The Committee to whom was submitted the correspondence of Colonel Nelson and the Mayor in reference to leave desired by Colonel Nelson to open the Street for the purpose of laying a Brick pipe or drain from the Citadel to the Harbour passing through the Ordnance yard and up through Buckingham Street beg to state that after having had Colonel Nelson to converse with also their Superintendent of Streets they have to report that it is their unanimous opinion that the Colonel have leave to open the Street for

September 24th for the purposes desired but at the same time in granting such leave and knowing for what purpose this pipe or drain is desired that he be informed that it will be necessary in receiving such leave that he is particularly requested to have as small a portion of Street opened at once as is possible and especially that opened from Northrups Corners to where it crosses Granville Street because such portion of the Street if long opened will be particularly troublesome and an inconvenience not only to the citizens but a great many of the country people owing to the Country Market in that part, also that he do specially agree that the said pipe or drain be at least from 9 to 12 feet deep from top surface as has been pointed out to him by our Superintendent of Streets and that while the work is going on our Superintendent of Streets be allowed to examine as the work progresses so as to be satisfied the pipe about to be laid is so as to give no inconvenience to our citizens by not being deep enough or in any other way that may appear injurious to him or to the interests of the City, and also that the mouth of such drain be sufficiently carried out into deep water that no nuisance be made to the annoyance of the citizens and if any it shall be immediately removed, that while the work is being carried on the Colonel or whoever may be conducting the work be subject to all the City Ordinances connected with such work so that the lives and property of our citizens be not in peril by the carelessness or want of knowledge of those doing such work and the Committee further report that as Col. Nelson is anxious for immediate answer that it is their opinion the Mayor at once communicate to the Colonel the substance of this report in as plain and distinct language as may be possible so the Committee and Council may be well understood by the Colonel as to their wishes in this matter.
