The Committee appointed to take into consideration the Plans for the erection of a City Prison at Rock Head Farm beg to report that having given the two plans submitted to them their most attentive and careful examination, are unanimously of opinion that the Plan furnished by Captain Parry possesses in an eminent degree the essentials required in the Building which the Council propose to erect, namely, a Reformatory Prison, where both adult and Juvenile Offenders may be reclaimed taught useful trades and returned to Society. Captain Parry's Plan appears to merit the preference was much as it provides the necessary accommodation for the employment of the prisoners both in Solitary confinement and in Common with others, in large Workshops. And Whereas the Statute labour Act authorizes the expenditure of Road monies to Surface work, and there being no money at the disposal of the Council for the purpose thereof therefore resolved that this Council cannot entertain any applications for monies for the construction of Drains or sewers, but if such a mode should be deemed advisable by the Citizens this Council would agree that a Bill might pass the legislature for enabling the City to borrow £ to be appropriated in the construction of Drains and sewers. First Quarterly Report of the Superintendent of Streets
ending 26th June 1834.

The Superintendent of Streets in submitting his first Report of the Street Service for the Present Year, begs to state to His Worship the Mayor and the City Council that the Street operations this year commenced on Monday the 1st May, when 15 of the Old trained Labourers were employed at 4/- per day a rate which it was then supposed might be current wages of Labourers during the summer,

Contracts for Carting and for Gravel and

Paving Stones for the Street Service during the season were duly advertised and the respective tenders submitted for the approval of the Committee of Tenders and the following being the lowest was accepted,

Edward Warren 1 Horse Cart and man 4/- per day

Bernard Leigham 3 Horses Cart and man 4/- per day

Pierce Hogan 1 Horse Cart and man 4/- per day,

being the first on the list of equal rates of 4/- per day

Like Indulgence for Paving Stones 4/- and

for Gravel per Cart Load 3/- but in consequence of the Gravel being so much higher than in former years, the Committee recommended that as small a quantity as possible of that material should be used, and that the best pit Gravel from the Common be substituted

In consequence of the small number of Horses and Men turning out to perform Statute labor it has been found necessary to employ several extra carts in order to complete the work in the various Wards within the limited time, the rate of hire being at the maximum of contract price viz. 4/- per day.

In accordance with the Resolution of the City Council that Barrack Street be forthwith finished off as a Street at its present level, the Statue was commenced in Wards 3 & 4 all the labourers were employed preparing gravel and Stones, and the work is now completed, with Side Walks on the Crop Streets and the whole length of the Eastern side of Barrack Street the west side being encumbered with the land slip from the Citadel Hill. The paving of the Gates, the graveling of small portions of Side Walks where repairs to Buildings prevent it, with the clearing of the street when cleared of the Citadel earth is all that remains to be done in completion of this work.

The Royal Engineer Department are now engaged removing the encumbrance from the street with the 12 feet width - suffered for the use of the City by Col. Savage, and in compliance with the instructions of the Committee from the City Council who conferred with the Colonel on the subject, the Superintendent is giving such assistance in removing the earth as he believes to be compatible with the City Interests, namely furnishing one Horse and Cart & Driver and the Committee of the Common furnishing two teams, the Horse and Cart depositing the earth on the Common,

In Ward 1. it was found absolutely necessary, to lift, clean out and enlarge an old drain from the West Side of Water Street, to the rear of Richardson's Buildings on the East Side

June 26 Side of the Street from thence a new drain made down Richardsons Wharf to a point where a proper seat was obtained for the large quantity of City Sewage collecting at this point. This drain which has been the subject of much complaint is now an efficient conductor of all the sewage from that Town the cost of this work is £5.18.0

In Ward 104. Several Cellars opposite this Wharf having been flooded from the back Water of a Public River it was found necessary to replace an old drain leading down Tobins Wharf and to raise its side walls 9 inches. Cover it with stone flags in place of wood formerly employed, thus effecting a durable and efficient outlet to the sewage in that part of upper Water Street Cost £2.12.0

In Ward No 2 an old drain in Sackville Street front of the Royal Engineer Barrack rendered useless and causing much damage to the street has been lifted and thoroughly reconstructed Cost £1.14.1

His Worship the Mayor directed the Just. to finish the Work around the New Market House, Bedford Row, Water St, and George St were raised to levels corresponding with the New Market Square, the gutters paved from the front of the Commissariat Office in Bedford Row all around to the south east angle of the Market House, the Market Square and the Custom House Lane graced, new eyes for the Gratings opened and other contingencies now completed at a total £58.11.7 Chargeable as a Special Expenditure.

The Superintendent by direction of His Worship the Mayor has since the 1st June 3 men with Horses and carts nearly constantly employed in cleaning the Streets at the rate of 1/- per day and which service amounts up to the 23 June to £11.15.0 also chargeable as a Special Expenditure,

The Statute labour on the out roads in Wards 5 and 6 commences on the 1st Ultimo Road on the 28 Inst and the whole of the out roads in Ward No 6 will be finished before the May Day Bank Holiday in Ward 2 commences on Wednesday the 5 July and Ward 15 will commence as soon as 5 & 6 are finished.

In consequence of the Railway Contractors giving to Labourers 5/- per day the men employed in the City Works made a respectful claim for a similar rate of wages, it was found expedient to inform to these terms with an understanding that should wages fall at these public works the rate of Statute Labourers should also be subject to reduction.
