Accidents and Deaths.

May 31st, Box 93, Nova Scotia Car Works, George Spinney burned to death, caused by explosion.

April 30th, Box 38, N. H. Phinney, Barrington Street, Joseph Power, Callman on No. 4 Engine, hand badly cut, off duty for four weeks.

December 15th, Arthur Squires, Callman on No. 4 Engine, died.

December 29th, Thomas Healy, Callman on No. 5 Engine, died.

General Remarks.

The fires during the year necessitated the laying of 52,000 ft. of $2\frac{1}{2}$ " hose, 10,433 ft. of chemical hose and the use of 4,893 gals. of chemicals, 37 pecks of salt, and the raising of 1,625 ft. of ladders.

Fines collected during the year amounted to \$310.00.

Nine members of the Department resigned, three were dismissed, and two died.

The total value of real and personal property in use by the Department, including the fire alarm system amounts to \$207,226.50.

With regard to the members of the Department, there is very little to be said. The permanent force, as heretofore, have given every attention to their duty. There has also been a marked improvement in the call force, fires and drills having been well attended by the majority of them.

The motor pumping engine, Patricia, has continued to do excellent service, and has proved itself an invaluable piece

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of apparatus to the Department. During the year she responded to 150 calls, and in 86 of them handled the fire unaided by any of the other apparatus. At an alarm on May 29th, 1914, from Box 17, for a fire at Nolen's stables on Queen Street, which seriously threatened the neighborhood, the Patricia undoubtedly saved the situation.

Recommendations.

1. I would recommend the purchase of 1000 feet of $2\frac{1}{2}$ hose and 300 ft. of chemical hose to take the place of condemned hose.

2. That two of the call engineers be made permanent.

3. Both from grounds of efficiency and practical economy, I beg leave to strongly recommend the gradual reduction of callmen, and the substitution in their place of a small ratio of permanent firemen.

Fire horses used for street sprinkling. I have re-4. peatedly called attention to the seriousness of the risk assumed by the City by requiring the Fire Department horses to work in the street sprinkling carts. No. 1 ladder truck was late in responding to an alarm on April 30th, from Box 38 for a fire in N. H. Phinney & Co., Ltd., premises, 80 Barrington Street, on account of the horses being out on street sprinkling service, and the drivers not hearing the This condition nearly resulted in loss of life to embells. ployees and patrons in a restaurant in the upper part of the building, and we have frequently had close calls of a similar nature. I deem it my duty to again recommend that the ladder cart horses, at least, should not be required to do street sprinkling work.

Recommendations made by me in previous reports, and not yet carried out.

1. Water barrels for feeding fire engines with fresh water while working from salt water.

2. Signs on wharves where fire hydrants are placed.

3. Night lights on fire alarm boxes and fire stations.

4. That some provision be made for fighting fires on the water front.

5. That the routes of the horses used by the Department for street watering be made very much shorter.

6. The most important that is needed is the addition to Central Engine House, to be used as a workshop, as at present we have only the cellar of the building for shoeing our horses, and I am always in dread of at some time or other one of our horses having its brains knocked out by the beams over his head. Besides that, the smoke and sulphur going up through the house, which always keeps it in bad oder, is detrimental to the health of those who have to live and sleep in the house, as well as the horses that are right over the forge.

Now, what I propose to do, is either to build an addition to the back of the present house, a building 22 feet wide and the length of the house, one part for a forge, with a manure pit next to the house, with dividing wall,—this to be to the north—the south end to be used as a machine shop, where we could always repair 'our engines, as at present we have no place except on the floor of the Engine House, which always keeps it in a mess, and not very nice for a City the size of Halifax, as much smaller places have their workshops.

This building would cost in the vicinity of Two Thousand Eight Hundred Dollars (\$2,800.00), all to be built of concrete, one storey high, and with tar and gravel roofing.

Or, to go down to the lot on Albemarle Street, and erect a two storey building, facing on that street, running to rear of present building, from there to back of engine house to be one storey; the lower floor front to be used as a forge, and upper part to be used as a store room and machine shop.

This building also to be built of concrete and in the same manner as the above mentioned, but the cost of this would be about Four Thousand, Two Hundred Dollars (\$4,200.00). The money could be borrowed in accordance with an Act already passed by the Legislature for extension of Central Engine House.

In conclusion, I beg to return thanks to all the officials and those who in any way have rendered assistance to the Department during the year, and especially to the Chairman and members of the Board of Control for their uniform kindness, and also for courtesies extended, also to the Chief of Police and the members of his department who have always given me every assistance possible while working at fires. I would also respectfully solicit a continuance of your cooperation in assisting me to maintain that dicipline in the Department which is most essential to its well being.

