Report of Special Committee relative to Purchase of Water Co's Works

The Committee appointed to negotiate with the Directors of the Halifax Water Company for the transfer of the Company's works to the City of Halifax, beg leave to report—

That the Directors have agreed—on behalf of the Company to sell to the City for the price of Fifty six Thousand pounds as appears from the letter of the Secretary to the Company, hereto annexed.

This morning an interview with a Committee of the Directors—and obtained the particulars as to the assets of the Company and the condition of the works contained in the schedules and Superintendents report also hereto annexed. They also learned that the Company holds a lease of the premises at present occupied for office &c in Argyle street at £120 per annum for four years—of the term being unexpired, which would be assigned to the City—

Your Committee were further informed that the first of July will be a convenient day for the City to enter upon possession of the works the Company's year then terminating and that a proportional amount of the current half years rates dated from that day would then be credited to the City—

Your Committee therefore recommend that in order to test the ability of the City Council to comply with the terms now offered, advertisements should be immediately issued requesting tenders for City debentures under the Water Act to the amount of Fifty six Thousand pounds—reserving the right to decline any or all of such tenders. the money if the tenders be accepted to be payable on the 30th day of June next.

And your Committee further recommend that so much of the Water Act as relates to issue of debentures and the means provided for recovering payment of the principal and interest therein should be published with the advertisement—
