THIS AGREEMENT, made this tenth day of July, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and four, between John S. Parker, Senior and John S. Parker, Junior, both of the City of Halifax, Mill Owners, doing business under the name of J. S. Parker and Son, of the First Part; and the City of Halifax, a Municipal Corporation, of the Second Part;

WHEREAS, The said J, S. Parker and Son have made an application to the City of Halifax to lay a service pipe from the main water pipe running through the City field on Kempt Road to their premises on Longard Road;

Now THIS AGREEMENT WITNESSETH, That the said Parties of the First Part will lay the service pipe from the main pipe aforesaid at sufficient depth to their premises on Longard Road at their own cost and charges and keep and maintain the same at their own expense, and the said Party of the Second Part will place a meter upon the service pipe in order to register the quantity of water to be used through the same by the said Parties of the First Part, they the said parties of the First Part hereby agreeing to pay the said Party of the Second Part the usual water meter rates for all water passed through the said meter to their premises.

AND IT IS UNDERSTOOD AND AGREED, By and between the parties hereto and the permission to tap the said main water pipe is upon this express condition that the Committee on Works of the City of Halifax, may at any and all times cut off said supply of water and discontinue the same whenever the said committee shall from time to time think proper or discontinue the same entirely, and it is understood and agreed that the said City of Halifax shall not be in any way responsible for any cost, loss, damages or expenses in supplying said water or discontinuing the same or from any cause whatever if the City fails to supply water from the said main through the said service pipe.

AND IT IS FURTHER AGREED That the said parties of the first part shall pay for the use of the meter and that the said parties of the first part will abide by and conform to any law relating to the City of Halifax or any rule, ordinance or regulation of the said committee of the City Council relating to the use of water by the citizens.

AND IT IS FURTHER UNDERSTOOD AND AGREED That if in the opinion of the City Engineer it is in the interests of the City to remove said meter or to turn the water off he shall be at liberty to do so.

When the City was first incorporated, and until April 12th 1849, the Corporation consised of the Mayor, six Alderman and twelve Common Councillors, the Mayor being elected by the Alderman and Common Councillors from among the Alderman In 1849 the office of Common Councilluan was abolished. From 1850 to 1853 the Mayors were elected by the citizens from the members of the City Council, or from gentlemen who had previously served as Alderman or Common Councilman. Wm. Caldwell was the first Mayor elected by the citizens under this system. In 1854 the Act in relation to the election of Mayor was further amended by providing that the people should not be restricted to persons who had served in the City Council in their choice for Mayor. The only occasion on which this privilege was availed of was in 1870, in the election of Hon. W. A. Henry. From 1841 to 1882 the general civic elections were held in October of each year. From April, 1883, to date, the general elections have been held annually in April. The civic year extends from 1st May in any one year to 30th April in the year following.

OITY COUNCIL.

The Act of Incorporation of the City of Halifax passed the House of Assembly April 10th, 1841. On May 12th, 1841, an election was held in each of the wards of the City for three Common Councilmen for each ward. The first meeting of the City Council was held in the County Court House May 13th, 1841. The Council from 1841 to 1849 consisted of six Aldermen and twelve Common Councillors. The following table shows the dates of election and the names of the gentlemen composing the City Council between those years, designating the Aldermen and Common Councilmen respectively and the wards they represented. The first Common Councillors were elected by the citizens. Subsequently the Common Councillors were elected by the ratepayers. The Common Councillors from among themselves chose the Aldermen; and the Aldermen and Common Councilmen from out of the Aldermen elected the Mayors. Each year six senior Common Councilmen and three senior Aldermen retired, the order of seniority being fixed by the Council. The following lists do not contain the names of gentlemen who were elected but did not serve in the City Council because of unwillingness to serve, disqualification, irregularity of election, or other reasons.
