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RULES AND REGULATIONS

TO AMEND THE RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR THE GUIDANCE OF ARCHITECTS, PLUMBERS, HOUSEHOLDERS AND OTHERS USING THE WATER SUPPLY, AND THE RULES AMENDING THE SAME.

Be it enacted and ordained as follows:

Sections 33 to 52, both inclusive, of the Rules of the City Board of Health hereby amended, as also the Rules previously amending the said sections, are hereby repealed and the following substituted therefor:

33. A Board of Plumbing Examiners is hereby constituted, to consist of the City Engineer and the City Inspector of Plumbing. The Board shall be called together by the City Engineer (who shall be Chairman of the Board) at such times as the Board of Health may direct.

34. No person shall do or perform any plumbing work as a master plumber in the City of Halifax unless he is duly licensed to perform the same, and is registered as such in the office of the Board of Works for said city, and the person obtaining such license shall be known as a "Master Plumber," and shall pay for said license to the Board of Works the sum of ten dollars.

35. To entitle any person to a license under the next preceding section, he shall be of the full age of twenty-one years, and have a place of business as a plumber in the City of Halifax, and shall furnish to the Board of Plumbing Examiners sufficient evidence that he is himself a practical and experienced plumber, and his license as a master plumber, when issued, shall be kept in a conspicuous place in his place of business.

36. Every person before doing any plumbing work or business in the said city for or on account of himself or any master plumber shall be a practical and experienced plumber and furnish the Board of Plumbing Examiners sufficient evidence that he is capable of properly doing and performing plumbing work in said city, and if the Board is satisfied of his competency to perform said work, they shall cause his name to be registered in the said office of the Board of Works and give him a certificate of competency as a journeyman plumber, after which he shall be at liberty to do such plumbing work, but not before.

37. Every person desiring a license as a master plumber, or as journeyman plumber, shall file a petition in writing with the Clerk of Works, giving the name of the applicant, and if the applicant is applying for a master plumber's license he shall state in his petition his age and place of business in said city, and the said petition shall be accompanied with the bond hereinafter referred to.

38. Any change in the location of the business of a master plumber shall be promptly reported to the said Clerk of Works.

39. Any journeyman plumber desiring to become a master plumber shall first comply with these rules and regulations as to master plumbers, and no journeyman plumber shall do business as a master plumber until he has obtained a master plumber's license, notwithstanding anything in these rules and regulations.

40. Any master plumber or journeyman plumber who furnishes satisfactory evidence to the Board of Plumbing Examiners that he has carried on the business as a practical and experienced master or journeyman plumber in the City of Halifax for not less than four (4) years next previous to November 29th, 1897, shall be entitled to receive a license or registration without examination.

41. All licensed master plumbers shall be held responsible for all acts of their employees for work done in connection with their plumbing business in respect to which such license is granted.

42. Every licensed master plumber shall on the first day of every month report to the City Engineer, upon printed forms to be supplied at the City Engineer's Office, the number, nature and extent of all new plumbing fixtures placed by him or his journeyman plumber in any building in said city, but they shall not be required to make returns of any old fixtures renewed, except water closets and urinals.

43. Every master plumber shall only employ journeyment plumbers to do said plumbing work, but said work may be done and performed by any practical plumber under the guidance and direction of a journeyman plumber or master plumber then present directing the work.

44. Every master plumber, before obtaining a master plumber's license, shall file a bond with the Clerk of Works in the penal sum of two hundred dollars conditioned for the faithful performance of his duty as a master plumber and for his not permitting or allowing any plumbing work that he may be called upon to do to be performed by any person in his employ except by such persons as may be authorized to do plumbing work under these rules and regulations, and for his not violating any of the terms and conditions of said rules and regulations or any other rules or regulations in force in the city respecting plumbing, drainage, sanitary matters and the city water works.

45. No person shall carry on business in the said city as a master plumber unless he is the holder of the license herein mentioned, nor shall any journeyman plumber do or perform any plumbing work until he has obtained his certificate under these rules and regulations.

46. No person shall be allowed, without having first obtained a permit from the City Engineer, to open or shut off the street stopcock connected with the service supplying any premises or buildings, unless in case of urgent necessity to prevent loss or damage from flooding, and shall in every such case leave the stopstock as he found the same, and any person who shall commit any damage or injury to any stopcock in the service pipes of the department shall be liable for the amount of any such damage, in addition to any penalty imposed for the violation of these rules.

47. When any old fixtures or plumbing requires renewal the work shall be done in accordance with these rules and regulations, as far as they apply, but it shall not be necessary to take out any old work which, in the opinion of the Plumbing Inspector, is in good sanitary condition. In every case where in the opinion of the City Engineer and Plumbing Inspector the enforcement of any rule or rules respecting plumbing is impracticable or inadvisable, they shall have power to modify or suspend any such rule or rules to meet the exigencies of the particular case.

