All that lot, piece or parcel of land situate, lying and being on the west side of Walnut Street in the City and County of Halifax, the said lot being more particularly described as follows:—Beginning at a point on the west line of Walnut Street, the said point being the southeast corner of the lot Number 43 of the division of
