of the City Council to his heavy outlay which is wholly
nonproductive until the aforesaid road is completed, being
intenable for want of a communication beyond said
premises. Your petitioner would suggest that no road on
the suburb could be opened or finished so beneficial to
the Publick at large or so conducive to the extension of the City
as the one now petitioned for. That it is of paramount importance

There is in the line of the road between Coburg and Coburg and contiguous to the City an excellent quarry of Flag Stones suitable for paving Streets, if this Quarry were opened for the privilege of City Contractors the tenders for City Streets might be very much reduced from the present rates, as both flags and good building stones have now to be carted three times the distance that this Quarry is from any part of the City, the opening of the Quarry would also contribute to the making of the new Road.

The whole length of this line when opened from South to North will be about four miles, the portion on the South end requiring to be surveyed is about one and a half miles, that on the North end one mile less 5 chains.

Humbly Sheweth

That your Petitioners respectfully beg
leave to suggest to the Worshipful Corporation of the City of
Halifax the great advantage which the Citizens and the
Public in general particularly the many travelers who
arrive from the Westward would derive from the
continuation of the "Lain Pool" road in a direction toward
the western limits of the City.

The Lain Pool Road commences
from the Centre of the Common running on a level through
the improved and valuable part of the peninsula, nearly
to the eastern banks of the North West Arm, but abruptly
terminates by meeting with the boundary wall of land
owned by Thomas Hartman Esquire. The continuation
contemplated from this point would run in a Northwest
direction approaching the shore until it intersected the main
road leading from Halifax to the Margarets Bay road.
affording a comparatively straight and level drive from
Brunswick Street across the centre of the Common to the head
of the North West Arm and communicating directly with the
main road to the Western shores, and having many advantages
over the present main road leading from the North West
corner of the Common to the head of the village with all the
annual expence and State labour is considered
the roughest road in the city very hilly and very much
exposed to the winds, which in winter causes the snow to
drift from off the centre of the road making it almost
a bad winter road and sometimes quite impassable,

Your petitioners are convinced that
if the Lain pool road should be carried out it would
form the best main road and keep in order with less
labor and cost than the former affording to the citizens

of
