(As the Central and Gerish Street Engine Houses are situated away from the most valuable portions of the City; and on such elevated positions that great danger is incurred in getting the Engines down hill to a fire anywhere near the wharves or any of the lower streets; and as the buildings although expensively and thoroughly erected are more elaborate and costly than is required for Engine houses. This Committee recommend that these two Engine Houses be advertised and disposed of at an early day, and that two hand engines and other apparatus that is not now made use of by the Department be also advertised and sold. Also that the proceeds realised from these sales be expended in such uses for the convenient and efficient requirements of the Fire Department as may be considered and decided on as most advisable by the City Council.

Also that the Mayor be requested to take steps to ascertain the cost of the latest style of an efficient engine complete as well as the hose and ladder asked for by the Fire Wardens and report the result of these inquiries to the Council.

The Committee also ask that further time be allowed them to further consider this important subject.

The Committee on Licenses having considered the papers bearing on the application of John Keeling for a license to sell liquor beg to report that having examined into the matter they are of opinion that the persons whose names are alleged to be forged have a remedy in the Police Court in the first instance and that it is their duty to make complaint before the proper authority to have the party or parties alleged to have committed the forgeries punished.

There was no proof submitted to the Committee that a forgery was committed by any one and it is not the duty of this Committee to hunt for evidence or investigate crimes that come within the duties of the paid officials of the City.

The Committee also state that the oath prescribed to be taken by persons desiring licenses is such that it is impossible to comply with its conditions without committing perjury. The person taking the oath is obliged to swear that the persons who sign the petition are ratepayers and known to him as such. He submit that he cannot swear any one is a ratepayer unless he sees him pay his rates, and this feature of the law has degenerated into a farce. A liquor dealer goes to the Assessor's Office, gets a list of alleged ratepayers which he hands to some one to go around and get signatures to it and often filling in the names himself.

We would suggest that His Honor the Recorder draft an amendment to the license Act to be sent to the Legislature when it meets to have the law changed or repealed or instead of the petitioner having to get names let those opposed to the granting a license be required to get a majority petition against it.

We are of opinion that it would be much better to do away with petitions altogether and throw the responsibility on the Council.

The City Marshal having reported that the Stipendiary Magistrate refused to issue any summons against any person selling liquor without any license of any kind the chairman called a meeting at which His Honor the Mayor was present with the Recorder, and the Recorder stated he had seen the Stipendiary who had consented to issue summonses under the City Laws.

Your Committee are of opinion that the present Act should be amended so that those who pay the City for licenses should be protected from the completion of those who sell without license and would recommend that the Provisions of the City Charter should at once adopt such portions of the McBarth (Dominion) or Brooks (Ontario) License Acts to our own legislation as would give the Police more power in going into and searching and taking away liquors from unlicensed houses.

By Section 101 of the City Charter the Recorder is required when requisite to afford legal advice and assistance in the business of the Police Court and the Committee would recommend that on being notified by the Clerk of Licences that his assistance is required in the prosecution of any license case wherein the City enters suit or proceedings of any kind to prevent or punish infraction of the license laws that the Recorder shall so attend and conduct the proceedings or prosecution on behalf of the City in said Police Court.

"And whereas the sewerage rates assessable on private properties benefited by new sewers under the provisions of the Sewerage Act are insufficient to cover the cost of the sewers required and the necessary works connected therewith." And whereas there are extensive grounds in many and various quarters throughout the City which are owned by the Imperial Dominion and Local Governments and which grounds are exempt from the compulsory payment of the ordinary sewerage rates, thus entailing heavy additional expense on the City

"And whereas the Admiralty authorities have recently called attention to the necessity of constructing certain new sewers in the neighbourhood of Admiralty property both on Gottingen and Water Streets, and there is reason to believe that the said Authorities will contribute their fair share towards the said new sewers.

"And whereas there are no funds at the disposal of the City to meet any deficiencies which there may be or to ensure the completion of any new sewers required and the necessary sanitary works connected therewith.

Therefore Resolved that the City Council be requested to instruct His Honor the City Recorder to prepare a Bill for the Legislature whereby the City will be empowered to borrow the sum of Ten Thousand Dollars \$10,000⁰⁰ annually for five consecutive years for the purpose of at least carrying into effect and perfecting some portions of the sewerage scheme in some of the worst districts of the City.