48. The City Engineer, the Foreman of Water Works, or any Inspector appointed for that purpose, shall have the right at proper hours of the day, and upon reasonable notice given and request

made upon the owners, to enter upon and have free access to all parts of any building in the City of Halifax in which water from the City Water Works is delivered or consumed.

49. The City Health Board shall have the power at any time to cancel any master plumber's license or any journeyman plumber's certificate for cause and thereupon all rights of said master plumber or journeyman plumber to do any plumbing work under these rules or regulations shall cease and determine.

50. The license to master plumbers shall expire on the 31st day of December in each and every year, but they may be renewed by the City Board of Health on the recommendation of the Board of Plumbing Examiners, and the master plumber shall pay one dollar (\$1.00) for each and every renewal.

51. The City Health Board shall from time to time, as occasion may require, on the nomination of the City Engineer, appoint such inspectors of plumbing as may be found necessary, but no person shall be eligible for such appointment who has not passed a satisfactory examination for proficiency in both practice and theory of plumbing and drainage before the Board of Plumbing Examiners.

52. Such inspector or inspectors shall be under the supervision of the City Engineer, and shall be attached to the office of the said City Engineer, and shall be paid such salary as the City Council determines.

53. All work contemplated in these regulations shall be done by a licensed master plumber, or by a certified journeyman plumber in the employ of such licensed master plumbers, or as provided in rule 43, and shall be subject to the inspection, supervision and approval of the City Engineer or an inspector appointed by the City Health Board for that purpose, and all faulty or defective work which is at any time discovered shall be made satisfactory to the said engineer or inspector, as the case may be, and when found satisfactory the certificate shall issue to the plumber at the expiration of (30) days from date of inspection, unless in the meantime such work has become faulty or defective

54. Hereafter no person or member of any company or employee or apprentice of such person or company shall do or perform any work authorized by these rules, nor shall any such person or member of any corporation direct or instruct any employee or
apprentice to do or perform any such work until the owner or his agent shall have first obtained the permit and filed the plan and specification mentioned in rules 27 to 31, both inclusive, of the rules hereby amended.

55. Every person violating any of the rules and regulations of the Board of Health shall be liable to a penalty of not less than five (\$5.00) dollars, nor more than eighty (\$80.00) dollars for each offence on summary conviction before the stipendiary magistrate, and in default of payment to imprisonment in the city prison for a term not to exceed ninety (90) days.

Sec. 1. sub-section H, is hereby repealed and the following substituted: No trap vent pipe shall be less than three inches in diameter where it passes through the roof, and all vent pipes after leaving the trap must continue to rise above the bottom of any fixtures vented before being connected with or to any other vent, and vent pipes must pass out through the roof or be connected with the soil pipe.

Section 4 The first sentence is struck out and the following substituted: Every connection between lead and cast iron pipe shall be made with brass ferrules, properly gasketted, leaded and caulked into the soil pipe, and every connection between lead and wrought iron pipe shall be made with brass soldering nipples, having properly wiped joints.

LEASES.

MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT made the eighth day of Augasts 1900, between the Commanding Royal Engineer in Canada on behalf of Her Majesty's principal Secretary of State for the War Department (hereinafter called "the said Secretary of. State," which expression wherever hereinafter used shall include his successors in office, where the context so requires or admits of the one part, and the Corporation of the City of Halifax, Nova Scotia, hereinafter called "the Tenant," which expression wherever hereinafter used shall include his executors, administrators and assigns, where the context so requires or admits, of the other part. Witnesseth that the tenant having applied to the said Secretary of State for permission to carry a sewer across a portion of the War Department property near Green Bank, a part of Point Pleasant Park, the said encroachment being more particularly described in the schedule hereto, the said Secretary of State has consented to grant such permission on the terms and in manner following, to which both parties hereto agree, namely :--

1. The position and direction of the said encroachment shall be fixed, and the works in connection therewith carried out and executed under the supervision and to the entire satisfaction of the Commanding Royal Engineer of the district for the time being, at the entire cost of the tenant.

2. The tenant shall pay to the said Secretary of State by way of acknowledgment that such permission exists by leave only of the said Secretary of State, and not by any other right or title whatsoever, the sum of one pound per annum, on the first day of January in every year during the continuance of this agreement, without any deduction whatsoever, the first payment of one year's rent or acknowledgment to become due and be payable in advance on the thirtieth day of August, 1900.

3. The said Secretary of State, or any person acting under him, or on his behalf, or by his direction, shall not be liable for any accident of whatever nature which shall, or may occur, to the said sewer, or the works in connection therewith, nor shall the tenant be allowed or permitted to enter upon the property of the War Department to execute any repairs thereof that may be necessary without having first obtained the written consent of the said Commanding Royal Engineer, nor at any time other than that specified in such written consent, and all such repairs shall be executed, and on each occasion of execution of repairs the War Department property shall be restored and made good to the satisfaction of the said Commanding Royal Engineer, at the entire cost of the tenant.

