given the subject their best consideration, and after a full
explanation from the Petitioner and a careful investigation of
the records referring to it, are unanimously of opinion that it
would be improper for them to recommend the Compensation
sought by the Petitioner. From the records it appears that soon
after the Warrant was issued by Mr. Winters the City Council
referred the matter to the Recorder and received from him the
following opinion "With respect to the notice served upon Mr.
Alderman Winters relative to an action at the suit of Thomas.
Monaghan (which together with the Resolution of the City Council
I have just received) it is my duty to state that Mr. Winters
had my opinion before he took the steps for which the
action is brought threatened. I cherish the hope that in
departing from my counsel he was actuated only by a
desire to do so substantial justice, but unfortunately he
appears to have been influenced by advice which I apprehend
has rendered him legally responsible. I conceive it imperative
upon me to state, that it is an individual matter, with
which it would be prudent for the City Council not to
interfere particularly as Mr. Winters has taken care to have
himself secured by a Bond" When the following