REPORT CHIEF MECHANICAL ENGINEER HALI-FAX FIRE DEPARTMENT.

Halifax, N. S., October 31st., 1914.

To the Chairman and Members of the Board of Control.

Gentlemen:—Herewith I beg to submit my annual report for the year ending April 30th, 1914.

Condition.

All the engines have been tested by me and found in the following condition.

Motor fire engine "Patricia," LaFrance, put in commission April 15th, 1913, 90 horse-power, 600 gallons capacity, wine, carrying 1000 feet $2\frac{1}{2}$ " hose, 200 feet 1" chemical hose; one 35 gal. chemical tank, weight 10,000 pounds, stationed at West Street, built in the United States—in first class condition.

Fire engine "Halifax" Amoskeag, 26 years in service, capacity 600 gals. wine, weight 7800 lbs., stationed at Quinpool Road Station three-horse hitch—in good condition. Built in United States. Fire engine "Columbia" Amoskeag, 22 years in service, capacity 600 gals. wine, weight 7900 lbs. stationed at Morris Street Station, three-horse hitch—in good condition. Built in the United States.

Fire engine "King Edward", Waterous, 8 years in service, cap. 1000 gals. wine, weight 9900., stationed at Central Station, Brunswick Street, three-horse hitch, built in Canada, Brantford, Ont. This engine has been overhauled, painted, a new set of tubes, and boiler tested, at a cost of \$240.00 and is now in first class condition.

Fire engine "Alexandra," Shand & Mason, 7 years in service, cap. 1000 gallons Imp. weight 11,400 lbs., stationed at Bedford Row station, three-horse hitch, built in England, —in first-class condition.

Fire engine "Battenburg", Shand & Mason, 18 years in service, cap. 300 gals. Imp., weight 3500 lbs., two-horse hitch, in reserve, stationed at Islesville, Station, Gottingen Street, built in England—in fair condition.

Fire engine "Chebucto," Cole Bros., 40 years in service, cap. 500 gals. wine, weight 6500 lbs., stationed in West Street Station, two horse-hitch, built in the United States. This engine has been condemned, but is being used by the Works Department for pumping out sewers.

Chemical Engines.

No. 1 "Acadia", Holloway, 21 years in service, cap. 120 gals., double cylinder, weight 5300 lbs., stationed at Grafton Street Station., two-horse hitch, built in the United States in good condition.

No. 2 "Micmac", Babcock, 18 years in service, cap. 120 gals., double cylinder, weight 4700 lbs., stationed at West Street station, two-horse hitch, built in the United States. This engine has been overhauled and painted at a cost of \$130.00, and is now in first class condition. No. 3. "Albert," combination chemical and ladder truck, Seagrave, 8 years in service, weight 3500 lbs., cap. 70 gals., double tanks, carrying ladders from 35 feet down to 10 feet, two horse hitch, stationed at Morris Street station, built in Waterville, Ont., Canada—in good condition.

In conclusion I beg leave to return thanks to the members of the Board of Control and all officials who have in any way rendered me assistance in my department.

ANNUAL REPORT CITY ELECTRICIAN.

City Electrician's Office, Nov. 18th, 1914.

To His Worship the Mayor, Members of the Board of Control, and City Council.

Gentlemen:-I beg to submit herewith my Eighteenth Annual Report.

Fire Alarm Telegraph.

One new Signal Box No. 75 has been installed at the corner of Brunswick and Uniacke Streets, making a total of fifty-nine (59) boxes in Service.

The service during the period covered by this report has with one exception, caused by a severe storm on February 14th, been reasonably satisfactory.

Wire Inspection.

The Board of Wire Examiners held fourteen meetings during the year. Six wiring contractors licenses were renewed and but one new one issued.

Eleven candidates were examined for proficiency in wiring. Seven of them were granted the regular certificates.

During the year, seven hundred and fifty-eight wiring permits were issued; one thousand three hundred and fiftyseven inspections and tests were made, and eight hundred and one service permits were granted. This represents an increase of 10 per cent over the previous year, and as noted in previous reports this work which has increased each year, is now entirely too great to be properly done with the present staff.

Electric Pipe-thawing.

The first use of the electric pipe-thawer was made on February 20th and the work continued till March 12th. A total of fifty-four services were thawed, the average actual time per thaw being 16 minutes.

Street Railway Tests.

The usual voltmeter readings were taken over the streetrailway lines during the year, the conditions indicating no increased leakage over the tests of previous years.
