that as the act complained of was committed by him in the discharge of his duty
under a feeling (however erroneously) that he was imperatively bound to do so and
without any malice or hostility to Mr. Bradley Your worship will not allow him to
be punished for an error of judgement in the discharge of his public duty
and that you will be pleased to direct the amount of such verdict and
costs to be paid out of the City Funds and as in duty bound will ever pray.
