Street, from Bishop Street to Water Street; Granville Street, from Salter Street to Water Street; Barrington Street, from Spring Garden Road to Bell's Lane.
- No. 3 Section man will have Argyle Street from Duke Street to Jacob Street; Jacob Street, from Barrington Street to Brunswick Street; Brunswick Street, from Jacob Street to Cogswell Street; Cogswell Street, north gutter, from Brunswick Street to Gottingen Street, and Gottingen Street from Cogswell Street to Uniacke Street.
- No. 4 Section man will have Pleasant Street, from Spring Garden Road to Inglis Street; Spring Garden Road, from Pleasant Street to Park Street; Park Street, from Spring Garden Road to Inglis Street; and Inglis Street from Park Street to Pleasant Street.

The rate of wages paid to the men will depend on the manner in which they do their work. Each man and his work will be watched closely, and each man will be treated as he deserves.

There must be no holidays left between adjoining districts, and no dispute between the men as to how far they are to go; but each man must clean to the extreme boundary of his district.

One team will be attached to Sections 1 and 3, and 1 team to Sections 2 and 4.

The patrol cart-man must deposit his bags within the districts described, and the cart attached to the district will remove them, and return the bags to the patrol cart-man, as may be arranged.

ANNUAL REPORT

OF

GOVERNOR OF CITY PRISON.

HALIFAX, May 1st, 1899.

The Chairman and Members of City Prison Committee :

Gentlemen,-I have the honor to submit my report on the affairs of the City Prison for the twelve months ending 30th April, 1899.

It gives me much pleasure to be able report that the conduct of the prisoners during the year, with two exceptions, has been very good, there being but one attempt, and that unsuccessful, to escape.

There has been an unusually small number of female prisoners during the year, and the more productive labor of male prisoners has been diverted at a loss to the Prison to the cooking, washing and other house work generally done by women, there being not enough females to do the necessary mending, &c.

Two fire extinguishers, cost \$30.00, have been purchased during the year. These, while useful in their way, are but poor substitutes for a water supply needed not only for fire purposes, but for domestic and sanitary uses. I must ask to be excused for again referring to this matter, but an unfortunate accident which occurred to Keeper Wm. Higlett, while water was being brought to the Prison, during a gale of wind, brings the subject to attention at this time. Mr. Higlett sustained severe injuries by the large gates being blown to on him. I may add that owing to the City Medical officer not being sent for the Keeper, who is a poor but very deserving man has had to pay the expense of his treatment by another physician—a fact which the Committee may perhaps give some consideration, to the advantage of a faithful servant of the City.

CITY PBISON REPORT.

In justice to the keepers generally, I beg to say that they have all taken more than the usual interest in the work of the Prison during the year, and are entitled to favorable mention.

The tables herewith will show the number of offences and commitments, the estimated value of prisoners' house farm and stone shed labor, with the value of horse work; the quantity and estimated value of clothing, &c., the number and estimated value of horses, carts, &c., the estimated value of farm implements, the quantity of stone and estimated value of implements in stone shed, the estimated value of stock and tools in work shops, and the quantity and estimated value of farm produce, &c.

I have to return my own and the Matron's thanks to the Chairman and Members of the Committee for their uniform courtesy and for appreciation of our efforts to properly manage the Prison. A careful supervision of the management is invited, for our own satisfaction, and for a guarantee to the citizens that their interests are protected.

REPORT OF LICENSE INSPECTOR.

HALIFAX, N. S., May 15th, 1899.

To His Worship the Mayor and Council of the City of Halifax:

Gentlemen:-

I have the honor to submit for your information the Annual Report for the License year 1898-1899, ending on the 15th day of March 1899.

There were filed in the office during the year one hundred and thirty-two (132) applications for licenses. Of this number one hundred and twenty-one (121) were granted and eleven (11) refused. Of those granted seven (7) were Wholesales, three (3) Brewers, seventyfive (75) Shops, thirty-six (36) Hotels. Of the number granted two (2) shops and one (1)wholesale were not issued, and one (1) hotel license was cancelled by the Supreme Court

During the year there were sixty-seven (67) persons before the Court for violations of the Liquor License Act. Forty-two (42) were licensed and twenty-five (25) unlicensed, fifty-three (53) convicted and fourteen (14) dismissed. Of those convicted thirty-two (32) were licensed and twenty-one (21) unlicensed, fifty (50) paid fines, and three (3) convictions appealed to higher courts, cases still pending,
