#### Report of Committee on Powder Magazine

Report of Committee on Powder Magazine.

The Committee on the Powder Magazine beg leave to report that they have visited the Magazine which they found in general good order - have to notice a Plate or two required on the roof and a few composition nails wanted to secure the eaves - sheathing on the outside of the shutter on the west side of the Building.

They inspected the wharf or landing place the wood work of which was found to have almost entirely disappeared. The removal of the Magazine being probable they do not recommend the renewing of the wharf - but do recommend that a few planks be provided to form a temporary stage or pathway - to be given into the charge of the Keeper of the Magazine and also that such labour be employed as will be sufficient to level the Stone Ballast remaining on the site of the wharf. Anticipating the removal of the Magazine at some future day in consequence of the approach of the Railway.

Both Committees visited the City Water Lots fronting on Bedford Basin with a view to their eligibility as a site for the Magazine - Your Committee also visited the Glebe Land on the shore of the Basin a piece of which lying nearest to ground enclosed by the Commissioners of the Railway they consider and recommend as in their opinion the most suitable site and if such land can be obtained on reasonable terms they think it should be secured.

Respecting the management of the Magazine they have to recommend that the Council prescribe the following rules.

Rule 3<sup>rd</sup> That for the better security of the City  
no greater quantity of Gunpowder than 400 lbs shall be  
conveyed from the Magazine - into the City in any  
one vehicle and that unless such vehicle shall be  
a closed cart or closed conveyance - the Packages of  
Powder shall be fully enveloped or covered with  
water or Horse Hair Cloths or contained in a closed  
Box or Chest - the keeper of the Magazine having  
instructions to see to the carrying out of this Rule,  
the nonobservance of which he shall report to the  
Police Authorities.

Rule 4<sup>th</sup> That the keeper of the Magazine  
shall report the Receipt of all Powder within the  
Magazine to the City Treasurer immediately  
on such receipt being complete and he shall  
keep a Book of Entry (provided by the City) of  
all such receipts and also of all deliveries with  
the respective dates thereof in such form as shall  
be to the satisfaction of His Worship the Mayor

Rule 5<sup>th</sup> That the keeper of the Magazine may  
exercise his judgement in not opening or visiting  
the Magazine when the state of the atmosphere may  
make such a course dangerous.

beg leave to name Thirty Pounds per annum as the  
sum they would recommend as the amount of his  
Salary

In reference to your letter dated 15<sup>th</sup> ultimo on  
the subject of the side walk 12 feet in width proposed to be  
formed at the foot of the Glacis of the Citadel, adjoining  
the western side of Barracks Street. I beg to inform you that  
it is my full intention to form the footpath as proposed  
and to finish the Glacis in Conformity with the Street and  
side walk. The object of the sidewalk is, as stated by my  
Predecessor, the comfort of the Troops quartered in the  
Citadel, Sailors and Miners, and South Barracks especi-  
ally in Winter when going to and returning from the Garrison  
Chapel and for that purpose it is essential that it be

21<sup>st</sup> left clear neat and dry. The object of the proposed fence is to mark and define the Ordnance boundary for which purpose if placed otherwise than in the exact line of the Ordnance boundary, it would be useless. If placed on that line, it will ensure the footpath being kept clear, free from nuisance, and subject to the control of the Ordnance Authorities, openings being left at the heads of each Street as required, will make the foot path accessible and beneficial to the public and with a row of trees planted on the edge of the glacis, it will have a handsome effect, and at a future period make Barrack Street one of the best Streets in Halifax.

These my views I submitted to Hon<sup>r</sup> Mr. Rivers Esqr<sup>r</sup> Mayor of Halifax at his Office, who, in concurrence with Alderman Cartwright, fully agreed with me, and assured me that it was quite satisfactory with me, and assured me that it was quite his intention to which side of the foot path the fence was to be placed, and arrangements were accordingly made, when the ground should be cleared, to put the fence on the boundary line.

Having submitted your letter to the Respective Officers of Ordnance at this Station, they entirely concur with me in opinion with respect to the placing of the fence, and that were it otherwise placed, it would in every respect be highly objectionable.