4. This agreement may be terminated at any time by the said Secretary of State by a notice in writing signed by him, or some agent duly authorized by him in that behalf, and given to the

tenant, or sent by post to him at his last known place of abode or business. And immediately upon such notice being so given or sent the permission hereinbefore granted shall be deemed to be withdrawn without payment of any compensation to the tenant, who shall thereupon forthwith proceed, at his own cost, and to the satisfaction of the said Commanding Royal Engineer, to remove the said encroachment and to restore the War Department property in connection with the said encroachment to the condition in which it was before the commencement of the said works. And in case the tenant shall neglect or fail within one calendar month from the giving or sending of such notice to remove the said encroachment and the works in connection therewith, and to restore the War Department property as aforesaid, the said Secretary of State may, at the expense in all respects of the tenant, remove the said encroachment and works and restore the said property to its former condition, and all costs and expenses incurred in such removal and restoration shall on demand be paid by the tenant to the said Secretary of State.

5. The permission of the said Secretary of State for War is granted only on the condition that the above encroachment shall be removed within six months, if a city sewer close to the south side of the Queen's wharf is not extended to below low water mark to the satisfaction of the Commanding Royal Engineer before the 31st December, 1901, and the said corporation of the City of Halifax hereby agrees to remove the said encroachment within the time allowed.

As witness whereof the parties hereto have hereunto their hands and seals subscribed and set the day and year first above mentioned.

Permission to Erect Fence at Spruce Hill Lake.

HALIFAX, August 27th, 1900.

I, Archibald Kielston, hereby agree that I will remove the fence to be erected by me on City property near the Narrows, at Spruce Hill Lake, within twenty-four hours after receipt of notice from the City Engineer to do so, and that I will not make any claim for or in consequence of my occupation of City property, while the fence is maintained or at any time afterwards.

Description of Properties acquired by the City of Halifax during 1900-1901.

FENWICK STREET, South Side.—Two lots of land on the south side of Fenwick street, near Queen street, expropriated from Mrs. Eliza Smith and the Misses M and A. MacMillan, for the sum of six hundred dollars (\$600.00) for the first lot, and three hundred dollars (\$300.00) for the other, by resolution of Council of May 9th, 1900, for the purpose of completing the grading and widening of Fenwick street. The description in the resolution of Council is as follows :—

All that lot, piece or parcel of land situate on the south side of Fenwick street, in the City and County of Halifax, said to belong to Mrs. Eliza Smith, the said lot being more particularly described as follows :- Beginning at a point on the south side line of Fenwick street, distant eighty-three (83) feet, more or less, westerly from the intersection of the said south side line of Fenwick street with the west side line of Queen street, the said point being the intersection of the eastern boundary line of the property now under description with the southern boundary line of Fenwick street : thence running in a southerly direction by the said eastern boundary line for a distance of forty-two (42) feet, more or less, or until it meets the southern boundary line of the said property; thence in a westerly direction by the said southern boundary line for a distance of thirty (30) feet, more or less, or until it meets the western boundary line of the said property; thence in a northerly direction by the said western boundary line for a distance of forty two (42) feet, more or less, or until it meets the aforesaid south boundary line of Fenwick street; thence easterly by the said south boundary line of Fenwick street for a distance of thirty (30) feet, more or less, to the place of beginning. The said lot being shown, colored red, on a plan entitled, "Plan shewing land required for the widening of Fenwick street," signed by F. W. W. Doane, City-Engineer, dated March 2nd, 1900, and filed in the City Engineer's office, at Halifax, N.S., as plan No. 1232.

Also all that lot, piece or parcel of land situated on the south side of Fenwick street in the City and County of Halifax adjoining the above described lot of land to the westward, and said to belong to the Misses M. & A. MacMillan, the said lot being more particularly described as follows :- Beginning at a point on the south side line of Fenwick street formed by the intersection of the west boundary line of the above described property with the said south line of Fenwick street; thence in a southerly direction by the eastern boundary line of the property now under description for a distance of one hundred feet (100) more or less, or until it meets the southern boundary line of the said property; thence westerly by the said southern boundary line for a distance of eighty feet (80) more or less, or until it meets the western boundary line of the said property : thence northerly by the said western boundary line for a distance of one hundred feet (100) more or less, to the south side line of Fenwick street; thence easterly by the said south side line of Fenwick street for a distance of eighty feet (80) more

or less, to the place of beginning. The said lot being shewn colored blue on plan entitled, "Plan showing land required for the widening of Fenwick street." signed by F. W. W. Doane, City Engineer, dated March 2nd, 1900, and filed in the City Engineer's office at Halifax, N. S., as plan No. 1232.

