And that the Horizontal lines indicating the elevation and depression of Streets, the Foundation levels for buildings, the depth of Rivers and all vertical Measurements shall be made from the centre of the Streets.

And as soon as the publick Survey and Streets are much obstructed a question of legal right as to possession between the City and Individual interest may be the result. Whereas in the third Clause of the Report of the Street Committee now before the Council it is proposed by resolution to adopt the recommendation contained in said third Clause, and whereas one portion of said Clause recommend the adoption of One Superintendent of Streets and six overseers and this Council having by resolution declared said system of one Superintendent of Streets to be at variance with the true interest of the People.

Be it therefore resolved that a Commissioner of Streets for each Ward be appointed from this Council, with two Superintendents one for the Northern and one for the Southern division of the City whereby a great saving will be made to the Citizens.