LONG LAKE, North Side.—This piece of land was acquired from William Yeadon and wife by deed bearing date of 31st day of July, 1900, for the sum of one hundred and fifty dollars (\$150.00). The said deed is recorded in the Registry of Deeds Office, book 344, pages 396, 397 and 398. The description in the deed is as follows :—

All that certain tract of land in the County of Halifax lying on the west side of the North West Arm, beginning at the eastern corner of lot No. 1 in Sutlin Manor (so-called); thence running north thirty-five degrees west forty-five chains; thence south fiftyfive degrees west twenty six chains, or until it meets the shore of Beaver Lake; thence easterly by the shore of said lake to the northern boundary of lot No. 1 aforesaid; and thence by the northern side of said lot to the place of beginning, containing in the whole (by estimation) one hundred acres, more or less.

Always excepting thereout and therefrom forty-three acres and one-tenth of an acre, more or less, sold to the said City of Halifax Water Works, as will fully appear by the conveyance of the same on record. Being all the land conveyed to the said William Yeadon by John H. Christman and Harriett C., his wife, and Charles G. Clarke and May A, his wife, by a certain indenture bearing date the twenty-sixth day of November, A. D. 1877, duly recorded in the Registry of Deeds at Halifax in libro. 210, folios 300 and 301.

WILLOW STREET.—This street, between Robie and Windsor Streets, was accepted by the City Council, by resolution dated June 18th, 1900. The description in the resolution is as follows:—

All that lot, piece or parcel of land situate, lying and being in the City and County of Halifax, the said lot being more particularly described as follows:

Beginning at a point on the west side line of Robie Street distant 200 feet from the intersection of the said west side line of Robie St; with the south side line of North Street; thence westwardly by a line parallel to said south line of North Street and distant therefrom 200 feet until it comes to the east side line of Windsor Street;

thence southerly by the said east side line of Windsor Street for a distance of 64 feet, more or less; thence easterly by a line parallel to the first above described line and distant 60 feet therefrom until it comes to the west side line of Robie Street; thence northerly by the said west side line of Robie Street for a distance of 64 feet, more or less, to the place of beginning. The said lot being shown as Willow Street on Plan Number 973, filed on the 8th of March, 1898, in the City Engineer's office at Halifax, N. S., which plan was traced from Plan Number 40 on file in the Crown Land Office at Halifax, N. S.

WINDSOR STREET.—A piece of land known as "Cogswell Park" on the east side of Windsor Street, deeded to the City by the Rev. William H. L. Cogswell and wife for the sum of one dollar (\$1.00). The deed is recorded in the Registry of Deeds Office in Book Number 344, pages 398 and 399. The description in the deed is as follows:

All that certain lot, piece or parcel of land situate, lying and being in the city of Halifax aforesaid, bounded and described as follows:—Beginning on the castern side of Windsor Street at the corner formed by the eastern side of said street and the western side of Parker Street; thence running northerly along the eastern side of Windsor Street, four hundred and forty feet four inches, to the southern side of Welsford Street; thence easterly along the southern side of Welsford Street one hundred and fitty-cight feet to the west side of Parker Street; thence southerly along the west side of Parker Street four hundred and seven feet to the place of beginning, being a triangular piece of land marked on a plan of lands belonging to the Estate of Charles Cogswell, made by James H. Austen, Deputy Surveyor, and dated the 16th day of April, A. D. 1898, said piece of land having been devised by the said Charles Cogswell to the said William H. L. Cogswell.

YOUNG AVENUE.—A strip of land one hundred and sixty-nine feet by ten feet on the east side of Young Avenue at the south-east corner of Inglis street, acquired from the executors of the estate of John S. MacLean, for the purpose of widening Young Avenue to the width of eighty feet. The deed is recorded in the Registry of Deeds office book 342, pages 456, 457 and 458. The description in the deed is as follows :—

All that lot, piece or parcel of land situate, lying and being on

the east side of Young Avenue, in the City and County of Halifax. the said lot being more particularly described as follows :- Beginning at a point formed by the intersection of the east side line of Young Avenue with the south side line of Inglis street, thence in a southerly direction by the said east side line of Young Avenue for a distance of one hundred and sixty-nine feet, more or less, or until it comes to the northern boundary line of property lately purchased by J. F. Kenny, Esquire, thence in an easterly direction by the northern boundary line for a distance of ten feet, thence in a northerly direction for a distance of one hundred and sixty-nine feet, more or less, or until it comes to the south side line of Inglis street; thence westerly by the said south side line of Inglis street for a distance of ten feet to the place of beginning. The above described lot being all that portion of lots Nos. 1, 3 and 4 of the division of property belonging to the estate of John S. MacLean. lying to the westward of a line drawn parallel to the centre line of Young Avenue, and distant forty feet easterly therefrom.
